ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Douth Galla and Keilor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade at the Melbourne Observatory, calculated from a reduced mean corresponding with that of twenty-four hourly observations taken on each day during the month of February, 1867:—

The rate of mortality in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of February was not so high by 3.59 deaths per day as it was in January. It was, however, higher than in any previous month of February, and the deaths numbered 160 in excess of the average of that month during eight years.

The mean temperature and mean atmospheric pressure of the month were each a fraction above the average.

Males contributed 52½ per cent., and females 47½ per cent. towards the general mortality. Seventy-four per cent. of the deaths were of children under five years of age. This latter proportion amounted to 53 per cent. in February, 1860, to 64 per cent. in February, 1865, to 62 per cent. in February, 1864, to 65 per cent. in February, 1863, to 68 per cent. in February, 1862, to 66 per cent. in February, 1861, and to 64 per cent. in February, 1860. It has thus not reached so high a proportion in any previous month of February as in the month under review.

The highest number of deaths on any one day was 29 on the 11th. The next highest number was 25 on the 3rd and 5th; then 24 on the 8th; then 23 on the 4th and 10th; then 22 on the 7th and 25th; then 20 on the 9th and 14th. The lowest daily mortality was 11 on the 6th, 19th, and 23rd; then 12 on the 22nd.

Three males and one female died at more advanced ages than 75 years, viz.:—A male aged 77 of debility; a male aged 77 of bronchitis; a male aged 81 of bronchitis; and a female aged 76 of old age.

Twelve violent deaths occurred during the month, all of which were referred to accidental causes. Of these, four were of fractures and contusions, viz.—Those of a boy, aged 5, from injuries caused by the wheel of a waggon passing over him; of a jockey, aged 19, from injury to the brain caused by a fall from a horse; of a laborer, aged 20, from rupture of the bladder, resulting from an external injury; and of a ship's cook, aged 37, from an accidental fall down the cabin stairs of a steamer. Three were of burns and scalds, viz.—Those of a boy, aged 2, at Brighton; of a girl, aged 2, at Flemington; and of a nightman, aged 67, at Gardiner. One was of coup de soleil, viz.—That of an infant aged 48 weeks, at Emerald Hill. Three were of drowning, viz.—Those of a male aged 45, of a male aged 50, and of a male aged 55, all in the Yarra. One was of suffocation, viz.—That of a male lunatic in the Asylum at Carlton, who was choked by a piece of meat.

Forty-eight deaths, or about nine per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.—Twenty-one in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Branch Asylum at Carlton, 1 in the Branch Asylum in the Royal Park, 2 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum, 2 in St. Vincent de Paul's Orphan Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital is in Melbourne Proper, the Benevolent Asylum in North Melbourne and Carlton, the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum in Jika-jika parish (remainder of), and the Industrial Schools in South Yarra and Prahran.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different districts since the census was taken.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 384, of which 198, or nearly 52 per cent., were of males, and 186, or about 48 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 181 were under one year of age, 148 were between one and two years, 34 were between two and three, 15 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 136, of which 75, or about 55 per cent., were males, and 61, or nearly 45 per cent., were females; 24 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 5 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 9 were between twenty-five and thirty, 8 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 11 were between forty and forty-five, 9 were between forty-five and fifty, 11 were between fifty and fifty-five, 5 were between fifty-five and sixty, 2 were between sixty and sixty-five, 2 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 1 was eighty and upwards.

CLASS V.—VIOLENT DEATHS.

On comparing the causes of death in January with those in the month under review, an improvement is observed in zymotic diseases. These only caused 47½ per cent. of the deaths in the latter month against 58 per cent in the former. Measles occasioned 71 deaths against 148 in January; scarlatina and diphtheria caused 29 deaths against 45; dysentery and diarrhoea caused 114 deaths against 165. The mortality from developmental diseases did not show a like improvement. The number of deaths caused by these affections, the chief of which are teething and atrophy and debility of infants, amounted to 62 in January and 60 in February, the latter number being equivalent to 100 if the month had consisted of 31 days. Phthisis caused 29 deaths in the month under review against 30 deaths in the former month.
