The Prussian Ambassador has made known to Lord Stanley, that in consequence of the Union with the Prussian Monarchy of the Kingdom of Hanover, of the Electorate of Hesse, and of the Free State of Frankfort-on-the-Maine, the Consular Posts of the aforesaid countries are abolished, and united with the Prussian Consular Service.

### FLOATING LIGHT.

#### BELL-BUOY ANCHORAGE, MAURITIUS.

THE following Notice to Mariners, which has been received from the Honorable the Colonial Secretary, Mauritius, is published for general information.

### NOTICE.

On the 24th of May, 1867, the harbor lights at the entrance of Port Louis, Mauritius, will be done away with, and a floating light at the Bell-buoy Anchorage will be substituted.

The floating-light vessel will be moored a little to the N. Wrd. of the present well-known bell-buoy, with the following bearings:—

Extreme of land to the northward: N.E. b. N.

Extreme of land to the westward: W.S.W.

Flagstaff on Fort George: S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.

Depth of water: 15 fathoms.

The light-vessel will be painted white, which will enable her to be distinctly seen against the dark land during the day.

She will show a "flashing white light" from sunset to sunrise, which will be visible a distance of nine miles in every direction from seaward from the poop of a large vessel.

The fact of this being a flashing light, at short intervals, will sufficiently distinguish it from the revolving light at Flat Island, even were a mistake possible.

Vessels from the northward, after rounding Cannonier Point, must be careful not to bring Cannonier Point light to the westward of Flat Island light, till the floating light at the

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Bell-buoy is seen; they may then steer for the latter on a S.S.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. bearing, and anchor on that bearing from  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile to a mile from the light.

Vessels approaching the port from the westward, may steer for the floating light on an E. b. N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. bearing, and either anchor  $\frac{1}{2}$  a mile from her on that bearing, or further to the northward as convenient.

The mooring chain of the floating-light runs about 150 fathoms in a N.N.W. direction; vessels must therefore be anchored in such a manner as to avoid hooking it.

The depths from the anchorage vary from 12 to 20 fathoms.

All the bearings are compass bearings.

### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

#### Point Lonsdale Light.

Commanders of vessels, pilots, and others navigating the entrance to Port Philip, are hereby informed that the temporary fixed Red and Green Light, on Point Lonsdale, will, on and after the 25th instant, be discontinued, and a light of the same character, but of more power and range, will be exhibited from sunset to sunrise from the lighthouse near the Point Lonsdale Telegraph Station.

This light will be seen ten (10) miles off in ordinary weather, appearing *Green* between the bearings of about N. by W. and N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.; and *Red* between the bearings of about N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. and W. by S.

From these bearings navigators will observe that the N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. line passes near the Lonsdale and Lightning Rocks; they must therefore be on their guard before the colors begin to change, as the blending of the Red and Green lights will indicate close vicinity to the line which passes from the lighthouse over these dangers.

### GOLD ESCORTS.

Until further notice, Police Guards will be furnished to persons conveying treasure by coach from the above-named places, on the following conditions.

Arrangements must be made to travel by daylight only.

The coach fares, going and returning, of the police guards must be paid by the persons to whom the guards are supplied.

Notice must be given, three days beforehand, to the officer in charge of police at Avoca or Heathcote, that 1000, or at any of the other place named, that 2000 ounces, are ready for transmission to Ballarat, Sandhurst, or Castlemaine respectively, stating the quantity.

# CASTLEMAINE UNITED TOWN AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

The boundaries of the United Town and Gold-field Common of Castlemaine, the component parts whereof were united by a Proclamation bearing date the 2nd day of February, 1863, are hereby altered, and that the said common shall hereafter comprise the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries defined by the following technical description, viz.: Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Chewton; thence by the east, north-east, and north boundaries of that parish, bearing respectively north, north-westerly, and west to the north-west angle thereof; thence by the east boundary of the parish of Castlemaine bearing north to the north-east angle thereof; thence by the north boundary of that parish bearing west to a point thereon bearing south from the south-west angle of the township of Harcourt; thence by a line bearing north to the said angle of that township; thence by a line bearing west to the east boundary of the parish of Walmer; thence by the said boundary of that parish bearing north to the south-west angle of Barker's pre-emptive section; thence by a line bearing west to the west boundary of the Mount Alexander run; thence by the said boundary of that run bearing northerly to the south angle of the Ravenswood run; thence by the south-western boundary of that run bearing north-westerly to a point bearing north from the north-east angle of allotment 14 of section 8 in the parish of Walmer; thence by the east and south boundaries of section 8, bearing respectively south and west, to the south-east angle of allotment 3; thence by a line bearing south to the north-east angle of allotment 3 of section 7; thence by the north boundaries of allotments 4, 5, 6, and 7 bearing east to the north-east angle of the last-named allotment; thence by the east boundary of that allotment and by the west boundaries of allotments 4 and 3 of section 6, bearing south to the north-west angle of allotment 6 of section 4 in the parish of Mucklesford; thence by the north boundary of that allotment bearing east to the north-east angle thereof; thence by the west boundary of the parish of Castlemaine bearing south to the south-west angle thereof; thence by the north and west boundaries of the parish of Guildford, bearing respectively west and south to the south-east angle of allotment 2 of section 5 in the parish of Strangways; thence easterly to the north-west angle of the Strathloddon pre-emptive section; thence by the north boundary of that pre-emptive section bearing east to Campbell's Creek; thence by that creek bearing northerly to the south boundary of the parish of Castlemaine; and thence by the said boundary of that parish and the south boundary of the parish of Chewton bearing east to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.O.1067.)

## COMMONS IN AGRICULTURAL AREAS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim temporary commons for the use of selectors and lessees in the undermentioned agricultural areas, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

A'BECKETT PLAINS AREA COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 3442 acres, more

or less, are hereby proclaimed a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the Agricultural Area of a'Beckett Plains, viz.: Parish of Kinyapania, allotments 5, 11, 26, 39, 51, 62, 67a, 74, 77b, 78, 79a, 87, 91, 92 and 108.—(66.M.17761.)

HAINESFORD AREA COMMON.—Allotment 83, in the parish of Vite-vite, containing an area of 147 acres, is hereby proclaimed a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the Agricultural Area of Hainesford.—(67.O.1052.)

HEYFIELD AREA COMMON.—The allotments and portion of land hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 1210 acres, more or less, are hereby proclaimed a Temporary Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the Agricultural Area of Heyfield, viz.: Parish of Toongabbie North, allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9; parish of Winindoo, allotments 49, 50, 51, and 52, and the reserve adjoining 52 on the west; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.O.1199.)

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

I HEREBY notify that the subjoined Petition has been addressed and presented to me on the fifteenth day of February, 1867.

*To the Honorable Sir James Frederick Palmer, Knight, President of the Legislative Council of Victoria.*

The humble Petition of Robert Lewis, of Ballarat, in the colony of Victoria, gentleman, whose name is hereto subscribed,

Sheweth—

1. That at the election of a member to serve in the said Legislative Council for the South-Western Province, held on the eleventh day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, under and in pursuance of a certain Writ in that behalf, dated the twelfth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, your Petitioner was a registered elector of the said Province, and had a right to vote, and did vote at the said election.
2. That at the said election George Rolfe and Thomas Learmonth, Esquires, were the candidates, and a poll having been taken, the said George Rolfe was declared by the Returning Officer of the said Province to have the majority of votes, and to be elected, and was returned as a member to serve in the Legislative Council for the said Province.
3. That many persons who were registered as electors of the said Province in respect of freehold qualifications, or as lessees or occupiers of lands or tenements in the said Province, and who voted at the said election for the said Province, became disqualified as electors for the said Province at the said election between the time of the making up and revision of the Electoral Roll in force at the time of the said election and the time of the holding of the said election for the said Province, by reason of the non-retention by them of a sufficient qualification.
4. That the votes of such persons, as in the last paragraph mentioned, were improperly admitted at the said election for the said Province.
5. That if the votes of all those persons so disqualified as aforesaid, but who, nevertheless, voted at the said election for the said Province, were struck off the roll, it would be found that the said Thomas Learmonth obtained a greater number of votes at the said election than the said George Rolfe.
6. That by reason of the premises the said George Rolfe obtained a colorable majority, and was improperly and illegally returned to serve in the said Legislative Council for the said South-Western Province, whereas, in truth and in fact, the said Thomas Learmonth had a majority of legal votes over the said George Rolfe, and was duly elected to serve in the said Legislative Council for the said South-Western Province, and ought to have been returned.

Your Petitioner, therefore, humbly prays—

1. That you will, as soon as conveniently may be, lay this Petition before the Legislative Council, and that the same may be referred to the Committee of Elections and Qualifications.
2. And that the said Committee will take the premises into consideration, and will make a scrutiny into the votes taken at the said election for the said Province, held on the said eleventh day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six; and that the votes of all persons proved not to have retained a sufficient qualification may be struck off.
3. And that the said Committee may determine and report to the said Legislative Council that the said George Rolfe was not duly elected, and ought not to have been returned at the said election, and that the said Thomas Learmonth was duly elected and ought to have been returned; and that, if necessary, the said return may be amended by erasing the name of the said George Rolfe, and substituting that of the said Thomas Learmonth in its stead.
4. And that your Petitioner may have such farther or other relief as the circumstances of the case may require, or as to the said Committee or the said Legislative Council may seem meet.
5. And your Petitioner will ever pray.
