WARDS OF THE BOROUGH OF BALLARAT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of July, 1867.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of councillors for any original or proclaimed borough (hereinafter sometimes called in common "single borough") the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in such borough, within three months after the receipt of the same divide the borough into three separate wards by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of such wards shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made upon or within thirty days before any day appointed for holding any annual election of councillors in or for such borough: And whereas the Governor has received a petition signed by not less than one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the borough of Ballarat, praying that the said borough may be divided into wards: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by this present Order divide the said borough of Ballarat into three separate wards, by the names hereby assigned to the same respectively and with the several boundaries hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

NORTH WARD.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the Borough of Ballarat, being a point bearing east 50 links from the north-east angle of allotment 25, section U, Soldier's Hill, parish of Ballarat; thence by the northern boundary of the borough, bearing west 188 chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of the Botanical Garden reserve; thence by a line bearing south 8136 links, more or less, to the centre of Sturt street; thence by the centre of said street, bearing S. 70° 30' E. 2636 links, more or less, and east 6329 links, more or less, to the centre of Pleasant street; thence by the centre of Pleasant street, bearing north 1225 links to the centre of Mair street; thence by the centre of Mair street, bearing east 9456 links to the centre of Grenville street; thence northerly by the western boundary of the Borough of Ballarat East to the centre of Havelock street; thence by the centre of that street, bearing north 5830 links, more or less, to the commencing point.

CENTRAL WARD.—Commencing at its north-west angle, being a point caused by the intersection of the centres of Mair and Pleasant streets; thence by the centre of Pleasant street, bearing south 2450 links to the centre of Dana street; thence by a line bearing east 16,056 links, more or less, to the Borough boundary of Ballarat East; thence by the said boundary, bearing northerly to the centre of Grenville street; thence by the centre of Grenville street, bearing west 330 links and north 1875 links, more or less, to its intersection with the centre of Mair street; thence by the centre of Mair street, bearing west 9456 links to the commencing point.

SOUTH WARD.—Commencing at its north-west angle, being a point bearing north 153 links from the north-east angle of allotment 6, section 11, parish of Cardigan; thence by the western boundary of said parish, bearing south 9100 links to the south-

east angle of allotment 12, section 12, of said parish; thence by the northern boundary of allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4, section 3 of said parish, bearing east 81 chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of allotment 4, section 3; thence by the eastern boundary of the said allotment, bearing south 4317 links to the centre of Rubicon street; thence by the centre of said street, being the northern boundary of the Borough of Sebastopol, bearing east 9366 links to the River Yarrowee; thence by the said river to its intersection with the centre of Dana street; thence by the centre of Dana street, bearing west 10,956 links, more or less, to the centre of Pleasant street; thence by the centre of Pleasant street, bearing north 1225 links to the centre of Sturt street; thence by the centre of Sturt street, bearing west 6329 links, more or less, and N. 70° 30' W. 2636 links to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the common firstly hereinafter mentioned, and in lieu thereof do proclaim the common secondly hereinafter described, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

WEDDERBURNE UNITED TOWN AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON. described in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-first day of November, 1864, is hereby abolished.—(67-P.6521.)

WEDDERBURNE GOLD-FIELD COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown Lands comprising an area of 15,230 acres, more or less, within the boundaries hereinafter described, shall be and constitute the Wedderburne Gold-field Common, viz.:—Commencing at the south-west angle of the Torpichen pre-emptive section, the said angle being a point on Korong Creek; thence by the west boundary of that section and a line bearing north two hundred and eleven chains fifty links, more or less, to the north boundary of the parish of Wedderburne; thence by that boundary, bearing west three hundred and two chains, more or less; thence by the west boundary of that parish, bearing south four hundred chains, more or less; thence by the south boundary thereof, bearing east four hundred and eighty chains, more or less, to the west boundary of the parish of Korong; thence by that boundary, bearing north two hundred

and thirty-two chains, more or less, to the aforesaid creek; and thence by that creek, bearing westerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.P.6821.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and in the thirtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

The deaths in May were fewer than in any month since last September. Their number was considerably below the average for May during eight years. The mean temperature in May was about equal to the average of the same period.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the total mortality. Children who had not reached their fifth year contributed 48 per cent. to that total. In May, 1866, children under 5 contributed 47 per cent. to the mortality; in May, 1865, 56 per cent.; in May, 1864, 58 per cent.; in May, 1863, 52 per cent.; in May, 1862, 54 per cent.; in May, 1861, 53 per cent.; and in May, 1860, 56 per cent.

The largest number of deaths on any one day was 13, and occurred on four different occasions; the smallest number was 5, and occurred twice.

The oldest male who died during the month was aged 78; the cause of death, rupture of a blood-vessel. The oldest female who died was aged 77, and the cause of death natural decay. No other persons over 75 died during the month.

The following violent deaths were reported:—That of an infant of five months old, who died from the effects of a fall from the nurse's arms; of a merchant aged 48 years, who died of compound fracture of the leg; of a boy aged 7 years, who was accidentally shot; of an infant aged 48 weeks, who died of a scald; of a joiner aged 54 years, who was accidentally drowned through falling off one of the piers at Williamstown; of an infant aged 12 weeks, who was suffocated in bed; and of a newly-born infant, who was wilfully strangled.

Fifty-two deaths, or 19 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz., 39 in the Melbourne Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 1 in the Immigrants' Home, 3 in Yarra Bend Asylum, 3 in the Carlton Asylum, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 132, of which 70, or about 53 per cent., were of males, and 62, or nearly 47 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 62 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two years, 15 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 14 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 141, of which 77, or nearly 55 per cent., were males, and 64, or about 45 per cent., were females; 23 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 1 was between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 10 were between twenty-five and thirty, 19 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 14 were between forty and forty-five, 9 were between forty-five and fifty, 15 were between fifty and fifty-five, 4 were between fifty-five and sixty, 3 were between sixty and sixty-five, 3 were between sixty-five and seventy, 1 was between seventy and seventy-five, and 2 were between seventy-five and eighty.

Notwithstanding the general diminution in the mortality, deaths from scarlatina and diphtheria still continue numerous. The former occasioned 27 and the latter 12 deaths in May, against 26 and 22 deaths in the previous month. The mortality from phthisis greatly decreased. Only 25 deaths were set down to that complaint in May against 41 deaths in April.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF BUNDALAGUAH FARMERS' COMMON, 1867.

ANY person holding or occupying purchased or leased land within the parish of Bundalaguah will be entitled to its advantages.

2. That each person entitled to commonage shall be permitted to graze stock according to the following scale, viz. :—

100 acres and under	1 head to every	4 acres.
200	"	5 "
300	"	6 "
400	"	10 "
600	"	14 "
1000	"	20 "
3000	"	100 "
over 3000	"	150 "

3. That all stock sent to said common shall have the Bundalaguah Farmers' Common brand on them.

4. The managers reserve to themselves the power of adopting any plan they may think best, from time to time, for the mustering of horses and cattle on said common, and the owner of horses and cattle is bound to assist in branding them with the common brand or pay a fine of one shilling per head.

5. All fees must be paid quarterly, in advance, on the first day of January, first day of April, first day of July, and the first day of October in each year, and no cattle will be considered as registered unless such fees are paid at the time of entering the brand of such cattle by the herdsman.

6. The herdsman will attend at the branding-yards during the number of days advertised from time to time in each quarter, to register and brand cattle, but after that a fee of sixpence per head will be charged for all horses or cattle which the herdsman shall receive and brand.

7. The fees for all cattle over twelve months old (horses excepted) will be eight shillings per head per annum; six months old and under twelve months, six shillings per head; and for horses, twelve shillings per head per annum; all cattle and horses under six months old free.

8. That in no case will a bull or entire horse be permitted on the common without the written consent of the managers.

9. The herdsman will have the authority of the managers to impound all sheep or cattle found trespassing on said common, an entry of which he shall make in a book kept for that purpose so that damages and fees arising from the same may be properly accounted for.

10. The managers reserve the right to cause all cattle suspected of disease to be removed from the common, or to such part of the common as they may direct, and in the event of any animal or animals dying upon the common, the owner or owners shall, within six hours after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman so to do, completely destroy or cause to be destroyed by fire the carcass or carcasses of such animal or animals, the managers may have the same destroyed at expense of owner, the cost recoverable as a common debt.

11. All diseased cattle found trespassing will be immediately destroyed by order of the managers, at the expense of the owner, if known, the cost recoverable as a common debt; if not known, the managers may cause the same to be destroyed, the cost to be out of the funds of the common.

12. No person shall be allowed to remove cattle from the common without having previously given due notice to the herdsman.

13. It will be the herdsman's duty to see all the cattle under his charge once every 48 hours. Should any be missing during that time, he is to inform or give notice to the owners thereof the day following, and make an entry in his book to that effect; failing to do so will subject him in each case to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings, and one shilling per day for each beast until it is found.

14. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's salary, and other expenses connected with the management of the common, an additional charge will be made upon each commoner in fair proportion to the number of stock depastured by him, and each commoner will be under the condition that he can be sued for the same and the amount recoverable as a common debt.

15. The herdsman will be accountable to the commoners for any loss sustained by having their cattle impounded if strayed off the common, the amount in each case not to exceed the impounding expenses; and the herdsman shall receive as an equivalent sixpence per head from the managers for all cattle found trespassing on the said common and impounded by the herdsman or managers.

16. That no sheep shall depasture on the common. If at any time the shire council consider it advisable to alter this rule, it can be done on the recommendation of the managers of the common.

17. No pigs allowed on the common. Managers to have power to prosecute owners of pigs trespassing on common, or for any damage sustained by them.

18. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or neglectful of duties, they can remove him or displace him without a written notice, and he can have no claim upon them for compensation whatever.

19. The managers do not hold themselves responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman.

20. The managers reserve to themselves the power to allow more stock on the common, or withdraw them in fair proportion from each commoner, as they may think necessary.
