### DESCRIPTION, ETC.

James Warner, alias Brassey, English, probably from Staffordshire, aged 50, five feet nine inches in height, stout, and robust-built, dark-brown hair and whiskers, the latter all round the chin, blue eyes, straight nose, long full face, rather good looking, slightly stooping gait, a pugilist, and known as such about Ballarat. He wore an old torn and dirty Crimean shirt over Scotch twilled shirt, old moleskin trousers, old slouched drab billycock hat, and Blucher boots.

From 9 o'clock in the morning of the 16th June last, until the 24th of the same month, the dog of the missing man remained about Minogue's premises howling, and is supposed to have been killed.

**WORKS ON MAIN ROADS.**

THE Governor in Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1863, has, by Orders severally made on the 29th day of July, 1867, directed that the under-mentioned Shire Councils and District Board shall, within the times by the said respective Orders appointed, execute the works on Main Roads hereinafter named and described, as provided by the 220th section of the said Act, according to plans deposited with the Board of Land and Works, that is to say:-

The Council of the Shire of Glenelg shall, within twelve months from the 29th of July aforesaid, drain, form, and metal forty-nine chains of the Main Road from Green Hills to Harrow.

The Council of the Shire of Metcalfe shall, within twelve months from the 29th of July aforesaid, metal thirty-two chains and forty links, and drain and form fifty chains of the Kyneton to Heathcote Main Road.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE MANSFIELD TOWN AND FORD'S CREEK FARMERS' UNITED COMMON.

ALL residents within five miles of Mansfield shall be entitled to depasture cattle on the common.

2. All persons occupying land amounting to and under 20 acres shall be entitled to depasture on the common 10 head of cattle.

3. All persons occupying land exceeding 20 acres shall be entitled to depasture one head of cattle for every four acres.

4. The fees to be charged for depasturing cattle shall be as follows for each head over six months' old, half-yearly, paid in advance:—

	s.	d.
For each mare, horse, colt, filly, mule, ass	5	0 yearly
For each cow, steer, ox, heifer	3	0
For every sheep, goat	1	0

5. No entire horse or bull over nine months' old shall be allowed to depasture on the common without special permission in writing from the managers.

6. All dead or diseased cattle found on the common, the owners of which neglect or refuse to remove or burn within 24 hours after receiving notice from the managers or herdsman, shall be burned or removed, and the owner be held liable to pay for such burning or removal.

7. The managers shall be empowered to employ a herdsman, purchase books, a brand, pitch, or incur any other necessary expense for the management of the common, the same to be defrayed out of the moneys collected for license fees.

8. All cattle for depasturing on the common shall be delivered to the herdsman or one of the managers, at such place as may be appointed; and after the fees are paid, shall be branded with the common brand.

9. The managers shall keep a record showing the number and description of stock, and the amount paid in respect thereof.

10. The managers shall meet at least once every three months, to transact any business that may be required.

11. Any person depasturing cattle may at any time remove them, and substitute others, by giving notice thereof to the managers or herdsman before doing so; and it shall be unlawful for any person to take any other stock but his own further than the nearest yard for the purpose of drafting.

12. All cattle found trespassing on the common without the common brand shall be impounded.

13. No person will be allowed to drive or in any way interfere with any stock on the common, nor remove any cattle without permission in writing from the managers.

14. The managers shall deliver to the secretary of the shire council, on the 15th day of September in each year, all books of accounts, with a statement of receipts and expenditure for the past year, to be submitted to the shire auditors.

15. All moneys remaining in the hands of the managers, after the expenses of management have been paid, shall be handed over to the treasurer of the shire at the same time as the books are delivered to the council.

16. The financial year shall commence on the 1st day of August next ensuing, and terminate on the 31st July.

17. *Interpretation clause.*—The word "cattle" shall mean and include horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, mules, cows, oxen, heifers, steers, calves, and shall apply to any one or more animal or animals of the said several kinds.

## SHIRE OF GLENELG.

## BYE-LAWS OF THE GLENELG SHIRE COUNCIL.

THE ordinary business of the council shall be transacted on such days as the council may from time to time appoint, and in the following order:—

1. The minutes of the previous ordinary meeting and special meeting, if any, shall be read, and if confirmed, signed by the president, or in his absence, the acting president, and no discussion shall take place thereon except as to their accuracy.

2. The letters written by the secretary since the previous ordinary meeting shall be read, and the decision of the council thereon entered in the minute-book.

3. The letters or other documents addressed to the council shall be read, and the decision of the council thereon recorded.

4. Reports by the officers of the council shall be read and orders taken thereon.

5. Orders of the day shall be considered. These shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and all business of which due notice has been given.

6. Notices of motion (when given) shall at once be entered by the secretary in the minute-book and read to the council, and the decision of the council thereon shall be taken at the meeting next ensuing. In case of the absence of the councillor who has given notice of motion, the motion may be brought forward by any other councillor having his authority to do so.

7. Any councillor proposing a motion or amendment must address himself to the president and shall stand while doing so. No councillor when speaking shall be interrupted, unless he is called to order, when the councillor calling to order shall be first heard, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject is entered upon. The president or acting president's ruling shall be final in all matters of order or practice.

8. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor shall more than one councillor speak at a time.

9. No councillor shall speak twice on any one motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may be the mover, or as the mover of the last proposed amendment, unless by permission of a majority of the council.

10. Any councillor who, in the opinion of the majority of the council, shall make use of offensive expressions to any other councillor shall be deemed out of order, and shall, if required by the president or majority of the council, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the council.

11. Any councillor out of order, who shall not obey the president's call to order, or the call of the majority of the council, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of five pounds, to be recovered in a summary way before any magistrate.

12. The council shall in all cases vote by a show of hands, except when inconsistent with or repugnant to any of the provisions of the Local Government Act.

13. Any councillor may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, and such protest, together with his reasons for the same, shall be immediately entered in the minute-book by the secretary, and read to the council.

14. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down in writing any particular word or words used by any other councillor immediately such word or words are spoken.

15. Any councillor may of right require, through the president, the production of any of the documents of the council relating to any question or matter under discussion.

16. Tenders for contracts shall not be opened except in the presence of the council, and during its sitting. The deposit on contracts shall be five per cent. on the amount thereof, and the progress payment shall be ninety per cent. on the amount of the work done and material supplied.

17. All contracts must be carried out in accordance with the specifications and the general conditions of the contracts, and the engineer in his monthly reports shall specifically mention each work in progress, and state whether such work is being proceeded with satisfactorily; and shall also bring under the notice of the council all fines incurred for non-completion as to time, &c.

18. A list of the payments requiring to be made shall be laid monthly before the council, and, if approved, such list shall be signed by the president, and payments made in accordance therewith.

19. The engineer, treasurer, collector, thistle and dog inspectors, and any other officers of the council, shall submit monthly reports of the duties performed by them in their respective appointments.
