THE following Letter from the Harbor Master, Hokianga, reporting the erection of beacons to guide vessels over the bar of that harbor, is published for general information.

Auckland, 11th June, 1867.

SIR,—I have the honor to inform you that beacons are erected to guide vessels over the Hokianga Bar, and that the following directions will have to be observed in entering:—

“In consequence of the channel over Hokianga Bar having shifted a little to the southward, two wooden beacons have been erected (painted white) in ‘Martin’s Bay,’ which must be kept in a line bearing N.E. by E. ½ E., which will lead over the deepest part of the bar.”

It will be necessary that this information be published for vessels trading to the Hokianga River.

FRANKLIN AGRICULTURAL AREA COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under the *Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim a common for the use of selectors and lessees in the undermentioned agricultural area, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

FRANKLIN AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.—The allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, comprising an area of 804 acres 1 rood 20 perches, shall be and constitute a Farmer's Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the Agricultural Area of Franklin, viz., allotments 143 and 144, in the parish of Geelong.—(67.P.8486.)

5. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

6. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured by the person requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

9. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations are due, or to the contractor, in waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department, or officer in charge of the station, will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for

so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report of the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct.
