GRANT FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

2. That no grant exceeding £200 be paid to any one library.
3. That no grant be made to any institution in Melbourne; or more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of it.

A PROCLAIMED ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for ten or more inhabitants of any part of Victoria not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district, and of whom each one shall possess property rateable under the said Act within the area next hereinafter mentioned, to sign and present to the Governor a petition setting forth that the area, which shall by metes and bounds be described in such petition, contains not less than forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual value is not less than Five thousand pounds, and praying that such area may be constituted a road district; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon being satisfied that the statements set forth in the petition are true, and that it is desirable to comply with the prayer thereof, to constitute such part of Victoria, under such name as shall in and by the same Order in Council be assigned thereto, a new road district; and the words "proclaimed district," where used in the said Act, shall be deemed to mean such new district: And whereas a petition signed by more than ten inhabitants of the area or part of Victoria hereinafter described, possessing rateable property in such area, has been presented to the Governor, setting forth the matters and things required by the said Act, and due notice of such petition has been published as provided by the said Act, and in compliance with the prayer thereof, an Order in Council bearing even date herewith, has been made, to constitute the said area a new road district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute and proclaim the part of Victoria hereinafter described to be a new road district, under the name assigned thereto in and by the Order in Council hereinbefore mentioned, that is to say:—

THE BAINSDALE ROAD DISTRICT.—Starting at Lake Victoria on Tom's Creek; thence north-westerly by the boundary of Avon Shire to the west boundary of Sandy Creek Station; thence by the boundaries of Sandy Creek, Glenaladale, and Tabberabera, and including those stations to the Dargo River; thence by that river to a point due west of the summit of

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Mount Birregun; thence east to that mount; thence north-easterly by the Main Dividing Range to Tongeo Gap; thence by a line to Mount Bulla-bulla, as far as the Snowy River; and by the Snowy River, the Southern Ocean, and northern shores of Lakes King and Victoria to the starting point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

CHAPMAN AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862*, and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby diminish the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

CHAPMAN AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.—The Farmers' Common, for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area of Chapman, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th day of February, 1867, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom the allotments and parts of allotments hereinafter enumerated, and comprising an area of 1173 acres, more or less, viz.:—Parish of Kalynda, allotments 2b, 3a, 8b, and parts of allotments 14 A b, 17a, and 17b; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(66.N.10350.)

- The coach fares, going and returning, between Mansfield and Longwood, of the police guard, and the hire of any horses found necessary for them between Wood's Point and Longwood must be paid by the persons who apply for the guard.
- Four mounted constables will form the guard between Beechworth and Kilmore, and one mounted man from thence to Melbourne, two dismounted men, well armed, riding also in the conveyances with the treasure.
- Neither the Government nor the Police Guards will be responsible in any manner for the treasure conveyed.
