SOUTH AUSTRALIA. Notice to Commanders and Pilots of Ships.

THE following Signals will be used on board the Steam Dredge at this port, when working at the Inner Bay, on and after the 12th July, 1867, until further notice:—

Proceed with caution—Blue flag, by day.
 Pass to the westward—Red ball, by day; red light under white light, by night.
 Pass to the esetward—White ball, by night; green light under white light, by night.
 Pass to the eastward—White ball, by night; green light under white light, by night.
 Accident.—Dredge cannot be moved from centre of channel, in time to allow approaching vessel to pass—Blue flag with white centre, by day.

When No. 1 signal is observed, the speed of the approaching vessel should be reduced before nearing the Dredge. On a large or deep vessel approaching, the Dredge will, if necessary, be moved over towards the side of the channel; but should any accident have occurred which might prevent her doing so, signal No. 4 will be hoisted, leaving it to the judgment of the commander or pilot which side he will pass.

At night, the Dredge will display a colored light below the bright light, to denote on which side a vessel should pass. The pontoons will be moored to the eastward of the channel.

The pontoons are discharged in the bight at the north-west end of Torrens Island, remote from the navigable channel for vessels of any tonnage.

Three small black buoys have been placed to indicate the position of the limestone crust, as discharged; which should be avoided by boats and small craft in beating in or out.

As already published, the Steam Dredge displays a bright white light from sunset to sunrise.

REGISTRAR-GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, AND FOR THE QUARTER ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1867.

A CTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper; East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keilor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade at the Melbourne Observatory, calculated from a reduced mean corresponding with that of twenty-four hourly observations taken on each day during the month of June, 1867:—

The number of deaths in June was considerably below the average. The mean temperature was higher than that of the same month in any of the seven previous years.

Males and females contributed respectively 53 and 47 per cent. to the mortality. About 51 per cent. of the deaths were of children under 5 years of age, as against 41 per cent. in June, 1866, 48 per cent. in June, 1865, 45 per cent. in June, 1864, 31 per cent. in June, 1863, 43 per cent. in June, 1862, 51 per cent. in June, 1861, and 49 per cent. in June, 1860.

The day of highest mortality was the 24th. Upon it 16 deaths occurred. The lowest mortality was on the 30th. For it only 2 deaths were reported.

Five persons of 75 years old and upwards died during the month. Of these, three were octogenarians, namely, a male aged 85, of senile decay; a female aged 81, of pneumonia; and a female aged 84 of asthma. The other two were males of 75 and 76 years old respectively, and died of old age.

Thirteen violent deaths took place during the month, of which eleven are supposed to have resulted from accident, and two from suicide. The following are the particulars:—A horsebreaker, aged 26, died of a fractured skull; a farrier, aged 54, of an injury to the brain caused by a fall from a horse; a hawker, aged 61, of injuries received through being passed over by the wheel of a cab; and a hawker, aged 57, of tetanus, resulting from a slight injury to the left foot; an infant aged 15 months and an infant aged 23 months, died from the effects of scalds; a boy, aged 3, was drowned in the Kororoit Creek; a boy, aged 12, in a quarry at Braybrook; a ballast man, aged 35, in Hobson's Bay; and a gardener, aged 50, in the River Yarra; a child, aged 19 months, was suffocated by a foreign body in the larynx; a female aged 18 years and a female aged 28 years drowned themselves in the Yarra.

Fifty deaths or a fifth of the whole occurred in public institutions, viz.:—33 in the Melbourne Hospital, 3 in the Lying-in Hospital, 6 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Immigrant's Home, 3 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Industrial Schools, and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages according to the last census: the number of deaths of persons under and over five years of age, the total at all ages, and the number of deaths to every 1000 of the population during the month of June, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last consus, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which

have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to about 165,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.52 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years numbered 127, of which 57, or nearly 45 per cent, were of males, and 70, or about 55 per cent, were of females. Of those dying, 67 were under one year of age, 29 were between one and two years, 12 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 123, of which 76, or nearly 62 per cent., were males, and 47, or about 38 per cent, were females; 13 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 4 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty, 9 were between thirty and thirty-five, 10 were between twenty-five and thirty-five, 12 were between thirty and thirty-five and fifty-five, 8 were between forty-five, 4 were between forty-five and fifty, 9 were between fifty and fifty-five, 12 were between fifty and sixty-five and sixty-five and sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, 3 were eighty and upwards, and 1 was of age unspecified.

The mortality from zymotic diseases was, in the month under review, exceeded by that from local diseases, which circumstance had not occurred before in any month since October, 1866.
