South Australia. Streaky Bay—Latitude 32° 35' East; longitude 134° East. Bearings magnetic.

In standing in towards the N.W. portion of the Bay, with Point Brown N.W. & W. and Olive Island S., a small patch of discolored water was seen a cable's length N. by E. of the schooner; night and thick weather coming on, prevented soundings being taken on the spot, but from the color of the water it is estimated not less than five (5) fathoms will be found to exist on this shoal; the sea neither topped nor broke.

The *Flinders* had seventeen (17) fathoms when she tacked to avoid the patch.

The line of soundings taken in my survey of 1858, passes inside the position of the shoal.
