GOLD ESCORTS.

FROM and after the 23rd instant, the Coach Gold Escorts, now run by contract from Stawell to Ballarat; from Talbot, Avoca, and Dunolly, *via* Maryborough, to Castlemaine; from Daylesford to Castlemaine; and from Heathcote to Sandhurst, will be discontinued.

Until further notice, Police Guards will be furnished to persons conveying treasure by coach from the above-named places, on the following conditions.

Arrangements must be made to travel by daylight only.

The coach fares, going and returning, of the police guards must be paid by the persons to whom the guards are supplied.

Notice must be given, three days beforehand, to the officer in charge of police at Avoca or Heathcote, that 1000, or at any of the other place named, that 2000 ounces, are ready for transmission to Ballarat, Sandhurst, or Castlemaine respectively, stating the quantity.

FOREIGN DESERTERS' (SEAMEN) ACT EXTENDED TO SIAMESE SHIPS.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the *Foreign Deserters' Act 1852*, it is provided, that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering or apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any Foreign Power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to such Powers, when within Her Majesty's domi-

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nions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient; and whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty, that due facilities are given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of their Majesties the Kings of Siam:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in her by the said *Foreign Deserters' Act 1852*, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that from and after the publication hereof in the *London Gazette*, seamen, not being slaves, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to the Kingdom of Siam, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships:

Provided always, that if any deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence (if any) has been fully carried into effect.

And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, the Right Honorable the Earl of Carnarvon, the Right Honorable Viscount Cranbourne, and the Right Honorable Spencer Horatio Walpole, three of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

FORFEITURE OF THE LEASE OF AN AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the eleventh day of February, 1867.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted by sec. 15, that no person shall within any period of twelve months become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee, either in his own name or in the name or names of any other person or persons, of more than 640 acres of the lands proclaimed under that Act, as therein mentioned; and no person shall become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee of any allotment who is an infant, or who is a married woman not having obtained a decree of judicial separation binding in respect of the allotment for a lease of which he applies, or in respect of any part thereof, an agent or a servant of or a trustee for any other person, or who at the time of his application has entered into any agreement to permit any other person to acquire, by purchase or otherwise, the allotment in respect of which such application is made, or any part thereof, or the applicant's interest therein; and all land applied for under that Act shall be so applied for *bona fide* for the use and benefit of the applicant in his own proper person, and not as the agent or servant, or trustee of or for any other person; and allotments selected or purchased under the provisions thereinbefore contained shall be reckoned as part of the 640 acres thereinbefore mentioned; and it is by the said Act provided that if any person shall, in violation of any of the provisions of that section, become the lessee, or assignee, or sub-lessee of an allotment, the Governor in Council may declare the lease of such allotment, to be forfeited, and upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of notice of such declaration; the term created by the said lease shall cease and determine, and the right, title, and interest of the lessee, and of every assignee and sub-lessee in and to such lease, and all moneys paid for rent in respect of such allotment, shall be absolutely forfeited; and the allotment may be sold in fee simple or leased again, in manner in the said Act provided: And whereas the lease mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereto of the allotment therein comprised and thereby demised, being land proclaimed under the provisions of the said Act, was granted at the time, in manner, and to the lessee therein mentioned: And whereas the person whose name is mentioned in the second column of the schedule hereto became the assignee of the said allotment comprised in and demised by the hereinbefore-mentioned lease, in violation of the provisions to the contrary of the said hereinbefore-recited section, in manner, and for the reasons mentioned in the third column of the schedule hereto: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf given by the said hereinbefore-mentioned Act, doth hereby declare that the said lease mentioned in the said first column of the schedule hereto of the allotment therein comprised and thereby demised is forfeited.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SANDHURST MINING DISTRICT.

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Sandhurst, begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, on the 30th day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

The drainage bye-law passed by the Sandhurst Mining Board on the twelfth (12th) day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, is hereby repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof—

1. The owner of any machine which is employed in drawing water from any mine, shall, under the following circumstances and subject to the following conditions, be entitled to receive from the owners of neighboring claims and gold mining leases, and leases held for the purpose of mining for any metal or mineral other than gold, whose claims or leases are benefitted as follows by the said machine, such sum or sums of money, by way of

contribution to the expense of lifting water, as are hereinafter prescribed; provided that in cases where two or more machine owners claim contribution for the same portion of ground, the machine owner only whose machine, from position, power, and other circumstances, drains the same most effectually, shall be the person entitled to claim contribution under the provisions of this bye-law.

2. The owner of any machine as aforesaid intending to claim contribution towards the expense of lifting water, shall serve upon one of the owners of such claim or lease, and in the event of their not being to be found, then upon the manager or other person at work upon any such claim or lease, notice to that effect, and shall state therein the sum per week claimed, and such sum, if in accordance with the scale fixed by this bye-law, shall be the amount to be paid weekly by the respective owners of any such claims or leases to the machine owner by way of contribution for a fixed period of six (6) months when fresh notices shall be served.

3. The owner of any claim or lease which is being worked below the datum water-level shall pay to the machine owner who drains the same the sum of three (3) pence per lineal yard per week by way of contribution; and where the draining machine is situated on any line of reef, the owner of any claim on the same line of reef and not on a parallel, and which is situated within seven hundred and fifty (750) yards of the machine, shall, during the time such claim is under exemption, pay to the machine owner as aforesaid the sum of two (2) pence per lineal yard per week; and the owner of any lease situated on the same line of reef within seven hundred and fifty (750) yards of the machine, and in which mining is not being carried on, shall pay to the machine owner as aforesaid the sum of two pence per lineal yard per week.

4. To ascertain the number of lineal yards in any claim or lease, they shall be measured along in the same direction as the lode or gutter is known or supposed to traverse.

5. The owner of any claim or lease which is being worked above the datum water-level, and no work being carried on below said level, shall be exempted from paying any drainage contribution on account of such claim or lease.

6. The owner of any claim or lease which has been sunk to water, and in which sinking cannot be continued, may give notice to the drainor that he requires further drainage, and that the engine-shaft must be sunk deeper, or that a crosscut must be driven, or other works carried out in order to improve the drainage; and should the drainor proceed to execute such work, then such owner shall pay two (2) pence per lineal yard per week until sinking can be and is resumed, and after that three (3) pence per lineal yard per week; but should the drainor refuse or neglect to crosscut, or sink, or carry out such other works (as the case may be), then such owner shall be exempted from paying any drainage contribution unless he continues to work his claim or lease below the datum water-level.

7. The owner of any claim or lease who is compelled and who does, in order to effect complete drainage, employ a horse-whim, whip, or steam-engine every day to draw water from such claim or lease, shall be exempt from paying drainage contribution on account of such claim or lease.

8. Any drainor who is receiving drainage contribution shall, should it be his intention to discontinue drainage operations, give at least (3) three months' notice to the drainees of his intention so to do; in the event of such notice not being given, the said drainor shall be held liable for any damage that may accrue to the claims or leases of the drainees from which he has been receiving contributions, through any more sudden stoppage of the drainage machinery.

9. No drainor shall be held liable for any damage caused to any claim or lease through the sudden stoppage of his machinery, if it can be shown that such stoppage was caused by an accident to the machinery not caused by culpable carelessness or negligence; provided however that the necessary repairs are made and drainage resumed with the utmost despatch by the said drainor.

10. *Private agreements to be binding.*—Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this bye-law, any agreement entered into for the purpose of drainage within this district shall be, and the same is hereby declared to be, binding upon the drainees and drainor; provided such agreement has been registered with the mining registrar of the division in which the said land is drained, and a copy thereof lodged with him, and all agreements so entered into shall be binding on the contracting parties, their executors, administrators, agents, and assigns; and the first agreement so registered shall have precedence of all others and shall continue in force until rescinded by the contracting parties. All such agreements may be inspected by parties interested on payment of a fee of one (1) shilling sterling to the mining registrar.

11. For the purposes of this bye-law the words "datum water-level" shall mean the approximate water-level at which the water was first struck on the lode or gutter, and the word "drains" shall be construed to mean the lowering of the datum water-level, or the preventing of the water from rising again by drawing or lifting it.

The undersigned members of the said mining board have concurred in making the foregoing bye-law.

NOTICE.

On the 24th of May, 1867, the harbor lights at the entrance of Port Louis, Mauritius, will be done away with, and a floating light at the Bell-buoy Anchorage will be substituted.

The floating-light vessel will be moored a little to the N. Wrd. of the present well-known bell-buoy, with the following bearings:—

Extreme of land to the northward: N.E. b. N.

Extreme of land to the westward: W.S.W.

Flagstaff on Fort George: S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

Depth of water: 15 fathoms.

The light-vessel will be painted white, which will enable her to be distinctly seen against the dark land during the day.

She will show a "flashing white light" from sunset to sunrise, which will be visible a distance of nine miles in every direction from seaward from the poop of a large vessel.

The fact of this being a flashing light, at short intervals, will sufficiently distinguish it from the revolving light at Flat Island, even were a mistake possible.

Vessels from the northward, after rounding Cannonier Point, must be careful not to bring Cannonier Point light to the westward of Flat Island light, till the floating light at the

Bell-buoy is seen; they may then steer for the latter on a S.S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. bearing, and anchor on that bearing from $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile to a mile from the light.

Vessels approaching the port from the westward, may steer for the floating light on an E. b. N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N. bearing, and either anchor $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile from her on that bearing, or further to the northward as convenient.

The mooring chain of the floating-light runs about 150 fathoms in a N.N.W. direction; vessels must therefore be anchored in such a manner as to avoid hooking it.

The depths from the anchorage vary from 12 to 20 fathoms.

All the bearings are compass bearings.
