WHEREAS by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under The Land Act, the Governor in Council may cproclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under The Land Act 1862, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclam any unselected and unlessed Governor in Council may proclam any unselected and unlessed portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for

the use of such selectors and lessees; Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the farmers' common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that

in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

SUPPOSED MURDER OF JAMES WARNER, ALIAS BRASSEY, AT FRANKLINFORD.

Two Hundred Pounds Reward. Free Pardon to an ACCOMPLICE.

WHEREAS James Warner, alias Brassey, who is described below, has been missing since the morning of Sunday, the 16th of June last, under suspicious circumstances, from the neighborhood of Franklinford, in the Castlemaine district: And whereas he is ascertained to have spent the night preceding his disappearance drinking in the house of one Minogue, at Franklinford: And whereas in a previous notice, dated the 3rd instant, a Reward of Twenty-five pounds was offered for the discovery of his remains, if deceased: And whereas there is a strong probability of his having been murdered: Notice is hereby given that a Reward of Two hundred pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the conviction of the person or persons guilty of murdering the said

From 9 o'clock in the morning of the 16th June last, until the 24th of the same mouth, the dog of the missing man remained about Minogue's premises howling, and is supposed to have been killed.
