STREETS AT EAGLEHAWK.

STREETS AT EAGLEHAWK.

IN accordance with the provisions of The Police Offences undermentioned streets in the Borough of Eaglehawk, showing the proposed carriageways and footways thereof, was submitted to the Governor in Council on the 26th day of Angust, 1867; and thereupon the Governor fixed and declared the breadth of such carriageways and footways, and the distance from the outer edge of such footways, as hereinafter set forth, within which it is provided by the said Act that it shall not be lawful to erect any building or fence; subject nevertheless to the conditions that in cases where any of these streets encroach on or traverse land held under mining lease, or land legally occupied by any person at the date of this Proclamation, the Borough Council of Eaglehawk shall, before forming such of the said streets, compensate the lessees or occupiers of such land for the portions thereof (together with the improvements thereon) required for those streets.

QUEENSTOWN CEMETERY REGULATIONS.

Queenstown Cemetery Regulations.

A LL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person paying the necessary charges, and making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument of any kind in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, shall be entitled to have and keep such vault or monument, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the use of such persons or their representatives for ever.

3. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument or fence in the cemetery, must be made to the trustees through their secretary, and if such application be approved of, a certificate of permission, in the form of Schedule A, will be granted to the applicant on payment of the proper charges.

A will be granted to the applicant on payment of the proper charges.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery on the production of a certificate from a magistrate or minister of religion, or of other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. The trustees will cause any common grave to be dug on payment of the proper charge, but the purchasers of permission to bury, may dig, or cause the graves to be dug, themselves, always providing that no grave be less than five feet deep.

6. In case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. Plans of all proposed monuments or fences must be submitted to the trustees for approval.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in proper order and repair at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

10. Every coffin must have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of deceased stamped thereon.

11. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected on application.

12. Any person wantonly destroying, defacing, doing or causing to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery is by the Statute guilty of a misdemeanor.

13. The trustees reserve the right of recommending any alterations from time to time in these regulations.
