REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE LICENSING AND MANAGEMENT OF POWDER HULKS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864*, and *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may license, on such conditions as he may think fit, private magazines for the storage of gunpowder, and may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time, define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations, and from time to time in like manner may alter, annul, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: And whereas by a Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*, did define the limits and boundaries of ports in the said colony, and did proclaim and declare that certain rules and regulations therein specified for the governance and preservation of the said ports, and for the regulation of shipping in the same, should be substituted for other rules and regulations formerly in force: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the following shall be added to the rules and regulations contained in the proclamation above referred to, viz.:

1. The vessel proposed to be licensed must be inspected and approved by the Chief Harbor Master.
2. All projecting iron bolts must be removed or carefully covered over with wood or lead secured with copper nails.
3. The hold to be decked over and fitted with partitions fore and aft, so as to afford a clear passage up the centre, and proper bins to be erected for holding powder. No iron to be used; all to be secured with copper nails or wooden pegs.
4. Copper lightning-conductors to be placed on each side of each mast, and carried well below the light water line. The pumps to be of wood or copper.
5. All tools used in coopering casks or for any other purpose on board, all locks, hatchbars, and hoops of casks or buckets, must be copper.
6. No one shall be permitted on board who has matches, knives, or articles of steel or iron on his person.
7. No person shall go on board except with magazine-slippers on or bare-footed, and then only in the presence and with the permission of the person in charge of the hulk.
8. No fire or smoking is to be permitted on board. The light in the watch-room to be in a carefully secured lantern.
9. An approved trustworthy person must be in charge of the hulk, and a requisite number of assistants be employed to secure safety and despatch in receiving and delivering powder; and a careful and constant watch must be kept on deck, night and day.
10. The hulk must be always open for the inspection of any public officer.
11. All persons in charge must live in a house on the upper deck, and all the hatches must be carefully closed and tarpaulined over, except when powder is being received or delivered.
12. Before any barrel, box, or case is received on board it is to be carefully examined, and if it is not perfectly closed, so

that no powder or combustible matter can escape, or should any iron be found to have been used either in its construction or repair, it is not to be received on board.

13. No barrel, box, or case is, on any account, to be opened in the hold, but when required is to be taken on deck to the shifting shed.

14. All powder to be carefully and securely stowed.

15. The hulk is to be kept strictly clean and free from all gravel, sand, or grit, and no iron, greased rag, or anything liable to cause combustion is to be permitted on board.

16. The hulk is to be moored in such place and manner as the Chief Harbor Master may direct, beyond the limits prescribed by section 19 of *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864*.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED TO THE SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation, in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend the provisions contained in sections V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., X., of Part I. of the said Statute to the Shire of Beechworth.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common; respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim or increase (as the case may be) the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

HOMEBUSH GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The Homebush Gold-field Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 23rd day of January, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto allotment 9 of section E, in the parish of Avoca, and the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described, as follow, viz.: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 49, in the parish of Ruthscar; thence by a road bearing south one hundred and thirty-nine chains eighty-eight links; thence by lines bearing respectively west one hundred and twenty chains and north eighty-seven chains, more or less, to the south boundary of the existing common; thence by the said boundary,

of that common, bearing east ninety chains, more or less; thence by the east boundary thereof, bearing north fifty chains, more or less, to the south-eastern side of the road from Homebush to Dunolly; thence by that road, bearing N. 45° E. five chains, more or less, to the west angle of allotment 49, in the parish of Ruthscar aforesaid; and thence by the south boundary of that allotment, bearing east twenty-seven chains sixty-nine links to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area of land added to the above common, 1050 acres, more or less.—(67.O.12651.)

PARUPA TOWN COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, and containing an area of one thousand one hundred acres, more or less, shall be, and constitute a Town Common for the use of all householders of the town of Parupa, viz.:—Commencing at the south angle of allotment 3 of section 24a, in the parish of Parupa, being a point on the western side of the road from Warrnambool to Ararat; thence by that road, bearing S. 24° 30' W. one hundred and eight chains, more or less, to the south-east angle of suburban allotment 56; thence by a line crossing the said road and bearing east to the south-west angle of allotment 5 of section 24a; thence by the south boundary of that allotment and by a line bearing east thirteen chains, more or less, to the western shore of Lake Boloko; thence by that lake, bearing southerly to a point bearing east from the south-east angle of allotment 4 of section 41 in the parish of Wickliffe South; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and eighteen chains, more or less, to the road forming the east boundary of the last-named parish; thence by that road, bearing north ninety-one chains, more or less, to the southern side of the road from Portland to Geelong; thence by that road, bearing N. 73° 55' E. seventy-seven chains thirty-one links to the north-west angle of suburban allotment 92; thence by a line crossing the last-named road and bearing north to the south-east angle of suburban allotment 81; thence by that allotment and allotment 4 of section 25 in the parish of Parupa, bearing north forty-three chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence by a line bearing east six chains, more or less, to the western margin of a salt lake; thence by the western, southern, and eastern margins of that lake, bearing southerly, easterly, and northerly to a point bearing west from the commencing point; and thence to that point by a line bearing east thirteen chains, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.O.10252.)

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

CALLAWADDA AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The Callawadda Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 4th day of February, 1867, and the 12th day of March, 1867, is hereby increased by adding thereto allotments 129a, 129b, in the parish of Callawadda, comprising an area of 40 acres and 24 perches.—(67.P.5831.)

THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE GISBORNE UNITED ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of November, 1867.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor
Major-General Sir Trevor Chute, K.C.B.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board for any original or proclaimed district (hereinafter sometimes called "single district") the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions (hereinafter called subdivisions), by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Gisborne United Road District." And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by not less than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, divide the Gisborne United Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE MOUNTAIN SUBDIVISION.—Starting on the boundary of Bourke county, by the Mount Alexander road, to a line east from a point one chain south of the south-western angle of section 34, Gisborne parish; thence east by that line to a distance of eighty chains from its said starting point; thence south to the Gisborne Creek, and by that creek and the northern boundaries of Buttlejork and Bolinda parishes, to and by the north-east boundary of the Mount Alexander railway to a point south of the intersection of a line west from the south boundary of section A Havelock parish, with Bullando Creek; thence north to that intersection; thence by a line to the south-west angle of Brock's more northerly pre-emptive right; thence north to the boundary of Monegeeta parish; thence north-westerly by the last boundary to a point in line with the western boundaries of blocks 1 and 5, Rochford parish; thence northerly by the last line to the north-west angle of said block 5; thence by the south boundaries of blocks 9 and 10, Rochford parish, to the south-west angle of the last block; thence by a line to the south-east angle of block 1, section 3, Newham parish, by the south boundary of last block and the boundary of Bourke county to the starting point.

THE BOROUGH SUBDIVISION.—Starting one chain south of the south-western angle of section 34, Gisborne parish; thence east eighty chains; thence south eighty chains; thence west eighty chains; thence north eighty chains to the starting point.

THE BULLENGAROOK SUBDIVISION.—Starting on the boundary of Bourke county, by the Mount Alexander road, to a line east from a point one chain south of the south-western angle of section 34, Gisborne parish; thence west by a line to its starting point aforesaid; thence south eighty chains; thence east eighty chains; thence north to the Gisborne Creek, and by that creek and the eastern boundary of Gisborne parish to the Mount Alexander road, and by that road to a point west of the northern boundary of the township of the Gap; thence west to Djerriwarh Creek; thence by a line westerly to the south-east angle of H. Matson's pre-emptive right; thence by the south boundary to the south-west angle of said right; thence northerly by the west boundary of Bullegarook parish, and a line touching the north-west boundary of block 21 of the latter parish, directed to a point on the north boundary of Bourke county, south of the west boundary of the township of Woodend, and by that north boundary to the starting point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
