## COMMONS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase or

diminish (as the case may be), the commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

**BURGOYNE AND TARRAWARRA FARMERS' COMMON.**—The Farmers' Common of Burgoyne and Tarrawarra, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th day of February, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto 2,430 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at a point bearing west fifty-six chains from the south-west angle of allotment 28 in the parish of Burgoyne; thence by a line and the south boundary of the said allotment bearing east one hundred and eighteen chains forty-eight links to the south-east angle thereof; thence by a road bearing southerly three miles, more or less, to the old road from Eltham to Burgoyne; thence by the last-named road bearing westerly about one mile and a half to a point bearing south from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing north three miles fifteen chains, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.P.356.)

**REDRUTH TOWN COMMON.**—The Redruth Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 10th day of December, 1866, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the portion thereof comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, and containing an area of 160 acres, more or less, viz.: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 1 of section 8, in the parish of Toolka; thence by the southern boundary of that allotment bearing north-westerly to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line crossing a road bearing west one chain to the east boundary of the Bongmire preemptive section; thence by the said boundary of that section and the prolongation thereof, bearing south to the northern boundary of allotment 1 of section 2A, in the parish of Bochara; thence by the said boundary of that allotment bearing north-easterly to the north angle thereof; and thence by a line (crossing the Wannon River) bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.P.216.)

The five deaths at Brighton were of children under three years of age, the chief causes of mortality being scarlatina, measles, and diarrhoea. The same diseases are recorded as very fatal in Collingwood. In North Melbourne the mortality from diarrhoea has decreased, and the health of the district appears much improved. At Richmond, while the measles is on the decline, diarrhoea and dysentery are on the increase. Over the districts generally there seems to be a slight, but decided improvement in the general health.
