WHEREAS about Four o'clock in the morning of Wednesday, the 17th of April last, a fire occurred in the diningroom of the boarding-house kept by Owen O'Connor, Nos. 33 and 34, Lydiard street, Ballarat, but was readily subdued without serious damage: And whereas about an hour subsequently another fire broke out on another part of the same building, but was readily extinguished: And whereas at Half-past Eleven o'clock on the night of Tuesday, the 23rd of April aforesaid, another fire occurred in a bedroom on the same premises: And whereas at inquests held to investigate the origin of the said fires, verdicts were returned of wilful incendiarism against some person or persons unknown: And whereas the Victoria Fire and Marine Insurance Company (at whose office the said premises were insured) have by their agent offered a Reward of Pifty pounds for information issuing in the conviction of the person-or persons guilty of the attempts to burn the above-mentioned premises: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Fifty pounds (supplemental to that offered by the Insurance Company) will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons guilty of the said three attempts to burn the said premises.
