**FIRE AT MOUNT ELEPHANT STATION.  
SEVENTY-FIVE POUNDS REWARD.**

## BOROUGH OF INGLEWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 22.—BYE-LAW FOR THE ELECTION OF MANAGERS FOR THE INGLEWOOD BOROUGH COMMON.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 25 Victoria No. 145, section 69, it is provided that the municipal council of any municipal district shall elect annually, in such manner as they may respectively by bye-law prescribe, three persons to be managers of any town common, and may at any time remove any one or more of such managers and elect others in their stead: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Inglewood, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of this colony, the election of managers of the Inglewood Borough Common shall take place in the following manner.

That the election of Managers for the Borough Common will take place within one month of the bye-law coming into force, and hereafter the annual election shall take place in the month of September in each year.

That no person shall be nominated or elected to fill the office of manager without his assent in writing, which assent shall be given to the chairman at least seven days before the meeting of the council at which the election of a manager or managers is to take place.

All meetings of the council for the election of managers shall be specially convened for that purpose.

That such election shall take place by ballot; and in the event of an equality of votes, the chairman, in addition to his own, shall have a casting vote.

That the votes, so soon as recorded, shall be counted in the presence of the members by the chairman, who shall be assisted by the town clerk; and the chairman, upon ascertaining the result of such election, shall declare the names of the successful candidates to the council as being duly elected, and shall thereupon direct the town clerk to enter such declaration in the minute-book, and acquaint, in writing, the persons elected to fill the office of managers of such circumstance.

On the removal by the council of any such manager, the council shall elect another in his stead, and the person so elected shall hold such office for the remainder of the term his predecessor would have been entitled to hold the same unless removed by the council.

## BURGOYNE AND TARRAWARRA FARMERS' COMMON.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS.

ALL persons residing within five (5) miles of the common to be entitled to depasture cattle or horses thereon according to the following scale:—

2. Fees for depasturing to be as follows:—  
For every head of neat cattle ... 6s. per annum.  
For every horse ... 12s. "  
For every sheep or goat ... 2s. "

These fees to be paid half-yearly in advance, each half-year to be considered to terminate on 30th June or 31st December.

3. If the common be not sufficiently stocked special arrangements may be made with the managers, but no reduction, however, to be made in the amount of the fees.

4. The managers shall appoint a herdsman who must be qualified to keep all the necessary accounts.

5. All stock depasturing on the common must be delivered to the herdsman, and be entered in his book, and must be branded with the Common brand with pitch or tar.

6. No bull above the age of six months, or entire horse above the age of nine months, shall be allowed to run on the common unless with the consent of the managers.

7. The herdsman shall muster the cattle at such times as the managers shall direct.

8. No person shall be allowed to remove cattle or horses from the common, without a week's notice to the herdsman and producing an order from the managers.

9. If any cattle be impounded from off private lands, or from any other common, the herdsman shall release them and pay all expenses.

10. Should any cattle return home the herdsman shall, within six days after receiving notice from the owner, be responsible for their return to the common.

11. In no case shall the herdsman receive any cattle on the common without a written order from the managers. Any breach of this rule will subject the herdsman to instant dismissal.

12. Any cattle that may be found to be diseased shall be taken by the herdsman to such place as may be appointed for the purpose. Notice shall be served on the owners who shall thereupon remove them, or at their expense such cattle shall be destroyed.

13. Any stock put on the common will be there entirely at the risk of the owners.

14. The days for receiving stock shall be Tuesdays and Fridays.
