## COMMONS.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase or proclaim (as the case may be), the commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

SAGO HILL AND CAMPBELL'S GULLY GOLD-FIELD COMMON. —The Sago Hill and Campbell's Gully Gold-Field Common is hereby increased by adding thereto one thousand acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown Lands comprised within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 6 in the parish of Haddon; thence by a road bearing east one hundred and sixty-six chains ninety-three links to the western side of the road from Smythesdale to Burrumbeet; thence by that road bearing southerly to the south-eastern angle of allotment 7 of section 18; thence by the road forming the north boundary of McLachlan's pre-emptive section, bearing west ninety-eight chains seventy links; thence by the road forming the west boundary of the said pre-emptive section, bearing south sixteen chains fifty links, more or less, to the north side of the road from Carngnam to Ballarat; thence by that road bearing N. 80° 30' W. fifty-five chains, more or less, to the road forming

the west boundary of section 6; and thence by that road bearing north seventy-four chains fifty-five links to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. — (66.N.17715.)

**TYLDEN TOWN COMMON.**—The unappropriated Crown Lands in the township of Tylden, comprising an area of 110 acres, more or less, are hereby proclaimed a Town Common for the use of all householders of that township. — (66.N.17496.)

#### FORFEITURE OF A LEASE OF AGRICULTURAL ALLOTMENTS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourteenth day of January, 1867.

**WHEREAS** by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, by sec. 15, that no person shall within any period of twelve months become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee, either in his own name or in the name or names of any other person or persons, of more than 610 acres of the lands proclaimed under that Act, as therein mentioned; and no person shall become the lessee, or sub-lessee, or assignee of any allotment who is an infant, or who is a married woman not having obtained a decree of judicial separation binding in Victoria, or who is not domiciled in Victoria, or who is in respect of any part thereof, an agent or a servant of or a trustee for any other person, or who at the time of his application has entered into any agreement to permit any other person to acquire, by purchase or otherwise, the allotment in respect of which such application is made; or any part thereof, or the

applicant's interest therein; and all land applied for under that Act shall be so applied for *bona fide* for the use and benefit of the applicant in his own proper person, and not as the agent or servant, or trustee of or for any other person; and allotments selected or purchased under the provisions thereinbefore contained shall be reckoned as part of the 640 acres thereinbefore mentioned; and it is by the said Act provided that if any person shall, in violation of any of the provisions of that section, become the lessee, or assignee, or sub-lessee of an allotment, the Governor in Council may declare the lease of such allotment, to be forfeited, and upon publication in the *Government Gazette* of notice of such declaration, the term created by the said lease shall cease and determine, and the right, title, and interest of the lessee, and of every assignee and sub-lessee in and to such lease, and all moneys paid for rent in respect of such allotment, shall be absolutely forfeited, and the allotment may be sold in fee simple or leased again, in manner in the said Act provided: And whereas the lease mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereto of the allotments therein comprised and thereby demised, being land proclaimed under the provisions of the said Act, was granted at the time, in manner, and to the lessee therein mentioned: And whereas the person whose name is mentioned in the second column of the schedule hereto became the assignee of the said allotments comprised in and demised by the hereinbefore-mentioned lease, in violation of the provisions to the contrary of the said hereinbefore-recited section, in manner, and for the reasons mentioned in the third column of the schedule hereto: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise and execution of the power or authority in that behalf given by the said hereinbefore-mentioned Act, do hereby declare that the said lease mentioned in the said first column of the schedule hereto of the allotments therein comprised and thereby demised is forfeited.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1867; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
