#### BOROUGH OF FITZ ROY.

BYE-LAW No. 26.—TO REPEAL BYE-LAW No. 1, AND MAKE PROVISION FOR REGULATING THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF FITZ ROY, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS.

WHEREAS under the provisions of an Act, intituled *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, passed by the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, and numbered fifteen, the Municipal Council of Fitz Roy did adopt a "Bye-law No. 1," to regulate, by means of rules and orders, the proceedings of the Municipal Council of Fitz Roy, which bye-law was published in the *Government Gazette* of 29th December, 1853: And whereas it has now become desirable to pass another bye-law in lieu thereof: Be it therefore enacted by the Borough Council of Fitz Roy, under the provisions of *The Municipal Corporations Act 1863*, that on publication of this bye-law in the *Government Gazette*, and of its coming into operation on such publication, the said bye-law No. 1 shall be repealed, and the proceedings of the said borough council shall be regulated according to the following standing orders.

#### GENERAL CONDUCT OF BUSINESS.

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the council.
2. At every ordinary meeting of the council the first business shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of proceedings at the preceding meeting or meetings, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of such proceedings; and the said minutes, on such question being carried in the affirmative, shall thereupon be signed by the mayor or chairman.
3. After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid the order of business at an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as practicable:—
4. Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the council.
5. Reading letters received and ordering the same to be received, or to be referred to some committee for consideration.
6. Reading of petitions and memorials.
7. Submitting and considering written reports of committees.
8. Considering orders of the day.
9. Considering motions of which notice has been given.
10. Reading notices of motions to be considered at the next meeting of the council.
11. Reading rough minutes of the council meeting.
12. All communications with the council shall be either in form of petition, memorial, or letter; and no motion, excepting that for receiving or referring such petition, or memorial, or letter to some committee, shall be made, unless the subject thereof be embraced in some committee's report to be submitted at that meeting, when it shall be competent for any councillor to move that the council do order such petition, memorial, or letter to be taken into consideration with such report.
13. Notice-papers stating the business to be transacted at the next meeting of the council, as far as it is practicable to do so, shall be printed and issued to every member of the council before noon of the day preceding that on which the meeting of council is held.
14. No call of the council shall be made unless by the consent of six members of the council. The resolution ordering such call shall also state the question to be considered immediately thereafter. Each member of the council shall be required to attend at such call, and answer to his name, and vote upon the question for which the call has been made. Every councillor must attend in compliance with an order for the call of the council, or forward a reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority of the council.

## MOTIONS.

7. All notices of motion shall be in writing, be dated, and when more than one, numbered, in arithmetical order, and signed by the intending mover; and after having at the time appointed been read aloud by him, or some other councillor on his behalf, he handed to the town clerk, who shall enter the same in the "Notice of Motion Book" in the order in which they were received, in which order they shall be considered by the council at the following meeting, and if not then moved or postponed shall be struck out as having lapsed.

8. No motion shall be made initiating a subject for discussion, nor shall any subject be referred to, or discussion permitted thereon, save in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last clause (No. 7); and no motion, the effect of which would be to rescind any previous resolution of the council, shall be entertained, unless a call of the whole council has been duly ordered for that purpose.

9. No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn or altered without permission of the council and of the seconder.

10. No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the councillor who gave notice thereof, unless some other councillor produce and hand to the mayor or chairman a written authority from him to that effect.

11. A motion may be superseded by an amendment being carried to the effect that the council proceed to the next business, which if carried shall have that effect.

12. A motion may be amended, by 1st leaving out certain words in order to insert or add other words, or 2nd by inserting or adding other words, and every such amendment shall be confined to the subject matter of the motion under consideration.

13. If an amendment be carried, except it be for postponing the question or for adjourning the council, it shall itself become the motion, whereon any further amendment on such motion, or any part of it, may be moved without limitation to the number thereof.

14. One amendment only shall be submitted for discussion at a time, and no further amendment shall be considered until the prior one is disposed of by vote or withdrawal.

15. All motions or amendments shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and delivered to the mayor or chairman after being moved and seconded.

16. No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote unless it be seconded.

17. A councillor moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a councillor merely seconding a motion without comment shall not be held to have spoken thereon, and may speak thereto at any time prior to the mover replying, whereon the debate shall close and the question put to the vote forthwith.

18. No councillor shall speak a second time on the same question unless entitled to reply, or in explanation when he has been misrepresented, or misunderstood, but any councillor may speak once upon, but not move an amendment though he have spoken to the motion.

## VOTING.

19. The council shall vote by show of hands, and every councillor present shall vote.

20. The mayor or chairman shall take the vote of the council by putting the amendment, when there is one submitted, first in the affirmative and then in the negative. If the amendment is carried the original motion shall not be put, but if the amendment is lost, and no other proposed, the original motion shall be put first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

21. Any councillor may require the votes given by each councillor to be recorded on the minutes of the council, by calling for a division, when the votes given for the amendment, whether it be carried or lost, or when there is no amendment on the motion, shall be taken down by the town clerk, who shall read aloud the names of the councillors voting for and against, and record the division on the minutes of the council.

## ORDER OF DEBATE.

22. Any councillor may require the enforcement of any one or more of these standing orders of the council by directing the mayor or chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

23. The councillors, in meeting of council, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of mayor, chairman, councillor, as the case may be.

24. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the mayor or chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.

25. The mayor or chairman shall rise in addressing the council to discuss any question, and shall not leave the chair on such occasions.

26. Any councillor desirous of submitting a motion or amendment, or of taking part in a discussion thereon, shall rise and address the mayor or chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the councillor calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the councillor in possession of the chair may proceed with the subject.

27. The mayor or chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice shall forthwith rule thereon, and his decision as to the point of order or explanation shall in each case be final.

28. No councillor shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, nor comment upon the words used by any councillor in a previous debate, nor designedly use or apply to all or any of the other members of the council any offensive or insulting language or gesture, nor impute any improper motives to, nor make any personal reflection on all or any member of the council, and every councillor shall immediately withdraw and apologise for such words or conduct after being called upon by the mayor or chairman to do so.

29. No councillor shall use any offensive or disorderly language, and after having been twice called to order by the mayor or chairman, or being required by either of them to withdraw such language, and to make satisfactory apology to the council, he shall immediately do so.

30. Any person, not being a councillor, who shall have been admitted to any meeting of the council, and behave thereat in an improper or disorderly manner, shall leave the hall when requested by the mayor or chairman to do so, and if he do not do so immediately such mayor or chairman may cause him to be removed.

31. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but on the question being put, if the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be made, but if carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

32. Any councillor may enter his protest against any resolution of the council. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered twenty-four hours at least before the next ordinary meeting of the council, by the protesting member or members, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the town clerk's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the council, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes; but such protest may be expunged, if declared by a majority of the council not to be in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the council.

## LAPSED QUESTIONS.

33. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the council being counted out, such debate shall be resumed at next meeting at the point where it was so interrupted.

## COMMITTEES.

34. There shall be, at least, five permanent committees, the members whereof shall be elected by ballot during the month of August in each year, and shall hold office until their successors are appointed, viz.:-

1. Public works and lighting committee.
2. Finance and rates committee.
3. Health and legislative committee.
4. Market and licensing committee.

Which shall consist of four members each, three to form a quorum.

5. Select committee, which shall consist of all the members of the council, five to form a quorum.

35. The mayor shall be *ex officio* member of all committees.

36. The council may appoint other temporary committees, and fix the quorum thereof.

37. Every committee, at the first meeting after their appointment, shall elect one of their members to be chairman for the municipal year, and in his absence shall elect a chairman for the time being.

38. If there shall not be a quorum of members present within one quarter of an hour after the hour of meeting stated in the circular convening such meeting, such committee meeting shall be considered as having lapsed.

39. All members of committees shall sign the attendance-book kept for that purpose, as evidence of their having attended such meeting; and any councillor absent from four consecutive ordinary meetings of such committee, without leave obtained from that committee, shall cease to be a member of such committee.

40. All questions shall be decided by a majority of votes, and whenever the votes are equal, the chairman shall have the casting vote.

41. The council shall, if they think fit, on the requisition of any member, discharge him from serving on any committee, and substitute another member in his place, and shall fill up all vacancies in committees.

42. The minutes of all proceedings of committees, numbered in consecutive order, shall be entered in the committee's minute-book, and signed by the chairman.

43. The Finance and Rate Committee shall be at liberty, at their own discretion, to authorize disbursements for current expenses to an amount not exceeding Ten pounds in any one week.

44. The town clerk shall convene every committee within ten days of its appointment, and at any other time after by order of the council, or on the written order of the chairman, or on that of any two members of such committee; and of all committee meetings the town clerk shall give each member at least twenty-four hours' notice.

## PETITIONS.

45. No petition shall be presented after the council shall have proceeded to the consideration of reports of committees.

46. It shall be incumbent on every member presenting a petition to acquaint himself of the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the council, or that the contents do not violate any of the standing orders of the same.

47. Every petition must be in writing, and not printed or lithographed.

48. Every member presenting a petition to the council shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.

49. Every petition receivable shall be presented to the mayor or chairman, who shall not allow any debate upon its presentation, or any member to speak upon or in relation to such petition.

## ELECTIONS.

50. No election to any office at the disposal of the council for which the council intends to invite applications or tenders shall

take place, until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the borough inviting applications for such office.

51. The salary or allowances attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the council shall in all cases except when tendered for be fixed before such advertisement appears.

52. All elections herein referred to shall be by voting cards, on which each councillor shall write the name of one candidate, and shall sign his name thereto.

53. No officer or employee of the council shall take any active part on behalf of any candidate at any election for councillors beyond simply recording his vote.

#### SURETIES.

54. No councillor or officer of the council, and no assessor or auditor of the borough shall be received as a surety for any officer of the borough council, or for any work to be done for such council.

#### COMMON SEAL.

55. The town clerk shall have the custody of the common seal of the borough council, and shall verify each impression thereof with his signature.

56. The town clerk shall affix the common seal to contracts, bonds, and licenses requiring the same, and to all bye-laws and addresses passed by the council, and to such records of the council as require such verification, and to powers-of-attorney and other legal instruments not relating to the council; but he shall not fix the seal to any other document without the authority of the council.

#### SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS.

57. Any one or more of the preceding standing orders may, in case of emergency, be suspended for a special purpose, with consent of six members of the council.

#### PENALTY.

58. If any person be guilty of any offence contrary to any provision contained in this bye-law, he shall, on conviction before two or more justices, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, or such part thereof as such justices before whom such penalty is sought to be recovered shall think fit to order.
