WHEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any numicipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has heen selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by The Amending Land Act 1805 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1862 and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, or alter (as the case may be), the commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

### WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by The Local Government Act 1863, has, by Orders severally made on the 4th day of February, 1867, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinsfer named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plaus deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—
