AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.  
PORT WILLUNGA, GULF OF ST. VINCENT.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation 5° east in 1866.]

The following information respecting the Gulfs of Spencer and St. Vincent has been received from the Marine Board of Port Adelaide, South Australia.

*Buoy off Snapper Point.*—A large red pyramidal-shaped buoy has been placed outside the reef, extending in a westerly direction from Snapper Point, the southern horn of the bay, in which Port Willunga is situated. The buoy is moored in 10½ fathoms, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 4 miles.

In the event of any accident occurring to the buoy, the reef off Snapper Point may be cleared, by keeping the Inn—which is close to the beach on the north side of the jetty of Port Willunga—twice its own breadth open north of the end of the jetty. The buoy is placed inside this line.

*Anchorage.*—The moorings which were laid down in 1855 have been removed; ships will, therefore, have to depend on their own anchors. The holding-ground is good anywhere outside the 4-fathom line off the jetty, but the anchorage is exposed to all winds from N.W.—round by west—to S.W., and at times a heavy sea rolls in, causing ships at anchor to be uneasy, and—unless well found in ground tackle—rendering their position unsafe.

It is therefore recommended on the approach of a north-west gale—which is indicated by a falling barometer, and the wind freshening from the northward with a cloudy sky—that shelter should be sought in Eastern Cove, Kangaroo Island, where a ship may anchor in perfect safety, according to her draught of water, and remain until more favorable weather enables her to return to Port Willunga.

PORT WAKEFIELD, GULF OF ST. VINCENT.

*Long Spit Buoy.*—A large red pyramidal-shaped buoy, surmounted by a ball, has been placed on the south-western extremity of the Long Spit, which extends for about 20 miles in a north-westerly direction from Port Gawler Flats, north of the channel into Port Adelaide.

The buoy is moored in 19 feet at low-water, with the south summit of the Hummock range of hills at the head of the gulf N. by W., and Mount Lofty E. 38° S. Its position is given in lat. 34° 32' S., long 138° 10' 15" E. of Greenwich.

Inside the buoy the water shoals quickly, whilst outside it rapidly deepens to 6 fathoms, the greatest depth in the middle of the gulf being 10 fathoms.

*Bald Hill Spit Buoy.*—A large red pyramidal-shaped buoy, with a triangular head, has been moored in 17 feet at low-water, on the outer extremity of Bald Hill spit, which extends in a westerly direction from Sandy Point, at the entrance of Port Wakefield. No bearings for this buoy are given.

*Thistle Rock,* of small extent, is awash at low-water springs; it is in the track of small vessels beating down the gulf, and lies about 7½ miles to the southward of Bald Hill, and about 2 miles from the nearest sandy beach. It is said to be in lat. 34° 22' 5" S., long 138° 13' 15" E. of Greenwich, and from it the following bearings are given, viz.:—Mount Lofty, S.E. ½ S.; and the southern summit of Hummock Range, N. by W. ½ W.

The position of the rock is marked by a large red buoy, which, like all other red buoys, should be kept on the starboard hand when bound to the north or inwards, and on the port hand when bound to the south or outwards.

Coasters have reported other small rocks in the vicinity of the Thistle Rock, but their exact position is at present unknown.

*Winds.*—During fine weather in the summer months the winds are generally as follow, viz.:—Between sunrise and about eight o'clock, a.m., from E. to E.S.E.; during hot weather the wind in the morning may be from N.E., gradually falling calm towards eight a.m. The sea-breeze generally sets in about eleven a.m., after an interval of two hours' light winds or calm, and freshens towards five p.m., gradually moderating until sunset, when the wind veers round to the S.E., and dies away towards night.

*Tides.*—At Port Wakefield under the ordinary circumstances of land and sea-breezes it is high-water, full and change at 5h., with a rise of about 9 feet. The tides at the head of the Gulf of St. Vincent are very irregular, and much affected by winds. During the fine weather the rise and fall at neaps is almost imperceptible, and the time of apparent high-water irregular.

With strong westerly winds the rise is augmented, and fall diminished; and the contrary effect occurs with south or south-easterly winds. During westerly winds the neap tides are often higher than the ordinary springs, with south or south-easterly winds.

*Directions.*—Being off Port Adelaide light-vessel, and bound to Port Wakefield with a leading wind, steer N.W. ½ W.—making due allowance for tide—and continue on this course for 22 miles, when the Long Spit buoy ought to be sighted.

Great caution should be observed on nearing the buoy, especially during thick weather or with the sun ahead; the lead should be in constant use, and by maintaining a depth of 5 fathoms the edge of the Long Spit may be avoided, and the buoy sighted.

Having brought the buoy on Long Spit to bear N.E., and being distant from it about 2 miles, steer N.N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W. for 12 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles, or until the south summit of Hummock Range bears north; then alter course to north for a distance of 4 miles, until the land at the head of the gulf is seen, and Bald Hill on the eastern shore inside Sandy Point is distinguished; then alter course to N.N.E., keeping in not less than 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms until the buoy on Bald Hill Spit is observed; and after passing the buoy on its western side, 2 cables length off, again alter course to north, and anchor in about 4 fathoms, with the largest store in the town of Port Wakefield N.N.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., Bald Hill Spit S.E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., and the mangrove bushes on Sandy Point about E.S.E. In this position there will be room to swing, but not space enough to beat out of the port, without going into 18 feet at low-water.

On leaving the light-vessel at Port Adelaide for Port Wakefield, with a beating wind, a vessel should make the first board to the westward, and stand on that tack—say west—for about 16 miles, taking care not to go into less than 8 fathoms; in order to avoid the edge of Orontes bank. In working between this bank and Long Spit flats, the lead should be kept constantly going; and in drawing to the northward, the Long Spit buoy should be sighted, as it is a good mark for being to the northward of the Orontes bank.

When off this buoy, the western shore may be safely approached, and long boards may be made from the 5-fathom line of the Long Spit, to within about the distance of a mile from the western shore. On reaching Sandy Point, the buoy off Bald Hill spit should be passed as previously directed, when short tacks may be made, taking care not to bring the buoy to the southward of S. by E., nor to stand to the westward into less than 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms. Anchor as before directed.

Small vessels may stand towards the landing-place at Port Wakefield, bearing in mind that the water shoals very rapidly from 3 fathoms, but even should a vessel touch no injury will follow, as no sea runs in, and the bottom is generally composed of sand and mud; care, however, must be taken to keep a ship clear of her anchor.

In leaving Port Wakefield, it is advisable not to start until morning, when the wind being generally from the eastward, an offing may be obtained.

The barometer falls rapidly with northerly winds, both in summer and winter, and generally precedes a change of weather and westerly winds. During the summer months a falling barometer often precedes a strong southerly wind; in the winter, the strongest winds are from the westward.

Produce is now sent from Port Wakefield to the shipping in the roadstead by barges. The river entrance is very shallow and has a flat, upwards of a mile in extent, uncovered at low-water springs.

The question of either deepening the entrance to the river, or building a jetty across the flat, is now under the consideration of the Government.

The supply of fresh water at Port Wakefield is limited, and difficult to procure; it is therefore recommended that a sufficient stock should be obtained at Port Adelaide, if ships call there on their way up the Gulf, or water can be obtained by making arrangements for barges to bring up the necessary supply.

**SPENCER'S GULF.**

*Buoy off Cape Elizabeth.*

Also, that a red pyramidal-shaped buoy has been placed in 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms at low-water, off the outer end of the reef which extends nearly a mile, in a N.W. by W. direction from Cape Elizabeth, Spencer's Gulf. The buoy is moored 4 cables length to the westward of the shoalest part of the reef, and in clear weather, from an elevation of 10 feet above the sea-level, should be seen from a distance of 4 miles.

The bearings from the buoy are given as follow, viz.—Cape Elizabeth E.N.E., and Tipara light-vessel N.N.W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.

**AUSTRALIA—EAST COAST.**

**REEF OFF CAPE CLEVELAND.**

[Variation 6° 50' east in 1866.]

THE following information has been received from Commander G. S. Nares, H.M.S. *Salamander*, in a letter dated 18th June, 1866:—

The reef 2 miles east of Cape Cleveland, on the east coast of Australia, is marked by a rock 4 feet above high water, but the outer reef awash at low-water 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  miles east of the Cape is very dangerous, having no mark by which its position may be distinguished. Several lines of soundings were taken in the boats of H.M.S. *Salamander*, proving that channels exist between these reefs and the mainland; but as the locality has not been accurately surveyed, vessels are cautioned to pass outside the outer reef.

**PRINCESS CHARLOTTE BAY.**

*Beacon on d. Reef.*—Also that a beacon 18 feet by 12 feet, and marked with the letter D, has been erected on the eastern extreme of d. reef. Hawks-bill turtle are numerous in the month of March, in the lagoon, within the reef.

**SOLOMON ISLANDS.**

*Supposed Reef.*

THE following information has been received from Captain Charles Edwards, of the Mercantile Marine, in a letter dated 1st June, 1866:—

Whilst cruising amongst the Solomon Islands in January last, Captain Edwards saw a very heavy breaker over a space of about half a mile in extent, to the north-westward, and judging

from the roll, he thinks shoal-water extends around it for about 2 miles in every direction; two days afterwards, having made but little progress, he saw the same breaker to the eastward. On both occasions the wind was light, with a roll on the westward.

The position of the breaker is given in lat. 7° 48' S., long. 159° 45' E. of Greenwich.
