## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land a farmers' common; when one-eighth part of any agricultural area has been selected under *The Land Act 1862*, or selected or leased under the now reciting Act, the Governor in Council may proclaim any unselected and unleased portion of such agricultural area, not exceeding twice the quantity so selected and leased, to be a temporary common for the use of such selectors and lessees: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim a Farmers' Common for the use of selectors and lessees in the agricultural area hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

The deaths in July were fewer by 27 than those in June. The mortality was higher than the average for July during nine years, but not more so than might have been expected from the increase of population during the period. The weather was somewhat cooler than usual.

Males contributed 56 per cent. and females 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under 5 contributed 44 per cent. to that mortality, against 41 per cent. in July, 1867; 40 per cent. in July, 1866; 44 per cent. in July, 1865; 44 per cent. in July, 1864; 45 per cent. in July, 1863; 46 per cent. in July, 1862; 50 per cent. in July, 1861; and 43 per cent. in July, 1860.

The day of highest mortality was the 8th, on which 17 deaths occurred. That of the lowest was the 15th, for which only 2 deaths were recorded.

The oldest persons who died in the district during the month were a female, said to be 80 years of age, of hepatitis, and a male, stated to be 99 years old, of old age.

Fifteen deaths occurred from external causes, viz., those of a male child aged 2, who died from the effects of an accidental injury received some time ago; of an ordinary seaman, aged 15, who was killed by falling from aloft; of a carter, aged 29, who was killed by being passed over by a cart-wheel; of a carter aged 28, and of a laborer aged 37, who were killed by earth falling upon them; of a female child aged 4, of a cab-driver aged 33, and of a gentleman aged 41, who died from the effects of burns; of a seaman aged 30, and of a seaman aged 34, who were accidentally drowned; of a miner, aged from 30 to 35, who was found dead in the water; of a female, aged 33, who died from the inhalation of chloroform properly administered previous to an operation; and of 3 infants, aged respectively 2 months, 3 months, and 3 months, who were suffocated in bed.

Fifty-six deaths, or over 19 per cent. of the whole, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—33 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 1 in the Military Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 4 in the Industrial Schools, 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Hulk Success.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages according to the last census, the number of deaths of person under and over five years of age, the total at all ages, and the number of deaths to every 1,000 of the population during the month of July, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

\* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 170,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.69 deaths to every 1,000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 126, of which 73, or nearly 58 per cent., were of males, and 53, or about 42 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 71 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two years, 9 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 17 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 162, of which 89, or nearly 55 per cent., were males, and 73, or about 45 per cent., were females; 22 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 3 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 10 were between forty and forty-five, 11 were between forty-five and fifty, 11 were between fifty and fifty-five, 4 were between fifty-five and sixty, 7 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 8 were between seventy and seventy-five, and 2 were eighty and upwards.

Zymotic diseases caused 109 deaths in June, and only 75 in the month under review. Deaths from scarlatina and diphtheria fell from 44 to 30; those from croup from 13 to 4; those from whooping-cough from 8 to nil; and those from dysentery and diarrhoea from 12 to 7. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid and infantile fevers increased from 13 to 16. Most deaths were due to local diseases, especially to those of the nervous and respiratory systems.
