EXTENSION OF THE FOREIGN DESERTERS ACT 1852 (CONCERNING SEAMEN), TO THE UNITED STATES OF COLOMBIA.

THE subjoined Despatch and Order of the Queen in Council are published for general information.

Sir.—With reference to my Circular Despatch of the 26th of October last, I have the honor to transmit to you a copy of an Order of Her Majesty in Council of the 28th of December last, extending to the United States of Colombia the provisions of the Foreign Deserters Act 1852.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas by the Foreign Deserters Act 1852; it is provided that whenever it is made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are or will be given for recovering or apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of any foreign power, Her Majesty may, by Order in Council stating that such facilities are or will be given, declare that seamen, not being slaves, who desert from merchant ships belonging to such power, when within Her Majesty's dominions, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships, and may limit the operation of such Order, and may render the operation thereof subject to such conditions and qualifications, if any, as may be deemed expedient; and whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that due facilities are given for recovering and apprehending seamen who desert from British merchant ships in the territories of the United States of Colombia:

Now therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Foreign Deserters Act 1852, and by and with the advice of the Privy Council, is pleased to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that, from and after the publication hereof in the London Gazette, seamen, not being slaves, and not being British subjects, who, within Her Majesty's dominions, desert from merchant ships belonging to the United States of Colombia, shall be liable to be apprehended and carried on board their respective ships:

Provided, always, that if any such deserter has committed any crime in Her Majesty's dominions he may be detained until he has been tried by a competent court, and until his sentence, if any, has heen fully carried-into effect.

And the Right Honorable the Earl of Carnaryon, the Right Honorable the Viscount Cranborne, and the Right Honorable Spencer Horatio Walpole, three of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions accordingly.

ANCHORAGES AMONG THE SOUTH SEA ISLANDS. THE following Hydrographic notice, relating to various anchorages among the South Sea Islands, is published for general information.

SOUTH PACIFIC OCEAN.

THE following remarks on various anchorages among the South Sea I-lands have been received from Captain Charles W. Hope, R. N., commanding H.M.S. Brisk.
(All bearings are magnetic. Variation at Rotumah 9° 30′ E. in 1866).

Samoan or Navigator Islands.

Manua or Manua-tele Island.—While the trade wind is blowing vessels may anchor off the village of Feleasau, in a small bay just east of the north-west point of the island. The Brisk anchored the rein '15' fathoms and found 'it tolerably sheltered, but a vessel should be prepared to weigh on any change of wind. The landing place is a very narrow passage through the reef, only wide enough for a whale boat, and is dangerous if there is much swell on.

Olosinga Island.—The Brisk visited this island and hove to on the north side where no anchorage could be found. The landing place is difficult at low water on account of the fringing coral reef.

Savaii Island.—Matantu Roadstead. Vessels intending to anchor of Matantu should give the reef which projects from the

point a berth of half a mile, as there is shoal water off it, perhaps a continuation of the reef: the Brisk rounding the reef at the distance of two cables, had 5 fathoms water, and there is said to be less. The plan from the United States survey shows no indication of this shoal patch, which however is well known to the residents.

#### WALLIS ISLAND OR UVEA.

Captain Hope confirms the account given of the harbor off the south end of this island by Captain Sir Everard Home in 1844, in Findley's South Pacific Directory, pages 499 and 500, and adds, "The channel up to the inner anchorage is very torthous between patches of coral, but in favorable weather they are easily seen and present no difficulty to a steam vessel; a ship should not, however, proceed to the upper anchorage without a pilot if one can be procured."

#### ROTUMAH ISLAND.

ROTUMAH ISLAND.

There are two anchorages on the north of Rotumah Island.

Lee Harbor, as it is called.—An open bay about a mile and a half from the west end of the island. This bay is well marked by a high wooded bluff on its western side, with a precipitous red sandstone face to the water's edge. The Brisk anchored here in 15 fathoms, with the east point of the bay bearing N.E. \( \frac{1}{2} \) E., and the centre of Emery Island W. by N.\( \frac{1}{2} \) N. Emery Island is the easternost of a chain of islest lying to the northwest of Rotumah, and is high, wooded, and inhabited. There is a clear channel between these islets and Rotumah, but the passages between them are said to be unsafe. The westernmost islet of this chain has a remarkable perpendicular cieft right across it through which the sea passes.

North-east Roadstead is about 5 miles to the eastward of Lee Harbor, at the north-east point of the island, and is close to the westward of two islets lying off the point, which are connected to each other and to the main island by a coral reef; this anchorage is sheltered during the trade wind season, but a nasty sea sets round the island, and Lee Harbor is a much superior roadstead. The Brisk anchored at the north-east roadstead in 11 fathoms, sand, with the outer extreme of the outer islet E. by N.; but two cables further: in would be a better berth, as there would be more shelter if the trade wind were bloving strong, which it frequently does.

#### CURTIS ISLAND.

The Brisk did not sight this island in the position assigned to it in the Admiralty chart. Captain Hope obtained information from the master of an American whate ship that it was in 1783 88' west; this agrees nearly with the longitude given by D'Entrecastreaux in 1793 (178' 48' 20"), as also by D'Urville in 1827, 1783 37' 20" west of Greenwich. Applying to the position of Raoul or Sunday Island, as determined by Captain Denham in 1854, the distance stated by D'Entrecastreaux, it would place Curtis Island in lat 30' 30' S., and long, 178' 37' W.; this lust position cannot therefore be far from the truth.\*
