TREATY WITH THE UNITED STATES OF COLUMBIA.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Despatch and Treaty to be published for general information.

SIE,-I have the honor to transmit to you the Copy of a Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation which was concluded on the 16th of February last between Her Majesty and the United States of Columbia, the Ratifications of which were exchanged in London on the 17th instant.

TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN HER MAJESTY AND THE UNITED STATES OF COLOMBIA. Signed at London, 16th February, 1866.

[Ratifications exchanged at London, 17th October, 1866.]

HER'Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the United States of Columbia, being desirous to maintain and improve the relations of good understanding which happily subsist between them, and to promote the commercial intercourse between their respective subjects and citizens, have deemed it expedient to conclude a Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation, and have for that purpose named as their respective Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honourable George William Frederick, Earl of Clarendon, Baron Hyde of Hindon, a Peer of the United Kingdom, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Knight for the Most Noble Order of the Bath, Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State-for Foreign Affairs; and the Right Honourable Thomas Milner Gibson, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, a Member of Parliament, President of the Committee of Privy Council for Affairs of Trade and Foreign Plantations:

And the Citizen President of the United States of Columbia, Thomas Cipriano de Mosquera, Grand General of the Union, General-in-Chief in the Columbian Guard, a Senator, a Member of the Order of the Liberators of Cundinamarca, of those of the South of Columbia, of those of Peru, decorated with the Medal of Tescua, with that of Barbacons, and with the Cross of Cuaspud, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to Her Britannie Majesty:

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

There shall be a perfect, firm, and inviolable peace and sincere friendship between Her Britannic Majesty and the United States of Columbia, throughout the whole extent of their possessions and territories, and between their subjects and citizons, respectively, without distinction of person or place.

ARTICLE II.

There shall be between all the domnions and possessions of the two high contracting parties, reciprocal freedom of commerce and navigation. The subjects and citizens of each of the two contracting parties, respectively, shall have liberty freely and securely to come, with their, ships and cargoos, to all places, ports, and rivers in the dominions and possessions of the other, to which other foreign subjects or citizens are or may be permitted to come, upon the same terms and under the same conditions as those of the most favoured nations; and shall, throughout the whole extent of the dominions and possessions of the other, enjoy the same rights, privileges, liberties, favours, immunities and exemptions, in matters of commerce and navigation, which are or may be enjoyed by native subjects or citizens generally.

ARTICLE III.

No other or higher-duties shall be imposed on the importation into the dominions and possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, of any article the produce or manufacture of the dominions and possessions of the United States of Columbia, from whatever place arriving, and no other or higher duties shall be imposed on the importation into the dominions and possessions of the United States of Columbia, of any article the produce or manufacture of Her Britannic Majesty's dominions and possessions, from whatever place arriving, than are or may be payable on the like article, the produce or manufacture of any other foreign country; nor shall any prohibition be maintained orimposed on the importation of any article the produce or manufacture of the dominions and possessions of either of the contracting parties into the dominions and possessions of the other, which shall not equally extend to the importation of the like articles being the produce or manufacture of any other country.

- --- ARTICLE IV.

No other or higher duties or charges shall be imposed in the dominions and possessions of either of the contracting parties, on the exportation of any article to the dominions and possessions of the other, than such as are, or may be, payable on the exportation of the like article to any other foreign country; nor shall any prohibition be imposed on the exportation of any article from the dominions and possessions of either of the two contracting parties to the dominions and possessions of the other, which shall not equally extend to the exportation of the like article to any other country.

ARTICULO IV.

ARTICLE V.

The subjects or citizens of one of the contracting parties shall enjoy, in the dominions and possessions of the other, equality of treatment with native subjects or citizens in all that relates to the transit trade; and also in regard to warehousing, bounties, facilities, and drawbacks.

ARTICLE VI.

ARTICLE VI.

All articles which are or may be legally importable into the ports of the dominions and possessions of Her Britannie Majesty in British vessels, may likewise be imported into those ports in Columbian vessels, without being liable to any other or higher duties or charges, of whatever denomination, than if such articles were imported in British vessels; and reciprocally, all articles which are or may be legally importable into the ports of the dominions and possessions of the United States of Columbia in Columbian vessels, may likewise be imported into those ports in British vessels, without being liable to any other or higher duties or charges, of whatever denomination, than if such articles were imported in Columbian vessels. Such reciprocal equality of treatment shall take effect without distinction, whether such articles come directly from the place of origin, or from any other place.

In the same manner there shall be perfect equality of treatment in regard to exportation, so that the same export duties shall be paid, and the same bounties and drawbacks allowed, in the dominions and possessions of either of the contracting parties, on the exportation of any article which is or may be legally exportable therefrom, whether such exportation shall take place in British or in Columbian vessels, and whatever may be the place of destination, whether a port of either of the contracting parties or of any third power.

ARTICLE VII.

ARTICLE VII.

No duties of tonnage, harbour, pilotage, lighthouse, quarantine, or other similar or corresponding duties, of whatever nature, or under whatever denomination, levied in the name or for the profit of government, public functionaries, private individuals, corporations, or establishments of any kind, shall be imposed in the ports of the dominions and possessions of either country upon the vessels of the other country, which shall not equally and under the same conditions be imposed; in the like cases, on national vessels in general. Such equality of treatment shall apply reciprocally to the respective vessels, from whatever port or place they may arrive, and whatever may be their place of destination.

ARTICLE VIII.

In all that regards the stationing, loading, and unloading of vessels in the ports, basius, docks, roadsteads, harbours, or rivers of the dominions and possessions of the two countries, no privilege shall be granted to national vessels which shall not be equally granted to vessels of the other country; the intention of the contracting parties being that in this respect also the respective vessels shall be treated on the footing of perfect conditive.

ARTICLE IX.

The stipulations of the preceding Articles shall not apply to the coasting trade, which remains subject to the particular legislation of each of the high contracting parties.

The vessels of each of the two contracting parties shall, however, be at liberty, if the captain, proprietor, or other person duly authorized to act as agent for the vessel or cargo shall consider advisable, to proceed from one port of one of the two countries to one or more ports of the same country, in order to discharge the whole or part of their cargo brought from abroad, or in order to take in or complete their cargo, without paying other duties than those which are, or may be, paid by national vessels in similar cases. vessels in similar cases.

ARTICLE X.

All vessels which according to British law are to be deemed British vessels, and all vessels which according to Columbian law are to be deemed Columbian vessels, shall, for the purposes of this Treaty, be deemed British and Columbian vessels respectively.

ARTICLE XI.

ARTICLE XI.

Any import duty levied ad valorem in the territories of either of the two high contracting parties, shall be calculated on the value at the place of production or fabrication of the object imported, with the addition of the cost of transport, insurance, and commission necessary for the importation into the country to which it is carried, its dominions and possessions, as far as the port of discharge.

For the levying of these duties, the importer shall make a written declaration at the custom-house, stating the value and description of the goods imported, with the addition aforesaid. If the custom-house authorities shall be of opinion that the declared value is insufficient, they shall be at liberty to take the goods on paying to the importer the price declared, with an addition of five per cent.

This payment, together with the restitution of any duty which may have been levied upon such goods, shall be made within the fifteen days following the declaration.

ARTICLE XII.

The subjects or citizens of each of the contracting parties shall have, in the dominions and possessions of the other, the same rights as native subjects or citizens in regard to trademarks and designs of every description applicable to articles of

Esta igualdad reciproca de tratamiento tendrá efecto sin distincion alguna, ya en caso que tal artículo venga directamente del lugar de su orijen, ya que venga de cualquiera otro lugar.

De la misma manera habrá perfecta igualdad de tratamiento con respecto á la exportacion, de suerte que se pagarán los mismos derechos de exportacion, y se concederán los mismos premios y descuentos, en los dominios y posesiones de cualquiera de las partes contratantes, sobre la exportacion de cualquiera ratículo que sea ó que pueda ser legalmente exportado de ellos, ya sea en buques Britanicos, ya sea en buques Colombianos, y cualquiora que soa el lugar de su destino, bien sea un puerto de una de las partes contratantes, bien sea un puerto de una nacion tercera.

ARTICULO VIII.

No se concederá privilejio alguno á los buques nacionales, con respecto á estaciones, carga y descarga, en los puertos, bahías, diques, radas, ensenadas ó rios, delos dominios y posesiones de los dos países, que no se conceda igualmente á los buques del otro; siendo la intencion de las partes contratantes que en este particular los buques respectivos sean tambien tratados bajo el pie de perfecta igualdad.

ARTICULO IX.

ARTICULO X.

ARTICULO XI.

ARTICULO XI.

Cualquiera derecho de importacion impuesto ad valorem, en el territorio de cualquiera de las dos altas partes contratantes, se caiculará sobre el valor del objeto importado, en el lugar de la produccion ó fábrica, con el costo adicional de transporte, aseguro y comision que sea necesario para la importacion en el pais adonde se lleva, sus dominios y posesiones, y hasta el puerto donde se haga el descargo.

Para exijir estos derechos, el importador hará una declaracion escrita en la aduana, en que conste el valor y la descripcion de los artículos importados, con la adicion de que se habla arriba. Si las autoridades de la aduana oreyeron que el valor declarado es insuficiente, podrán tomar los artículos, pagando al importador el precio declarado, con una adicion de un cinco por ciento.

Este pago, junto con cualquiera restitucion de derechos que se hayan exijido sobre tales artículos, se hará dentro de quince dias despues de la declaracion.

ARTICULO XII.

Los súbditos ó ciudadanos de una de las partes confratantes tendrán, en los dominios y posesiones de la otra, los mismos derechos, con respecto á marcas de comercio y diseños, de cualquiera descripcion, que sean aplicablesá artículos de manufactura, que los que tionen los súbditos ó ciudadanos nacionales.

ARTICLE XIII.

ARTICLE XIII.

The diplomatic agents and consuls of each of the two high contracting parties in the dominions or territories of the other shall enjoy whatever privileges, exemptions, and immunities are or shall be granted there to agents of the same rank, belonging to the most favoured nation.

It shall be free for each of the contracting parties to appoint consuls-general, consuls, vice-consuls, and consular agents, to reside in the towns and ports of the dominions and possessions of the other. Such consuls-general, consuls, vice-consuls, and consular agents, however, shall not enter upon their functions until after they shall have been approved and admitted, in the usual form, by the government to which they are sent. They shall exercise whatever functions, and enjoy whatever privileges, exemptions, and immunities are or shall be granted there to consuls of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE XIV.

The subjects and citizens of each of the contracting parties, conforming themselves to the laws of the country,—

1. Shall have full liberty, with their families, to enter, travel, or reside in any part of the dominions and possessions of the other contracting party.

2. They shall be permitted to hire or possess the houses, manufactories, warehouses, shops, and premises which may be necessary for them.

3. They may carry on their commerce, by wholesale or by retail, and either in person or by any agents whom they may think fit to employ.

4. They shall not be subject, in respect of their persons or property, or in respect of passports, licenses for residence or establishment, nor in respect of their commerce or industry, to any taxes, whether general or local, nor to imposts or obligations of any kind whatever, other or greater than those which are or may be imposed upon native subjects or citizens.

ARTICLE XV.

The subjects or citizens of the two high contracting parties residing in the territories of the other, shall enjoy the most perfect and entire liberty of conscience, without being molested or disturbed on account of their religious belief. Neither shall they be molested or disturbed in the proper exercise of their religion, in private houses, or in the churches, chapels, or places destined for worship, provided that in so doing they observe the decorum due to divine worship, and the respect due to the laws of the country. Liberty shall also be granted to bury the subjects or citizens of the two high contracting parties who may die in the territories of the other, in convenient and adequate places, to be appointed and established by the said resident subjects or citizens for that purpose, with the knowledge of the local authorities, or in such other places of sepulture as may be chosen by the friends of the deceased; and the funerals or sepulchres of the dead shall not be disturbed in any wise or upon any account. upon any account.

ARTICLE XVI.

ARTICLE XVI.

The subjects and citizens of each of the contracting parties in the dominions and possessions of the other shall be exempted from all compulsory military service whatever, whether in the army, navy, or national guard or militia. They shall be equally exempted from all judicial and municipal functions whatever, as well as from all contributions, whether pecuniary or in kind, imposed as a compensation for personal service; and, finally, from forced loans and military exactions or requisitions.

ARTICLE XVII.

ARTICLE XVII.

The subjects and citizens of each of the contracting parties in the dominions and possessions of the other, shall be at full liberty to acquire, possess, and dispose of every description of property which the laws of the country may permit any foreigners, of whatsoever nation, to acquire and possess. They may acquire and dispose of the same, whether by purchase, sale, donation, exchange, marriage, testament, succession ab intestato, or in any other manner, under the same conditions as are established by the laws of the country for all foreigners. Their heirs and representatives may succeed to and take possession of such property, either in person or by agents acting on their behalf, in the same manner, and in the same legal forms as subjects or citizens of the country. In the absence of heirs and representatives the property shall be treated in the same manner as the like property belonging to a subject or citizen of the country under similar circumstances.

In none of these respects shall they pay upon the value of such property any other or higher impost, duty, or charge than is payable by subjects or citizens of the country. In every case the subjects or citizens of the country. In every case the subjects or citizens of the contracting parties shall be permitted to export their property, or the proceeds thereof, if sold, freely, and without being subjected on such exportation to pay any duty as foreigners, or any other or higher duties than those to which subjects or citizens of the country are liable under similar circumstances.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The dwellings, manufactories, warehouses, and shops of the subjects or citizens of each of the contracting parties in the dominions and possessions of the other, and all premises appertaining thereto, destined for purposes of residence or commerce, shall be respected. If there should be occasion to make a search of, or a domiciliary visit to, such dwellings and premises, or to examine or inspect books, papers, or accounts, such measure shall be executed only in conformity with the legal warrant or order in writing of a tribunal, or of the competent authority.

The subjects or citizens of each of the two contracting parties in the dominions and possessions of the other, shall have free

ARTICULO XIII.

For the better security of commerce between the subjects and citizens of the two high contracting parties, it is agreed that if at any time any rupture, or any interruption of friendly intercourse, should unfortunately take place between the two contracting parties, the subjects or citizens of either of them, established in the territories of the other, who may reside upon the coasts, shall be allowed six months, and those who may reside in the interior a whole year, to wind up their accounts and to dispose of their property; and a safe conduct shall be given to them to embark at the port which they themselves shall select. The subjects or citizens of either of the two contracting parties who may be established in the dominions or territories of the other, in the exercise of any trade or other occupation or employment, shall be allowed to remain and continue in the exercise of the said trade or occupation, notwith-standing the interruption of friendship between the two countries, in the free enjoyment of their personal liberty and property, so long as they behave peaceably and observe the laws; and their goods and effects, of whatever description they may be, whether in their own custody, or entrusted to individuals or to the State, shall not be liable to seizure or sequestration, or to any other charges or demands than those which may be made upon the like effects or property belonging to native subjects or citizens. In the same case, or in case of domestic troubles, debts between individuals, public funds, and the shares of companies, shall never be confiscated, sequestered, or detained.

ARTICLE XX.

ARTICLE XX.

Any ship of war or merchant-vessel of either of the contracting parties which may be compelled by stress of weather, or by accident, to take shelter in a port of the other, shall be at liberty to refit therein, to procure all necessary stores, and to put to sea again, without paying any dues other than such as would be payable in a similar case by a national vessel. In case, however, the master of a merchant-vessel should be under the necessity of disposing of a part of his merchandize in order to defray his expenses, he shall be bound to conform to the regulations and tariffs of the place to which he may have come.

If any ship of war or merchant-vessel of one of the contracting parties should run aground or be wrecked upon the coasts of the other, such ship or vessel, and all parts thereof, and all furniture and appurtenances belonging thereunto, and all goods and merchandize saved therefrom, including any which may have been cast into the sea, or the proceeds thereof if sold, as well as all papers found on board such stranded or wrecked ship or vessel, shall be given up to the owners or their agents when claimed by them. If there are no such owners or agents on the spot, then the same shall be delivered to the British or Columbian consul-general, consul, or vice-consul, in whose district the wreck or stranding may have taken place, upon being claimed by him within the period fixed by the laws of the country; and such consuls, owners, or agonts, shall pay only the expenses incurred in the preservation of the property, together with the salvage or other expenses which would have been payable in the like case of a wreck of a national vessel.

The goods and merchandize saved from the wreck shall be exempt from all duties of customs, unless cleared for consumption, in which case they shall pay the same rate of duty as if they had been imported in a national vessel.

In the case either of a vessel being driven in by stress of weather, run

The consuls-general, consuls, vice-consuls, and consular Agents of each of the contracting parties, residing in the dominions and possessions of the other, shall receive from the local authorities such assistance as can by law be given to them for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective

ARTICLE XXII.

ARTICLE XXII.

The present Treaty of Commerce and Navigation, when ratified, shall, as far as regards the United States of Columbia, be substituted for the treaty between His Britannic Majesty and the State of Columbia, signed at Bogotá, on the 18th of April, 1825, and shall remain in force for ten years from the date of the exchange of the ratifications, and further until the expiration of twelvo months after either of the contracting parties shall have given notice to the other of its intention to terminate the same; each of the contracting parties being at liberty to give such notice to the other at the expiration of the first nino years, or at any time afterwards.

ARTICLE XXIII.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London in twelve months, or sooner if possible. In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto their respective seals. Done at London, the sixteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

BYE-LAW No. 1.—TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BUNGAREE ROAD DISTRICT BOARD AND OFFICE BEARERS.

THE business of this board at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it shall become necessary to exclude strangers on account of disorderly conduct.

2. The board shall commence business os soon after the time notified as there is sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum directed by bye-law; but if at the expiry of an hour from the time specified there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the board at the meeting; and the names of all members present shall be recorded in the minute book by the secretary.

3. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. The reading and ordering on reports of special committees and of officers, and the reading of memorials and receiving deputations shall follow the correspondence.

5. Every petition or memorial addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and be presented by a member of the board, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

6. On the presentation of a petition or memorial, no debate shall take place thereon until notice is given as hereinafter provided; and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of the presentation shall be that the petition be received or that it be referred to a committee.

7. No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, nor unless due notice has been given. All such reports shall be read and received pro forma; and if ordered by the board, be printed for distribution amongst the the members, to be considered at any subsequent meeting.

8. If, in the report of a committee, there be distinct recommendations contained in such report, such report shall not be adopted until the sense

adopted until the sense of the board be taken separately on each.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under the consideration of the meeting. Any member may bring forward such business as he may think advisable in the form of a "notice of motion," such notice to be given in writing to the secretary at least four clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices shall be considered in the order in which they have been received.

which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices shall be considered in the order in which they have been received.

10. No motion entered on the motion paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorized by him in writing, be present when the business is called upon. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

11. No bye-law shall be made save by a special order of the board, as provided for by sections 138 and 174 of Acts of Parliament No. 176.

12. No motion in which it is proposed to take action on any petition, or in which it is proposed to adopt any address, shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit herewith a draft of such potition or standing order; and the draft so submitted shall in no case be taken into consideration until it shall have been referred to the legislative committee, who shall report thereon, and the mover of such proposition shall be pro hac vice a member of such committee.

13. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be pro hac vice a member of such committee.

14. Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not present with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and obtain the signatures of the mover and seconder.

15. It shall be competent for any member, without any previous notice, to move for a call of the whole board, for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting; and, upon such notice being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each member, by post, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion comes under discussion. And any member not in attendance at the voting upon such question or amendment thereof shall be liable to a fine of ten shillings, unless reasonable cause for

such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the board. The fines to be applied to charitable purposes.

16. On any motion being put from the chair, the secretary shall enter in the minute-book the names of the members who voted thereon, and specify whether such members voted for or against the notion so put from the chair.

17. All reports sent in to the chairman of the board or the board, by any member thereof, or by any officer of the board, shall be written on sheets of large foolscap paper on one side only, a broad margin being left so that they can be properly bound together.

18. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment. 19. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to proceed.

20. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed. And the chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall immediately be put to the vote.

21. The chairman shall when called upon to decide a point of order or practice state the rule or precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment and his decision as to what

21. The chairman shall when called upon to decide a point of order or practice state the rule or precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final pro have vice in each case.

22. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand up when addressing the board in discussion of any question.

23. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by any member immediately upon the same being used.

23. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by any member immediately upon the same being used.

24. Any member may of right require the production of any documents of the board relating to the question in discussion.

25. One amendment shall only be discussed at one time; but if lost, another amendment may be moved before the original question is put to the vote.

26. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the board, such amendment may be moved before it shall be held to have squashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

27. The chairman shall, on taking the vote upon any original question or amendment, put the first question in the affirmative and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as it is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which part has the majority. And the board shall vote in all cases by the show of hands, provided always that if at any such meeting there shall be an equality of votes in the election of chairman, it shall be decided by lot which of the members having an equal number of votes shall be chairman.

28. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjourn-

No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if on the question being put the motion is negatived, the subject then under discussion, or the next notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before a subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

29. Any member may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided such protest- is not inconsistent with truth, or disrespectful to the board. Notice of intention to protest must be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest signed by the members or member protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting must be entered before the next regular meeting of the board by the protesting members in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the board; the same also to be considered a part of such minutes.

30. Any member who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or shall use any expression, capable, of being applied offensively to any other member, and who, if required by the chairman to withdraw such expression, shall refuse to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Fivo pounds, to be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace.
