CUTTING OR REMOVING TIMBER, ETC., IN OR FROM CERTAIN LANDS IN THE PARISH OF BECKWORTH PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and seal of the colony, bearing date the sixteenth day of July, in the year 1866, the cutting or removal of live or dead timber or bark from the portion, of Crown lands therein named and described, situate in the parish of Beckworth, was prohibited: And whereas it is expedient to extend such prohibition to certain adjacent lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby extend the area described in the said Proclamation on or from which the cutting or removal of live or dead timber or bark is prohibited, by adding thereto the land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, and containing 225 acres, more or less, viz.:—County of Talbot, parish of Clunes: Commencing at a point on the north boundary of the land described in the above-mentioned Proclamation of the 16th day of July, 1866, the said point bearing south 1 chain 50 links from the south-west angle of the land licensed under the 42nd section of *The Amending Land Act 1865*; thence by the said north boundary bearing west 50 chains, more or less, to the road forming the east boundary of the parish of Beckworth; thence by that road bearing north 45 chains, more or less, to a point bearing east

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1 chain from the north-east angle of allotment 8 in the last-named parish; thence by a line bearing east 50 chains, more or less, to a point bearing north from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing south 45 chains, more or less; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.M.16473.)

FARMERS' COMMONS INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the farmers' commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

ARGYLE AND LINTON FARMERS' COMMON.—The Argyle and Linton Farmers' Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 25th day of February, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, and comprising an area of 400 acres, more or less, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west angle of the existing common; thence by the west boundary thereof bearing south fifty chains, more or less, to the north boundary of that agricultural area of Argyle; thence by the said boundary of that agricultural area, bearing west eighty chains; and thence by lines bearing respectively north fifty chains, more or less, and east eighty chains to the point of commencement.—(66.N.13250.)

ELTHAM AND GLENGGLOY UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The United Town and Farmers' Common of Eltham and Glenggloy, constituted by a Proclamation bearing date the 19th day of January, 1863, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands in the township of Eltham, comprising an area of 250 acres, more or less.—(65.L.14491.)

WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by *The Local Government Act 1863*, has by Orders severally made on the 4th day of March, 1867, directed that the undermentioned Shire Councils shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:—

The Council of the Shire of Ballarat shall, within twelve months from the 4th of March aforesaid, drain, form, and metal one mile thirteen chains and forty-eight links of the Ballarat to Amherst main road.

The Council of the Shire of Ballarat shall, within twelve months from the 4th of March aforesaid, drain, form, and metal two miles of the Ballarat to Ararat main road.

The Council of the Shire of Ballarat shall, within twelve months from the 4th of March aforesaid, drain, form, and metal one mile sixty-eight chains and eighty-four links of the Ballarat to Avoca main road.

The Council of the Shire of Bright shall, within twelve months from the 4th of March aforesaid, drain, form, and metal one mile sixty-one chains and fifty links of the Myrtleford to Bright main road.
