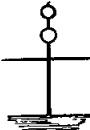
## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

FROM and after the first day of September, 1868, the following General Signals are to be used at all New Zealand Ports:—

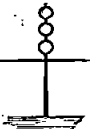
## (A.)—TIDAL SIGNALS.

*Tidal Signals are to consist of One, Two, or Three Balls, of any color which can be best seen at any Port, arranged vertically.*

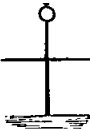
*Flood Tide.*—Two Balls, vertical, at Masthead, not less than six feet apart.



*Last Quarter Flood.*—Three Balls, vertical, at Masthead, not less than six feet apart.



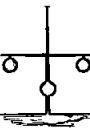
*Ebb Tide.*—One Ball at Masthead.



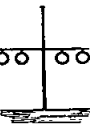
## (B.)—BAR OR DANGER SIGNALS.

*Bar Signals will be distinguished by their being arranged horizontally.*

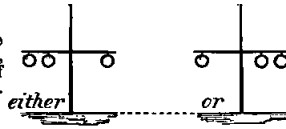
*Wait for High Water.*—A Ball at each Yard-arm, and one on Mast, half the length of the yard, below the yard.



*Stand on; Take the Bar.*—Four Balls, horizontal, on Yard, two on each side of mast.



*Bar Dangerous.*—Three Balls, horizontal, on Yard, two on any one side of mast and one on the other.



*Put to Sea.*—Two Balls, horizontal, on Yard, on either side of mast.



NOTE.—Semaphore arms are to be used for piloting vessels over all bars where a pilot establishment is maintained, when pilots are not put on board, and the vessel being piloted by the semaphore is to be steered in the direction towards which the semaphore arm is pointed. When the arm is dropped the vessel is to be kept as she goes.

*Manukau Harbor having several channels, special regulations will be issued by the local authorities for the guidance of vessels frequenting that port, and strangers are cautioned against attempting to enter without a knowledge of these local regulations.*

## (C.)—SIGNALS TO BE MADE FROM VESSELS ENTERING, OR IN HARBOR, AS REQUIRED.

*Exempt from Pilotage.*—White Flag at the Main.

*Pilot wanted.*—Union Jack at the Fore.

*Steam Tug required.*—Telegraph Flag at the Peak.

*Mails on board.*—Marryatt's Telegraph Flag at the Main.

*Health or Boarding Officer wanted.*—No. 8 of Marryatt's Code at the Main.

*Gunpowder on board.*—Red Flag at the Main.

*Government Emigrants on board.*—Ensign at the Mizzen.

*Medical Assistance wanted.*—Union Jack over Ensign at the Peak.

*Customs Boat wanted.*—Union Jack at the Peak.

*Police wanted.* { *By Day.*—Ensign at the Main.

{ *By Night.*—Two White Lights, vertical, at the Peak, or at the same height where they can be best seen, four feet apart.

## (D.)—NIGHT SIGNALS FOR OPEN ROADSTADS, ETC.—FROM SHORE.

*A Boat will come off (as to a steamer coming in).*—Two white Lights, vertical.

*Boat cannot put off.*—Two Lights, vertical—upper, Red; lower, White.

*Wait till Daylight; Boat will put off then, weather permitting.*—Two Lights, vertical—upper White; lower, Red.

*Keep to Sea* } Two White Lights, horizontal, with Red Light  
*Put to Sea* } between them.

## (E.)—NIGHT SIGNALS FOR OPEN ROADSTADS, ETC.—FROM VESSELS.

*Will wait till Daylight.*—Two Lights, vertical—upper, White; lower, Red.

*Cannot wait.*—Two Lights, vertical—upper, Red; lower, White.

*Cannot keep to Sea* } Two White Lights, horizontal, with a  
*Cannot put to Sea* } Green Light between them.

## (F.)—WATERMEN'S SIGNALS.

*A Ball will be exhibited on a Staff in some conspicuous place near the usual landing, to signify when Bad Weather Fares may be charged, as per local regulations.*

N.B.—Every pilot station is to be provided with a set of Marryatt's Signal Flags, which are to be used as required.

## OUTER BAR, PORT ADELAIDE.

A RECENT examination having been made of the outer bar at the Port Adelaide Creek, it is found that a bank having twelve feet on it at low water, springs has formed in the entrance of the Channel, leaving two narrow passages near the bank with thirteen feet.

As the tidal signals exhibited from the flagstaff at the Semaphore refer to the inner bar, on which there is a depth of nine feet six inches at low water springs, two feet six inches may be added for the soundings on the bank above indicated, and three feet six inches for the narrow passages.

I HEREBY notify that the subjoined Petition has been addressed and presented to me, on the twenty-fourth day of September, 1868.

To the Honorable Sir James Frederick Palmer, Knight, President of the Legislative Council of Victoria.

The Petition of Nathaniel Levi, of Collins street west, Melbourne, merchant,

Respectfully sheweth—

That in pursuance of an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intitled *The Electoral Act* 1865, a writ was duly issued by and under the hand and seal of the Honorable Sir John Henry Thomas Manners Sutton, Knight, Governor of the colony of Victoria, directed to William Templeton, Esquire, returning officer for the South Province, to and requiring him, the said William Templeton, to proceed as therein directed, according to law, for the purpose of procuring the return of a representative for the said South Province to the Legislative Council of Victoria.

That in accordance with the exigency of such writ, and in conformity with the said Act, three candidates were duly nominated, that is to say, William Arthur Callandar A'Beckett, Esquire, John Halfey, Esquire, and Nathaniel Levi, your petitioner.

That there being only one candidate to be returned for the said South Province, under and by virtue of the said writ, but three having been nominated, the said returning officer duly published the day for taking the poll for the said election.

That such poll took place on the sixteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, at the following polling-places, that is to say—Anderson's Creek, Bacchus Marsh, Ballan North, Wallan-wallan, Blackwood, Hawthorn, West Brighton, East Brighton, Broadmeadows, Brunswick, Brushy Creek, Bulla, Templestowe, Conings of Kilmore, Campbellfield, Caulfield, Corinella, Cranbourne, Berwick, Dandenong, The Junction of the Roads, Diggersrest, Donnybrook, Eitham, Epping, Essendon, Sunbury, Gardiner, Gisborne, Heidelberg, Dromana, Keilor, Braybrook, Lancefield, Melton, Mordialloc, Mulgrave, Northcote, Nunawading, Oakleigh, Pontridge, Yan Yean, west of Plenty River, Preston, Yarra Flats, Snapper Point, Tullamarine, Whittlesea, Wyndham, Yan Yean, east of the Plenty River.

That on the eighteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the returning officer duly notified, in conformity with the said Electoral Act, the result of the polling to be as follows:—

Nathaniel Levi ... 349  
John Halfey ... 172

And the said William Arthur Callandar A'Beckett was publicly announced and declared by the said returning officer to be duly elected as a member of the Legislative Council for the South Province.

That your petitioner has been informed and believes that the said William Arthur Callandar A'Beckett is unqualified from sitting and voting as a member of the Legislative Council of Victoria for the said South Province, and was unqualified from being so elected by reason of his not being possessed at the time of his election of the qualification required by law necessary to entitle him to be elected as a member of the said Legislative Council.

That your petitioner is advised and believes that by reason of the said William Arthur Callandar A'Beckett being so unqualified as aforesaid to be elected as such member, your petitioner being the person having the next greatest number of votes at the said election, is entitled to be declared duly elected as a member of the said South Province, and to have his name inserted in the said writ in the place of the said William Arthur Callandar A'Beckett.

Your petitioner therefore respectfully prays that you will communicate the matter of the said Petition to the Legislative Council of Victoria, in order that the case of your petitioner may be referred to a committee of the said Council duly authorized to receive, enquire into, and report upon the same according to law.

And your petitioner further prays that in the event of the said committee reporting that the said William Arthur Callandar A'Beckett was not at the time of the said election possessed of the necessary qualification to entitle him to be so elected, that the Legislative Council will be pleased to declare the said returning officer's return void, as respects the said William Arthur Callandar A'Beckett, and to amend the said return to the said writ by taking out the name of the said William Arthur Callandar A'Beckett and inserting in its place the name of your petitioner, and to declare your petitioner duly elected as a Member of the Legislative Council for the South Province.

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid), addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers as below the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Acting Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.

The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.
