The three deaths in the Boroondara district were of children under one year of age, the causes of fatality being dysentery and diarrhoea. Eighteen out of the twenty-eight deaths in Collingwood were of children under three years of age, and measles and diarrhoea are recorded as still prevalent in that district. In North and South Melbourne, the measles appears on the decline; but diarrhoea is reported in North Melbourne as very prevalent and fatal. Most of the other districts also continue to show heavy bills of mortality.

BEECHWORTH MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAWS.—[19th November, 1866.]

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Beechworth, begun and holden at Beechworth, in said district, on the 19th November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, it is ordained by said board as follows, that is to say,—

BYE-LAW No. 45.—MACHINERY TO REPRESENT LABOR.

On all alluvial claims where machinery is erected, such machinery shall represent one man for every £250 expended in procuring and erecting the same; but should any dispute arise in reference to the amount so expended, the onus of proof of such expenditure shall lie with the owner of such machinery.

BYE-LAW No. 46.—LIABILITY OF HOLDERS OF WORKING PORTIONS OF SHARES.

The working partner in a share shall be primarily responsible to the company for all calls and expenses in working such share, and for all fines which may be imposed by the company in respect of such share for neglect of work; and when a working partner in a share has incurred expense by fines, wages, or otherwise, and refuses to pay the same, and such company neglect to proceed by due process of law to recover such expenses, all liabilities incurred by said working partner over and above the sum of ten pounds, in addition to the amount due for calls, shall be at the company's own risk, and shall not be chargeable against the other partner or partners in said share.

BYE-LAW No. 47.

The owner of any claim requiring to stack quartz, auriferous earth, or any mining material outside the boundary of his claim may occupy the necessary ground for such purpose, provided the same be not previously occupied.

BYE-LAW No. 48.—ABANDONMENT OF CLAIMS.

When the working of any claim is discontinued from any cause for a period of more than one week, the owner shall post a notice on a conspicuous place near the last workings, setting forth whether such claim is held under suspension or an ordinary registration, with the name and address of the owner, and also the extent of ground in yards claimed, lengthways, on each side of such posted notice. Notwithstanding anything contained in bye-law No. 6 of this board, claimholders failing to comply with the requirements of this bye-law within fourteen days from the date of discontinuing work, shall be deemed to have forfeited and abandoned such ground. In the event of any dispute arising as to the posting of such notice, the onus of proof shall lie with the owner thereof.

BYE-LAW No. 49.—AMENDMENT OF BYE-LAW No. 12.

That the first portion of bye-law No. 12, that is from the commencement of such bye-law to the words "forty claims" (40 claims) inclusive, be repealed, and the following words substituted in lieu thereof, viz.:

On wet frontage leads where the depth of sinking exceeds two hundred feet, and when any claim or amalgamated claim situate on such lead has been in possession of the present occupants for six months after payable gold has been discovered by them, and where machinery equal to twelve-horse-power is at work on such claim—

One man may take possession of and hold 20 single claims
Two men " " " " 40 " "
Three men " " " " 60 " "
Four men " " " " 80 " "

This bye-law to be read in connection with the remaining portion of bye-law No. 12.

BYE-LAW No. 50.—DAMS IN INDIGO DIVISION.

No person shall be held to be in legal occupation of any dam or reservoir on a frontage lead, in the Indigo division, unless registered as an easement in connection with a specified claim, or originally constructed for other than mining purposes, and all legal title to such dam or reservoir shall cease, together with the title to the claim as an easement to which it had been registered.

BYE-LAW No. 51.—INTERPRETATION.

The words "worked and abandoned ground" shall, notwithstanding anything contained in bye-law No. 3, be held to mean all alluvial ground (if of a depth of more than 40 feet) within one hundred yards from where any one or more shafts have been bottomed, partially worked and abandoned (if of a less depth than 40 feet); all alluvial ground within a radius of one hundred yards of the most central of any ten shafts which may have been bottomed, partially worked and abandoned. The words "mining tenement" shall be held to mean any claim, race, tail-race, drain, tunnel, dam, reservoir, water, road, tramway, or easement in connection with any claim, or share or interest therein.

BYE-LAW No. 52.—REGISTRATIONS, HOW EFFECTED.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary that may be contained in these bye-laws, registration of all mining tenements, business or residence sites may be effected in the following manner, that is to say,—

Any person having taken possession of any claim or other mining tenement, business or residence site, in accordance with these bye-laws, shall, within forty-eight hours after taking such possession, make application to the registrar for registration thereof in the form of Schedule I, and shall at the same time produce his miner's right or business license; and in the case of an extended or amalgamated claim, a miner's right for every

single claim comprised therein, and shall allow the registrar to take the number and date of such miners' rights or business licenses; and shall receive from the registrar a certificate of such registration in the form of Schedule II.

After a claim or other mining tenement shall have been registered in which there are more shareholders than one, the owners thereof shall divide the interest in such claim or other mining tenement into any number of shares that may be agreed upon. The shares to be consecutively numbered 1, 2, 3, &c., with the names of the shareholders opposite their respective shares; and shall make application to the registrar for registration thereof in the form of Schedule III. Each shareholder shall receive from the registrar a certificate in the form of Schedule IV. The number of shares in any company may be increased from time to time in like manner.

Any person wishing to transfer his interest in any mining tenement, business or residence site, or lien thereon, shall do so by giving notice to the registrar in the form of schedule V; and the transferee shall receive a duplicate of such transfer duly registered. No transfer shall be valid unless so registered.

Claimholders wishing to have their respective claims amalgamated or united as provided for in these bye-laws, shall have such amalgamation or union registered by making application to the registrar in the form of Schedule VI; and shall receive from the registrar a certificate of such registration in the form of Schedule VII.

BYE-LAW No. 53.

No prospecting area shall be protected under Bye-law No. 21 unless gold in payable quantities has been previously found therein, and no claim of any class shall be protected, except wet frontage claims, unless such have been previously worked, in accordance with the provisions of these bye-laws, for a period of not less than twelve weeks.

BYE-LAW No. 54.—ABSENCE FROM RESIDENCE OR BUSINESS SITE.

Any person being in lawful occupation of a registered business or residence site, and having erected thereon a dwelling house or place of business, may absent himself for thirty consecutive days without rendering such site liable to forfeiture, and for a further period, not exceeding three months, provided he shall register such absence with the registrar, and shall post a copy of the certificate of such registration on some conspicuous part of the building; such certificate shall be in the form of Schedule VIII.

BYE-LAW No. 55.—WATER FOR DOMESTIC USE.

Any spring, water-hole, or other depository of water may be reserved for domestic purposes on the following conditions, viz.—Application shall be made to the mining registrar for the registration thereof, in the form of Schedule IX, by not less than five holders of miners' rights or business licenses; and a copy of the certificate of such registration to be kept posted on a conspicuous place near such water. Nevertheless, any surplus water that may overflow from such reserved spring, water-hole, or other depository of water, or any water that may be in excess of the requirements of those for whose use such water is reserved, may be registered, diverted, and used for mining or other purposes.
