BET ISLAND, TORRES STRAIT, AND NEWLY DISCOVERED DANGERS ON THE NORTH-EAST COAST OF AUSTRALIA.

THE following particulars, relating to Bet Island and newly discovered dangers on the North-east Coast of Australia, which have been extracted from the *Government Gazette* of New South Wales, are published for general information.

SIR,—In forwarding the enclosed particulars, relating to new dangers on the north-east coast of Australia, for the information of the colonial trade, I have to remark that the natives of Bet Island, in Torres Strait, complain that, in the autumn of last year, a ship fired at and killed several men, who were stripping the masts of a vessel wrecked some time before, a short distance from their village.

As I found these men to be well disposed when kindly treated, and as the inhabitants of the Darnley and Stephen's Islands in the neighborhood are now very friendly, I believe, if the masters of ships passing through the Great North-east Channel, whilst taking all due and necessary precaution to guard against treachery, were to show more forbearance towards the natives, and at the same time take every opportunity of establishing a good understanding with them, that there would be every chance of a wrecked crew being assisted; whereas if the practice of firing upon natives, who are found doing what any captain of a ship would do himself, had he time at his disposal, is continued, the natives must be expected to retaliate on any unarmed wrecked men forced to land on their shores.

NEWLY DISCOVERED DANGERS ON THE NORTH-EAST COAST OF AUSTRALIA.

Blue Bell Rocks—In Weymouth Bay, latitude 12 degrees 31 minutes south, and longitude 143 degrees 22 minutes 30 seconds east, are two detached rocks, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles west of the middle reef. The two patches together occupy a space of $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile north and south.

The north rock has 3 feet of water on it, and is easily seen from the mast-head, but the south patch, with 9 feet water, does not show distinctly.

There is deep water between the rocks and middle reef.

Pascoe River empties itself into Weymouth Bay, in latitude 12 degrees 29 minutes south; shallow sand-banks fill up the mouth; but 3 miles inland the water is fresh, with a depth of 2 fathoms. The natives in the neighborhood are not to be trusted.

Satellite Rock, in latitude 16 degrees 26 minutes 30 seconds south, and longitude 145 degrees 43 minutes east, is a sunken coral reef extending for $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile N.W. and S.E. It has several rocks with only 2 fathoms water on them; and from a wash of very lightly discolored water which appears to be constantly flowing over the reef, is not easily distinguished from the mast-head.

From the reef the low wooded island bears W.N.W. $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
Do. Round Hill bears S. 36 degrees W.

The *Beacon on D Reef* in Princess Charlotte Bay, latitude 14 degrees 7 minutes 30 seconds south, and longitude 144 degrees 2 minutes 40 seconds east, has been blown down during a heavy gale from the westward. The sand on all the neighboring reefs has shifted considerably, the banks being all lower than when seen at former times.

The *Wreck of the Conqueror* is in 9 fathoms water, in latitude 10 degrees 9 minutes S., longitude 142 degrees 45 minutes 30 seconds east.

From the wreck Bet Island bears E. $\frac{1}{4}$ N., $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles.
Do. South extreme of Saddle Island, W.S.W. $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles.

The *Sand-bank and Rocks* between Bet Island and Long Island extend half-a-mile farther to the eastward than is marked on the charts, and are very dangerous if ships are allowed to get too far to leeward with the S.E. trade.
