PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Henry Thomas Manners Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

EVERSLEY AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 1145 acres 1 rood 36 perches, shall be and constitute a farmers' common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Eversley, viz., allotments 8, 8a, 9, and 10 of section K, in the parish of Eversley.—(67.O.13606.)

WONDOOMAROOK AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 2889 acres 2 roods 11 perches, shall be and constitute a farmers' common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Wondoomarook, viz., parish of Euroa, section G, allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 49a, 52, and 53a; parish of Balmattum, allotments 4, 10, 71 A, 72 A, 73 A, 83 A, 83 B, 84 A, 84 B, 85b, 89 A, 89 B, 90 A, 90 B, 94 Ab, 95 A, 96, 101, 102, 103, 108, and 112, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.P.13254.)

KILMORE TOWN COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Henry Thomas Manners Sutton, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

KILMORE TOWN COMMON.—The Kilmore Town Common, described in a Proclamation, bearing date the 18th day of February, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, containing an area of nine hundred acres, more or less, viz.:—Commencing at the north-east angle of the existing common, being a point on the south boundary of allotment 20, in the parish of Glenburnie; thence by that allotment, bearing east sixty-three chains, more or less; thence by lines, bearing respectively south one hundred and fifty-seven chains fourteen links, and west sixty-three chains, more or less, to the east boundary of the existing common; and thence by the said boundary of that common, bearing north one hundred and fifty-seven chains fourteen links to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.P.9066.)
