TOWN OF PARUPA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area; and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a town, that is to say:—
