Several cases of diphtheria, scarlatina, and low fever are reported at Collingwood, and the deaths exceeded the births for the past week. Fifteen out of the twenty-three deaths registered in South Melbourne occurred in public institutions. Eleven out of the eighteen deaths registered in North Melbourne were of children under three years of age. On the whole there is a perceptible improvement in the general health of the metropolitan districts.

THE Governor in Council has made the subjoined additional Regulations, viz.:-

*Additional regulation to follow clause 16, and to be marked 16a.*  
UNATTACHED LIST.

Any officer may for past good service obtain permission to resign his position in his corps or the appointment he holds without quitting the force, and every officer obtaining such permission is to be placed on an unattached list.

The services of unattached officers are at all times to be at the disposal of the officer commanding the force.

Unattached officers will wear the uniform of the branch of the service to which they belong, without the number or badge of any particular corps.

Unattached officers are not to perform any military duty unless specially directed.

*Additional effective regulation for cavalry, to be added to clause 31.*

Except where a troop shall have at its own expense horsed one or more guns, with not less than four horses to each gun, and contributed twelve effectives for the working thereof, in such case the sum of £3 per effective, for not more than twelve men per troop, will be allowed; provided that all men for whom such allowance is claimed shall have performed such artillery duties during the past year as the officer commanding the force may have directed.

Parades and drills for the gun detachments may be returned as follows:—Mounted parades, not less than ten men present, the gun being horsed; dismounted parades or drills, not less than eight men per gun present.

Every troop to whom the above allowance shall have been granted may return twelve effectives over the number otherwise allowed.

*Additional regulation to follow clause 51, and to be marked clause 51a.*

Any non-commissioned officer who does not qualify as an effective will not be allowed to retain his grade, unless it shall appear to the officer commanding the force that there are special reasons for the relaxation of this regulation.

All privates not being effective, or absent without leave, are liable to be struck off the strength of their corps by the officer commanding the force, at the recommendation of their commanding officer.

## VOLUNTEER LAND CERTIFICATES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations for the issue of Certificates to Volunteers under the 5th section of *The Amending Land Act*.

All officers, non-commissioned officers, and members of the Volunteer force of Victoria, not being on the paid staff or serving for pay in the said Force, shall be entitled to a Certificate from the Board of Land and Works, subject to the following regulations and conditions:—

1. Claims of Volunteers for Land Certificates will be considered by a Board composed of the following members—  
 An Officer of the Law Department,  
 An Officer of the Local Military Department,  
 An Officer of the Department of Public Lands.

Warrants will be issued by the Board to those Volunteers who may be deemed to be entitled to them; and the holder of a warrant will be entitled to receive a Certificate from the Board of Land and Works under 28 Vict. No. 237, § 5.

2. Every warrant issued shall set forth, in detail, the services for which it is granted, and shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board, and countersigned as registered in the Local Military Department.

3. No warrant shall be issued unless the members of the Board are unanimous, or in the event of their not agreeing, unless a majority of the Members of the Board shall have referred the case to the Officer commanding the Volunteer Force, and shall have obtained his sanction for the issue of the warrant.

4. The declaration provided by the regulations, under the Volunteer Statute, clauses 96 and 97, shall be taken by the members of the board and the witnesses respectively.

5. Services performed prior to the establishment of an effective system under the regulations published on the 25th day of September, 1863, shall not count, unless they be equivalent to the minimum amount of duty in time and drill now required, before service as an effective commences to reckon. From and after the 25th of September, 1863, the effective qualification therein proclaimed for men joining the new enrolment shall be deemed to qualify up to the 10th October, 1863, the date on which the present effective system came into force.

Where the above requirements cannot be proved from records of corps, or from the personal knowledge of commanding officers to have been complied with, the merits of the case will be considered specially; and no warrant in such case shall issue unless with the approval of the officer commanding the force.

6. The official records of service under the regulations shall be sufficient evidence to the Board of effective service performed after the 10th of October, 1863.

LANCEFIELD CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LANCEFIELD CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid and answers given to the questions contained in schedule B, when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 19th section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*, "Any person making or digging a vault, grave, or tombstone, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever."

3. Application for such permission to be made to the trustees at the cemetery. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule marked A, will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted in the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of any two of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Order for interment to be given either to the sexton or at the office of the trustees, on the previous day; that six working hours' notice, from Seven a.m. to Six p.m., be given of each interment, except when the necessity of immediate interments shall be certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner.

6. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the party entitled thereto, must be left with the order. No grave shall be less than six feet in depth.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-tones to be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked-in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.

11. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees. All wooden fencing must be after a mode to be seen on application.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. No vehicle of any description or saddle horses to be permitted to enter the cemetery; and the ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is to be kept at the office.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant will be proceeded against as directed by *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*.

16. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in these charges and regulations.
