UNION UNDER THE "WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called *The Weights and Measures Statute 1864*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, at the request of and pursuant to any agreement made by the councils or boards of any two or more of any adjoining boroughs, shires, and road districts, may proclaim such boroughs, shires, and road districts to be a "Union" for the purposes of the said Act; and by such proclamation fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the several bodies corporate of such boroughs, shires, or road districts: And whereas the Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud have requested that the said borough and shire may be proclaimed a "Union," and that the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act may be borne in the proportion of one-half by the Borough of St. Arnaud and one-half by the Shire of St. Arnaud: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do proclaim the Borough of St. Arnaud and the Shire of St. Arnaud to be a "Union" for the purposes of the said Act, and do fix the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such union under the said Act shall be borne by the Council of the said Borough of St. Arnaud and the Council of the said Shire of St. Arnaud as follows, viz.:—one-half by the Council of the Borough of St. Arnaud and one-half by the Council of the Shire of St. Arnaud.

The deaths in the month of October numbered 9 less than the average, but exceeded those in September by 5. The mean temperature was a fraction below the average.

Fifty-six per cent. of the deaths were of males and 44 per cent. were of females. Forty per cent. of those dying had not attained their fifth year, against 51 per cent. in October, 1865; 52 per cent. in October, 1866; 41 per cent. in October, 1864; 37 per cent. in October, 1863; 40 per cent. in October, 1862; 51 per cent. in October, 1861; and 62 per cent. in October, 1860.

The highest number of deaths on any one day was 16, on the 26th. The lowest number recorded was 1, on the 9th.

Five males, and one female, of 75 years old and upwards, died during the month. The ages of the males were 76, 77, 79, 85, and 90 years; and the causes of death, old age, chronic dysentery, heart disease, apoplexy, and old age respectively. The female was 75 years old, and died of general decay.

Twelve violent deaths took place during the month, of which 10 are supposed to have resulted from accident, and 2 from suicide. The following are the particulars:—A seaman, aged 17, died from injuries caused by falling from aloft on board a ship in Hobson's Bay; a seaman, aged 31 years, of an injury received in a stone-breaking machine; a carter, aged 67, was killed by a dray-wheel passing over his head; a boy, aged 2 years, died of sunstroke; a female child, aged 24 years, and a female, aged 24, were found drowned in Hobson's Bay; a female, aged 35, supposed to have been an escaped lunatic from Yarra Bend Asylum, and a fisherman, aged 68, were drowned in the River Yarra; a newly-born infant was accidentally suffocated; a laborer, aged 40, was suffocated by a piece of meat; a brickmaker, aged 40, and an overseer, aged 44, committed suicide by drowning, the latter whilst in a state of delirium tremens.

Forty-four deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole number recorded occurred in public institutions, viz.:—28 in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 5 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Immigration Hospital, 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, and 2 in the hulk "Success."

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital is in Melbourne Proper, the Benevolent Asylum in North Melbourne and Carlton, the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum in Jika-jika parish (remainder of), and the Industrial Schools in South Yarra and Prahran.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census. Instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 165,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.45 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 96, of which 50, or about 52 per cent., were of males, and 46, or nearly 48 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 63 were under one year of age, 19 were between one and two years, 9 were between two and three, 2 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 144, of which 85, or about 59 per cent., were males, and 59, or nearly 41 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 8 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 21 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty-five, 11 were between forty-five and fifty, 7 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty-five and sixty, 6 were between sixty and sixty-five, 5 were between sixty-five and seventy, 2 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were eighty and upwards.

Thirty-two per cent. of the mortality was attributed to zymotic diseases in September, but only 23 per cent. in October. On the other hand, constitutional diseases caused 15 per cent. in September, against 21 per cent. in October. Scarlatina and diphtheria were fatal in 17 instances during October, against 29 in September; diarrhoea and dysentery caused 9 deaths, against 11 in September; whilst deaths resulting from phthisis increased from 25 in September to 38 in October.
