ESCORT SERVICE.

UNTIL further notice Police Guards will be furnished to persons conveying Treasure from Wood's Point and Beechworth to Melbourne, on the following conditions, and in accordance with the subjoined Time Table.

2. Arrangements must be made to travel by daylight only.

3. No guard will be supplied for less than 4,000 ounces from either place.

4. The coach fares, going and returning, between Mansfield and Longwood, of the police guard, and the hire of any horses found nocessary for them between Wood's Point and Longwood must be paid by the persons who apply for the guard.

5. Four mounted constables will form the guard between Beechworth and Kilmore, and one mounted man from thence to Melbourne, two dismounted men, well armed, riding also in the conveyances with the treasure.

6. Neither the Government nor the Police Guards will be responsible in any manner for the treasure conveyed.
