The Railway Storekeeper will have the power to reject such supplies as he may consider not according to contract, and the contractor may claim a survey to be held, provided he gives the Railway Storekeeper notice thereof within twenty-four hours after the goods have been rejected. The Commissioner of Railways will appoint the Board of Survey, and his decision will be final.

7. On completion of an order, the contractor will furnish his account to the Railway Storekeeper, and payment will be made at the Treasury.

8. The contract may be terminated by three months' notice from either party—the contractor on his own behalf, and the Secretary for Railways on behalf of the Government. Should the contractor, however, fail to perform the contract satisfactorily, the Secretary of Railways may terminate the contract forthwith.

9. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
