Twenty-five out of the thirty-three deaths registered in Collingwood were of children under three years of age. In South Melbourne the proportion that obtained was twenty out of thirty-five, and in North Melbourne twenty-four out of thirty-two. In Richmond fourteen out of twenty-one, and in Emerald Hill eleven out of fifteen were of the same tender age. Diarrhoea both among adults and children is on the increase.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, at the respective places and times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—
