#### DONNYBROOK AND WALLAN-WALLAN ROAD DISTRICT.

#### BYE-LAWS of the above District.

##### I. BUSINESS OF THE BOARD.

1. The ordinary meetings of the board shall be held at the offices of the board at Beveridge, on the last Tuesday of every month, at 11 o'clock in the forenoon; but should a quorum not be present within one hour after that time, such circumstance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute-book, and the meeting shall be adjourned.

2. The minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

3. After the confirmation of the minutes (except when new members have to be introduced, which shall take precedence of all other business) the order of business shall be as follows:—

- I. Reading letters received, and ordering thereupon.
- II. Reading copies of letters sent.
- III. Reception of and reading petitions.
- IV. Reading and ordering upon reports of committees, deputations, and officers.
- V. Orders of the day.
- VI. Financial statement and payment of accounts.
- VII. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.
- VIII. Reading notices of motion for future meetings.

4. Every petition or memorial addressed to the board must be presented by a member, who shall be responsible for its being in proper form and respectfully worded; and no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received and considered after the orders of the day or at a future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

5. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration.

6. Notices of motion shall be given in writing to the clerk, and shall be read aloud at a meeting of the board previous to the one at which such are to be discussed; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

7. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

##### II. ORDER OF DEBATE.

8. Every member shall stand when addressing the board, unless called to order, when he shall sit down till the point of order is decided, after which he shall be allowed to resume the subject.

9. The ruling of the chairman shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

10. No important business or motion involving the expenditure of more than £20 shall be proceeded with, unless notice of motion shall have been given at a previous meeting.

11. Any member proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of such before addressing the board in support thereof.

12. No motion or amendment shall be discussed unless it be seconded.

13. One amendment only shall be discussed, and shall be put to the vote before the original motion; but if lost, one other may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon.

14. All motions shall be put to the meeting by the chairman, and a show of hands shall be taken; but any member may require a division, in which case the votes shall be recorded, and all the members present shall vote.

15. Any motion may be set aside by the previous question being moved, viz., "That this question be now put" and negatived, but no discussion shall be allowed thereon.

16. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but on any adjournment being moved and negatived, the subject then under discussion or the next on the notice paper, as the case may be, shall be decided before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undiposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

17. No member of the board shall speak more than once on any question except in explanation or reply upon a motion or amendment of which he is the mover, nor shall grieve from the subject matter under discussion, nor make use of offensive language or demeanour to any other member; and any member offending in this respect who shall refuse to withdraw the offensive expression and apologize, on being required to do so by the chairman, or shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered in a summary way, according to law.

18. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the board. Notice of intention to protest must, however, be given on the adoption of the resolution to be protested against; and the protest, specifying the reasons for protesting, must be sent to the clerk, in writing, before the next ordinary meeting of the board, which protest shall be entered by the clerk on the minutes before they are confirmed.

19. Notices of motion may be dispensed with in cases of emergency, provided not more than two members be absent at such board meeting, and the motion, if any members are absent, be carried unanimously.

20. No person, other than a member, shall be allowed to speak or take part at any meeting of the board; and any person offending in this respect shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

### III. CONTRACTS.

21. All contracts shall be made by tender and advertised for as the board may direct. Tenders shall be addressed to the chairman, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the board, the respective amounts together with the names of the parties tendering to be entered on the minutes; and no member of the board shall take charge of any tender or deposit money. The successful tenderer shall be required to deposit immediately with the board a sum equal to five per cent. on the amount of his tender, and a further sum of five per cent. within one week as security for the performance of the works of the contract; which sum shall be returned to him upon the surveyor certifying the execution of work to the value of the amount.

22. No member, officer, or servant of the board shall be allowed to be security for any officer or servant connected with the board.

23. The payment of fines for the non-completion of the works of a contract within the time specified shall be strictly enforced unless the board shall waive the right in any particular case.

### IV. PAYMENT OF MONEYS.

24. All payments shall be made in accordance with the Act, at ordinary meetings of the board, and no accounts shall be paid unless they have been duly passed by the board; and no contractor shall receive any payment unless a certificate from the surveyor advising it be given.

### V. DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

25. The clerk of the board shall attend at the offices of the board on Wednesday and Friday in every week, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., as well as at all ordinary and other meetings of the board.

26. The collector shall collect all rates and taxes, and furnish monthly reports, showing all moneys that have come into his hands during the previous month.

27. The surveyor shall report monthly on the state of the roads in the district, and any works that may be in progress.

28. The treasurer shall furnish monthly reports to the board, stating all moneys that have come into his possession during the month.

### VI. APPOINTMENT OF OFFICERS.

29. No officer of the Board shall be appointed unless a notice in writing, stating the nature of the appointment to be made, shall have been sent by the clerk to every member of the board, at least seven days previous.

### VII. BREACH OF BYE-LAWS.

30. Any member, officer, or servant of the board guilty of any act of commission or omission against any of the foregoing bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered according to law.

### VIII. SUSPENSION OF BYE-LAWS.

31. Any of the foregoing bye-laws may be suspended *pro tem.* with the unanimous consent of the members present—the same being entered in the minute book.

### IX. APPROACHES TO LAND, ETC.

32. In forming or making any roads in the district, it shall be lawful for the board to make culverts or bridges over any side-drain at any gateway or entrance to the lands of any person owning or occupying property adjoining roads, and to charge such owner or occupier half the cost of such culvert or bridge; which amount shall be recovered in the same way as unpaid rates.

33. Any person cutting down trees on any road in the district without the authority of the board first had and obtained, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, to be recovered by any person in a summary way according to law.

A copy of these bye-laws shall be kept conspicuously posted in the offices of the board.

The foregoing bye-laws were confirmed by Special Order of the Board on the 28th day of May, 1867.
