MOUNT WARRENHEIP TIMBER RESERVE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time revoke and alter any such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a Reserve for the preservation and growth of timber the land hereinafter described (comprising Mount Warrenheip), that is to say: 224 acres 3 roods 23 perches, more or less, county of Grant, parish Warrenheip, being allotment 1 of section 3: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 1c; bounded thence by that allotment and allotment 1b bearing N. 69° 13' E. fifty-two chains twenty-one links; thence by a road fifty links wide bearing S. 0° 47' E. thirty-nine chains forty-nine links; thence by a road one chain wide bearing N. 89° 35' W. fifty-one chains fifty-eight links; and thence by a road bearing N. 35° 24' W. nine chains sixty-eight links, N. 9° 9' W. fifteen chains forty-five links, N. 0° 47' W. five chains forty-seven links, and N. 33° 4' E. twelve chains ninety-five links to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.P.5722.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time, before or after the proclamation of any agricultural area, proclaim as a road or as a town or village any portion or portions of such area, not selected, purchased, or leased, and not exceeding, if proclaimed as a town or village, six hundred and forty acres of the lands comprised in such area; and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner provided for the sale by public auction of lands not reserved for proclamation in such areas: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the land hereinafter described as a town, that is to say:-

TOWN OF ALEXANDRIA.—Commencing at the east angle of allotment 34b, in the parish of Alexandria; bounded thence by that allotment, bearing S. 34° 43' W. fifty-one chains ninety-nine links to the eastern side of the road from Yea to Darlingford; thence by a line bearing westerly crossing that road to the east angle of allotment 34; thence by that allotment, bearing S. 16° 9' W. seven chains seventy-six links; thence by the north-east boundary of allotment 32, by a line crossing a road, and by the north-eastern boundary of allotment 32b, bearing S. 69° 15' E. seventeen chains, more or less, to the north-eastern angle of the last-named allotment; thence by the east boundary of that allotment, by the east boundary of the Cemetery, again

COMMONS INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the

provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act. Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, that is to say:—

DARLINGTON TOWN COMMON.—The Darlington Town Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 11th day of May, 1866, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands, containing an area of 550 acres, more or less, within the boundaries hereinafter defined, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west angle of the town reserve of Darlington; thence by the west boundary thereof bearing south ten chains to the north-western angle of the existing common; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that common bearing respectively east seventy-six chains, more or less, and south eighteen chains, more or less, to the Mount Emu Creek; thence by that creek bearing south-easterly to the south boundary of the town reserve aforesaid; and thence by the south, east, and north boundaries thereof, bearing respectively east fifty-two chains, more or less, north eighty chains, and west one hundred and sixty chains to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.P.9609.)

LANDS EXCEPTED FROM MINING OPERATIONS. ETC.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Mining Statute 1865*, the Governor in Council has ordered that the Crown lands within the boundaries hereinafter specified be excepted from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business under any miner's right or business license, the said land being required as a reserve for a Reservoir at the township of Myers, viz.:—

The deaths in July numbered 33 more than those in June, and 26 more than the average of July during eight years. The month was upwards of a degree warmer than the average.

Fifty-three per cent. of the deaths were of males and 47 per cent. were of females. Forty-four per cent. of those dying had not attained their fifth year, against 40 per cent. in July, 1866; 44 per cent. in July, 1865; 44 per cent. in July, 1864; 45 per cent. in July, 1863; 46 per cent. in July, 1862; 50 per cent. in July, 1861; and 48 per cent. in July, 1860.

The highest number of deaths recorded as occurring on any one day was 16, on the 23rd; 15 deaths were also set down for the 1st and 26th respectively. Only 2 deaths were recorded for the 27th, and 3 for the 15th.

The deaths of two octogenarians occurred in the month, viz., those of a male aged 80 of disease of the brain, and of a male aged 87 of apoplexy. Two females each aged 75 also died during the month, the one of bronchitis and the other of old age.

Eight deaths resulted from violence, viz., those of a male aged 40 of internal injuries arising from a kick from a horse; of a market gardener aged 55 of the effects of a dry wheel passing over his leg; of a storekeeper aged 29 of a gunshot wound accidentally received 3 years ago; of a female child aged 4 of accidental burns; of an infant who only lived for a few minutes after its birth in consequence of hemorrhage from the navel string, believed to have been intentional on the part of its mother; of an infant aged 4 days of poisoning by laudanum (mother committed for manslaughter); of a male aged 27 who committed suicide by hanging; and of a male aged 28 who committed suicide by cutting his throat.

Fifty-eight deaths or 20 per cent. of the whole occurred in charitable institutions, viz.:—27 in the Melbourne Hospital, 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Immigrant's Home, 9 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 3 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 5 in the Immigration Hospital, 2 in the Industrial Schools, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Hulk Success.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to about 165,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.72 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 124, of which 74, or nearly 60 per cent., were of males, and 50, or about 40 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 69 were under one year of age, 24 were between one and two years, 15 were between two and three, 10 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 159, of which 77, or about 48 per cent., were males, and 82, or nearly 52 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 3 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 13 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 14 were between forty and forty-five, 12 were between forty-five and fifty, 10 were between fifty and fifty-five, 11 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 4 were between sixty-five and seventy, 3 were between seventy and seventy-five, 2 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were eighty and upwards.

Scarlatina and diphtheria in a fatal form are on the increase, as are also diarrhoea and dysentery. The mortality from phthisis continues remarkably steady: exactly 25 deaths were set down to that complaint in each of the last three months.
