REGULATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF  
VICTORIA.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations, framed under Act No. 160, hereinafter called *The Civil Service Act*.—

1. *Hours of business.*—The hours of attendance to be observed in the public offices, except where otherwise ordered, are from nine o'clock a.m. to four o'clock p.m., and on Saturdays from nine o'clock a.m. to twelve o'clock noon. The permanent head, or the chief clerk of each department or office, will be charged with the duty of seeing that these hours are regularly observed by all officers, and will report on the attendance of each officer in the department or office at such times and in such manner as may be directed by the responsible Minister.
2. *Overtime.*—All officers will be required to attend at their offices for such longer period as may, from time to time, be required for the completion of arrears of work, or in consequence of any departmental or public exigency.
3. *Hours of business to be devoted strictly to business.*—All officers are required to devote themselves, during the hours of business, exclusively to the discharge of their public duties. No officer will be allowed to leave his office during such hours, except on official business, or by express permission of the permanent head of the department or branch. Officers having to attend at more than one place of business shall, as far as possible, attend at stated times, and shall post a notice of such times of attendance at the doors of their several offices. Officers are not during the hours of business to receive private visitors, or otherwise to allow their attention to be engaged in private affairs.
4. *Fees or remuneration not to be received.*—No fee, reward, or remuneration of any kind whatsoever beyond his salary, shall be received and kept for his own use by any officer for the performance of any service connected with the department in which he is employed, unless by the express authority in writing (which may from time to time be given and withdrawn) by the responsible Minister. All officers attending in their official character, under a subpoena or order, to give evidence or to produce papers in any court, shall attend such court in performance of and as part of their official duty, and shall forthwith pay over into the Consolidated Revenue, and shall duly enter and account for all fees received by them for the performance of such duty, and shall transmit to the head of their branch an account and vouchers of all the necessary expenses, if any, incurred by them in the performance of such duty.
5. *Officers not to engage in private business.*—No officer shall accept, or shall continue to hold or discharge any paid office in connection with any banking, insurance, or mining company, or any building society, or any similar body whatsoever, without the express permission in writing of the responsible Minister, and notice of every such permission, and of the withdrawal thereof at any time, shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*.
6. *Professional officers not to engage in private practice.*—No professional officer shall engage or continue in the private practice of his profession without the express permission in writing of the responsible Minister; and notice of every such permission, and of the withdrawal thereof at any time, shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*.
7. *Officers not to be members of local bodies.*—No officer shall accept or continue to hold the office of mayor, president, chairman, or member of the council or board of any city, town, borough, shire, or road district.
8. *Addresses and testimonials.*—No address or testimonial shall be accepted by any officer without the sanction in writing of the responsible Minister of his department.
9. *Subordination of officers.*—Every officer shall obey promptly and with readiness all instructions that may be given to him by the officer under whose immediate control or supervision he is placed. If any officer should think that he has ground of complaint, arising out of such instructions, or from any other cause whatsoever, he may at all times report the same, through the permanent head of his branch, to the responsible Minister of the department.
10. *Absence from office or district.*—Except in cases of sudden illness or other emergency, which shall be immediately reported to the responsible Minister, by or through the permanent head, no officer shall be absent without leave from his office or place of business, or from the district to which he is appointed.
11. *Applications for leave of absence.*—Applications for leave of absence shall in all cases be made in writing by or through the permanent head to the Minister of the department, and shall be accompanied by a statement showing the total length of absence of the officer from duty, from all causes, during the previous part of the same year. The permanent head shall also, in all cases of application for leave of absence by any officer under him, make a special report (1) as to the general conduct of the officer during the previous portion of the year, and (2) as to the regularity or irregularity of attendance by the officer for the same period during the hours of business prescribed by the first regulation.
12. *Leave of absence.*—Any officer absent from his office or his district without such application having been made and granted shall, except in case of sudden illness or other emergency mentioned in the last but one preceding regulation, be deemed to be absent without leave. The duties of any officer absent on leave under the provisions of the 36th section of *The Civil Service Act* shall be performed by his brother officers, without additional salary or remuneration, in such manner as the Minister may authorize or direct.
13. *Leave of absence on ground of illness or other pressing necessity.*—Applications for leave of absence on the ground of illness, under s. 36 of *The Civil Service Act*, must be supported by a medical certificate, to the satisfaction of the responsible Minister, that such leave is necessary; and applications for leave of absence on the ground of other pressing necessity, under the section aforesaid, must be supported by reasonable proof of the existence of such necessity.
14. *Travelling allowances to officers absent on duty.*—Officers absent on duty will receive such allowances, exclusive of the cost of travelling, as may be from time to time fixed by the Governor in Council.
15. *Change of station.*—All officers stationed in any place or district will be liable to be removed at any time to any other place or district, and when so removed, without promotion or increase of salary or pay, and not by way of punishment, they will be allowed a reasonable sum, to be fixed by the Minister, for expenses.
16. *Accounts and public moneys.*—In the matter of accounts and the collection and payment of public moneys, officers are enjoined to conform strictly to the provisions of *The Audit Act* and to such regulations and directions as may from time to time be issued by order of the Honorable the Treasurer or the Commissioners of Audit.
17. *Officers not to incur liability on behalf of the Government, or to alter general conditions, &c., of contracts.*—No officer shall be authorized to incur, or shall attempt to incur, any liability, or shall have authority to make, or shall attempt to make, any contract on behalf of the Crown or of the Government, or of any department of the Public Service, without the authority in writing of the Minister of his department. The general conditions and forms of specifications of contracts which may from time to time be prescribed to any department, shall be strictly adhered to by the professional and other officers of such department, unless in any special circumstances an alteration therein may be made, and be approved in writing by the responsible Minister.
18. *Requisitions.*—Requisitions for stores, stationery, furniture, fittings, and repairs to buildings are to be made in strict accordance with the regulations in that behalf, or with such instructions as may from time to time be given by the Honorable the Treasurer and the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works respectively.
19. *Public property in care of officers.*—All officers will be held responsible for the careful use and preservation of all Government property in their possession, custody, or care. Officers in charge of public buildings will, in the event of repairs being required, make a requisition for the same, and are not to allow the buildings to fall into decay, or to become permanently injured, for the want of such repairs.
20. *Information not to be given.*—No information out of the strict course of official duty shall be given, directly or indirectly, by any officer without the express direction or permission of the responsible Minister.
21. *Communications not to be made to the public press.*—No officer shall make any communication, directly or indirectly, to the press upon any matter affecting the department in which he serves, or the business or the officers thereof, or relating to the public service, or his own official position or acts, or upon any political subject or question whatsoever, without the express permission or authority of the responsible Minister.
22. *Applications of officers, how to be made.*—The application of any officer for promotion, leave of absence, change of quarters, increase of salary, or upon any other matter affecting his position in the service, shall be made by the applicant himself, or by or through the head of his branch or department; and if it be made by or through any other person, it will be treated as irregular.
23. *Officers in the Civil Service not to take part in politics.*—In order that officers of all ranks may be enabled to render loyal and efficient service to Government, it is necessary, and they are hereby expressly required and enjoined, not to take any part in political affairs otherwise than by recording their votes for the election of members of parliament. All injurious or offensive comments, written or spoken, and affecting directly or indirectly the personal, official, or public character of His Excellency the Governor, any Minister of the Crown, or any member of either house of Parliament, are hereby expressly forbidden; and every violation of this regulation will be forthwith visited with such punishment as the circumstances of the case shall appear to demand.
24. *Boards of Enquiry—Time and place of meeting.*—The members of any board of enquiry, under section 35 of *The Civil Service Act*, shall fix the time and place of their sittings; and the chairman shall inform the accused, in writing, accordingly, and require his attendance at the time and place fixed. If the accused cannot be found, a notice requiring his attendance may be sent by post to his usual or last known place of abode, and if he do not attend, or send a sufficient excuse for his non-attendance to the satisfaction of the board, the enquiry shall proceed in his absence.
25. *The board to have materials for prosecuting the enquiry.*—Any statement of the accused and all other papers relating to the subject of the enquiry shall be sent to the chairman of the board, who shall, by summons under his hand, require the attendance of any person whose evidence shall, in the judgment of the board, be material to the subject-matter of the enquiry, and the board may, if they think fit, administer an oath to any witness.

26. *Accused officer may be examined.*—The accused officer may in all cases be examined by the board, and his attention shall be called to any points on which his explanation or evidence may be deemed by the board to be incomplete or obscure, or inconsistent with any other part of his evidence, or with the statement made by him as aforesaid. The accused officer shall be allowed to cross-examine every witness giving evidence against him before the board.

27. *Evidence of other misconduct to be reported.*—If in the course of the enquiry it should appear to the board that there is evidence to support an accusation or accusations of breach of duty or misconduct, other than the accusation or accusations of which the accused shall have denied the truth, the board shall report the same to the Governor in Council.

28. *Notes to be kept.*—The chairman or other member of the board shall take full notes of the evidence given before them, and of the information elicited by the board during their enquiry, and the written statements or documents used in the course of the enquiry shall be attached to the proceedings.

29. *Reports and notes to be forwarded through the responsible Minister.*—When the enquiry is concluded, the board shall forward their report to the Governor in Council, through the Minister of the department at whose instance they were appointed, stating their opinion of the case, and adding any remarks they may think fit to make as to any matters connected with the enquiry. The notes of evidence and proceedings shall be forwarded with the report.

30. *Proceedings of the board may be private.*—Except when otherwise directed by the Governor in Council, the proceedings of boards of enquiry shall be private.

31. *Payment of salary after suspension.*—Unless it shall be otherwise specially ordered by the Governor in Council, if any officer be suspended pending the investigation of any complaint or accusation against him, and he be afterwards dismissed from the service, he shall receive no salary or pay from the date of his suspension; and if he be reduced, the reduced rate of salary or pay shall take effect from the date of his suspension; and if he be fully acquitted of the charges made against him, he shall receive arrears of pay in full from the date of his suspension.

32. *Penalties.*—The commission by any officer of anything forbidden, and the neglect or violation of anything enjoined in or by these regulations, shall be deemed to be a breach of duty or misconduct that may render it unfit that the officer should remain in the Civil Service; and the penalty for such breach or misconduct shall be dismissal from the service, or reduction to a lower rank in the service, or to a lower salary within the class, or deprivation of future annual increment, or of leave of absence. All cases of dismissal and reduction under these regulations shall be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

33. *Communications from one department to another.*—All communications from one department to another shall be addressed by and to the responsible Ministers of the said departments respectively.

34. *Officers required to be acquainted with these regulations.*—All officers are required to acquaint themselves with these regulations. Officers at the head of the various branches of each department are directed to send in requisitions for copies of these regulations for the use of all officers under their control; and they are hereby required and enjoined to post, and to keep posted, a copy of these regulations in all offices and rooms to which officers of the Civil Service commonly have access, or in which they perform their duties. Officers at the head of the various branches of each department will be held responsible for the enforcement of these regulations, and are expressly required to report to the responsible Minister every breach or neglect of any regulation, and all other acts of misconduct or defaults on the part of any officer under their control.

Notification to officers and persons employed in the Public Service during pleasure, to whom the provisions of *The Civil Service Act* do not apply:—

The above regulations, with the exception of the regulations relating to Boards of Enquiry, and except in cases specially excepted in writing by the Minister of the department, shall be applicable to every officer and person holding office or employed in the Public Service during pleasure.

Three of the five deaths in Boroondara were inquest cases. Twenty-one out of the thirty deaths registered in Collingwood were of children under three years of age. Sixteen out of the thirty-five deaths registered in South Melbourne occurred in public institutions. Sixteen out of twenty-five fatal cases in North Melbourne were of children under three years of age. A similar proportion obtained in Richmond and Emerald Hill. Measles still very prevalent and fatal in most of the districts. The general reports show a very unsatisfactory condition of the public health.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted by sec. 15, that no person shall within any period of twelve months become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee, either in his own name or in the name or names of any other person or persons, of more than 640 acres of the lands proclaimed under that Act, as therein mentioned; and no person shall become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee of any allotment who is an infant, or who is a married woman not having obtained a decree of judicial separation binding in Victoria, or who is not domiciled in Victoria, or who is in respect of the allotment for a lease of which he applies, or in respect of any part thereof, an agent or a servant of or a trustee for any other person, or who at the time of his application has entered into any agreement to permit any other person to acquire, by purchase or otherwise, the allotment in respect of which such application is made, or any part thereof, or the applicant's interest therein; and all land applied for under that Act shall be so applied for *bona fide* for the use and benefit of the applicant in his own proper person, and not as the agent or servant, or trustee of or for any other person; and allotments selected or purchased under the provisions thereinbefore contained shall be reckoned as part of the 640 acres thereinbefore mentioned; and it is by the said Act provided that if any person shall, in violation of any of the provisions of that section, become the lessee, or assignee, or sub-lessee of an allotment, the Governor in Council may declare the lease of such allotment, to be forfeited, and upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of notice of such declaration, the term created by the said lease shall cease and determine, and the right, title, and interest of the lessee, and of every assignee and sub-lessee in and to such lease, and all moneys paid for rent in respect of such allotment, shall be absolutely forfeited, and the allotment may be sold in fee simple or leased again, in manner in the said Act provided: And whereas the lease mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereto of the allotment therein comprised and thereby demised, being land proclaimed under the provisions of the said Act, was granted at the time, in manner, and to the lessee therein mentioned: And whereas the person whose name is mentioned in the second column of the schedule hereto

became the assignee of the said allotment comprised in and demised by the hereinbefore-mentioned lease, in violation of the provisions to the contrary of the said hereinbefore-recited section, in manner, and for the reasons mentioned in the third column of the schedule hereto: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf given by the said hereinbefore-mentioned Act, doth hereby declare that the said lease mentioned in the said first column of the schedule hereto of the allotment therein comprised and thereby demised is forfeited.

WHEREAS by The Mining Statute of 1855, section 233, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the chief judge of courts of mines and any two or more of the judges of the courts of mines from time to time, but subject to the same Act, to frame such general rules as to them shall seem expedient for and concerning, and so far as not therein provided for, the pleadings, practice, and proceedings of the courts holden under the said Act either in their original or appellate jurisdiction, and for the execution of the process of such courts, and in relation to any of the provisions of the said Act which relate to the courts to be holden thereunder as to which there may arise any doubts: And also to frame forms for every matter or proceeding in the said courts for which they shall think it necessary for a form to be provided and not therein already provided for: And for and concerning the fees to be paid to barristers at law, attorneys practising in said courts, and the expenses to be paid to witnesses in said courts:

Now we the undersigned, the said chief judge and judges of the courts of mines, in pursuance of the said power, do make

and declare the rule following, and that same shall commence and come into operation on the 10th day of January next.

The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1867; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.


