NOTICE TO IMPORTERS AND OTHERS.

SEVERAL instances having recently occurred of importations of tobacco in which two or three complete packages have been strapped or fastened together so as to make an aggregate weight of 60 pounds or upwards, importers and others are warned that such a proceeding is a violation of the 31th section of the *Customs Act 1857*, which absolutely prohibits [*inter alia*] the importation into Victoria of "snuff or tobacco unless in ships of fifty tons burden at least, and in whole and complete packages, each containing not less than sixty pounds nett weight, and not containing any other goods."

Any violation of the above provisions renders the goods liable to forfeiture.

The deaths in December exceeded those in November by 113, but were still considerably below the average of previous years. The mean temperature was a degree lower than the average.

Males contributed 58 per cent. and females 42 per cent. to the total mortality. Deaths of children under five years of age for the first time since last June exceeded those of persons beyond that age. This proportion to the total mortality was 54 per cent. against 69 per cent. in December 1866; 65½ per cent. in December, 1865; 63 per cent. in December, 1864; 47 per cent. in December, 1863; 66 per cent. in December, 1862; 50 per cent. in December, 1861; and 73 per cent. in December, 1860.

Nineteen deaths occurred on the 25th, 18 on the 5th, and the same number on the 17th of the month. These were the days of highest mortality. Those of the lowest were the 7th, 14th, and 18th, for each of which only 6 deaths were reported.

Seven persons of 75 years old and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male aged 75 of paralysis, a male aged 75 of pleurisy, a male aged 75 of pneumonia, a female aged 77 of dropsy, a male aged 78 of old age, a female aged 80 of dropsy, and a male aged 88 of old age.

Eighteen deaths from external causes occurred during the month, of which 13 are classed as resulting from accident, 3 from homicide, and 2 from suicide. The following are the particulars:—A boy 3½ years of age was killed by being run over by a vehicle; a boy aged 12 was killed by a wall falling on him; a gardener aged 25 died of a fractured spine caused by diving into shallow water; a boy aged 10 died of tetanus caused by excision of the knee-joint; a boy aged 4 died of burns, an infant aged 22 weeks died of sun-stroke; an infant aged 5 weeks died of the bite of an insect; a boy aged 2½ was drowned in the Jeffcott street Swamp; a draper aged 18 was drowned in the Yarra whilst bathing; a male, supposed to have been a sailor, was washed ashore at Brighton (verdict drowning); a fisherman aged 33 was found drowned in Port Phillip Bay; a clerk aged 63 was drowned in the Yarra whilst drunk; an infant aged 6 weeks was suffocated in bed; a boy aged 14 was killed by a gunshot wound fired from the Protestant Hall; a seaman aged 30 was killed by stabbing (verdict manslaughter); a laborer aged about 70 years was found in a water-hole at Keilor with marks of violence on his person (verdict wilful murder); a gentleman aged 32 poisoned himself with strychnine; a baker aged 44 poisoned himself with opium.

Seventy-eight deaths, or 21 per cent. of the total, occurred in Public Institutions, viz.: 49 in the Melbourne Hospital; 1 in the Lying-in Hospital, 8 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Immigrants' Home, 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 1 in St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage, 5 in the Industrial Schools, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census. Instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 165,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 2.25 deaths to every 1000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 200, of which 114, or 57 per cent, were of males, and 86, or 43 per cent, were of females. Of those dying, 147 were under one year of age, 34 were between one and two years, 8 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five.

The chief feature in the disease table for December as compared with that of the previous month is the increase in deaths from zymotic diseases, viz., from 70 or 27 per cent. of the whole mortality to 129 or 35 per cent. The principal diseases showing increase are, whooping-cough, which caused 29 deaths against 12, and diarrhoea and dysentery, which caused 55 deaths against 23. Both in November and December, violent deaths were much above the average.

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now rectifying Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish and proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark, or stone or gravel, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of the third part of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall do the following acts on or with respect to the portions of Crown Lands hereinafter described, that is to say:—

BOROUGH OF ECHUCA.—No person shall cut and remove live timber or bark from the unappropriated Crown lands in the following area, viz.: Commencing at the north-east angle of the borough of Echuca, being a point on the Murray River; thence by the east boundary of that borough, bearing south to the south-west angle of allotment 45 in the parish of Echuca North; thence by a road, bearing east eighty chains to the south-east angle of allotment 46; thence by a road, bearing north one hundred and fifty-six chains eighty links to the north-east angle of allotment 10; thence by a road, bearing N. 69° 40' E. sixty chains; thence by a line, bearing north six chains, more or less, to the aforesaid river; and thence by that river, bearing westerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(67.O.13494.)

PARISH OF MALDON.—No person shall cut or remove live or dead timber or bark from the allotments of land in the following area, viz.: Parish of Maldon, allotments 6, 7, the unappropriated portion of allotment 8, and allotment 9, all of section 1 A. Area, seven hundred and eighteen acres, more or less.—(67.P.13649.)

PARISH OF YAN YEAN.—No person shall cut and remove live or dead timber, or bark, or stone, or gravel, in or from the unappropriated Crown lands in section 13, in the parish of Yan Yeau.—(67.P.14382.)

SHIRE OF BELLARINE.—No person shall cut and remove live timber from the unappropriated Crown lands within the Shire of Bellarine.—(67.O.14222.)

LAMPS, LAMP GLASSES, CHIMNEYS, ETC.

TENDERS will be received until Noon on Wednesday, 29th January, 1868, for the supply of Lamps, Lamp Glasses, &c., in such quantities as may be required for the Victorian Railways, for the period of twelve months from 1st January to 31st December, 1868.

Schedules of the articles required, and forms of tender, may be obtained at the Stores and Transport Office, Melbourne, where samples lie for inspection of tenderers.

The supplies are to be properly packed by the contractors and delivered in cases suitable for transport. The value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule, will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c.

Security will be required in the amount of £20 for due fulfilment of the contract, either in Government debentures, bank deposit-receipt, or cash deposit, as the tenderer may elect.

Tenders must be accompanied by bank notes, or a bank draft in favor of the Chairman of the Tender Board, for ten per cent. of the amount of security required, which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

The security must be completed within ten days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders will be disqualified from tendering for Government supplies for a period of twelve months.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

Tenders, sealed and marked, "Tender for Lamps, &c., for Victorian Railways," to be addressed to the Chairman of Tender Board, Stores and Transport Office, King street, Melbourne.

CONDITIONS.

1. The whole of the articles required for the service of the Victorian Railways are to be in accordance with the samples and specifications, and in every respect to be of the very best description, quality, and manufacture, subject to the approval of the Engineer-in-Chief and the Traffic Superintendent. The goods will also have to prove satisfactory to the examination and tests of the Locomotive Superintendent, as the inspecting officer appointed by the Engineer-in-Chief; and should articles of any particular manufacture be ordered, the same are to be furnished at the rates set forth in the contract.

2. All orders for supplies under this contract must issue from the Secretary for Railways, and all goods must be delivered free of charge to the Railway Stores, Williamstown, unless otherwise directed by the secretary.

3. The contract entered into under this notice is not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service of the Victorian Railways, or by the purchase of articles manufactured in the penal establishments, or the manufacture of articles by the department.

4. The Government will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractor for all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only for such articles, and such quantities of those articles as the Government may order from time to time; neither will the Government be bound to take from the contractor any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will they be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedule for which orders have not been issued. Should the Government require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedule, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

5. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered at one time; but all deliveries must be accompanied with detailed invoices or bills of parcels in duplicate, showing quantity, rate, and value, also the number of the order for the goods, otherwise the goods will not be received.

6. In the event of supplies ordered under this contract not being delivered within forty-eight hours, it will be competent for the Railway Storekeeper, on the order of the Secretary, to cancel the order and purchase the same, or such articles as may be suitable for the service, at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price will be deducted.

7. The contractor will be required to prepare his own account monthly, in the prescribed form, and render the same to the Railway Storekeeper for certification, previously to payment at the Treasury.

8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the head of the department requiring the supply, as to the quality, the same is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. Any expense incurred on account of the rejection of supplies by a board of survey will be charged to the contractor.

9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to the contractor.

10. The Railway Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior character, or not in accordance with the specification, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged to him.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Railway Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. It will be competent either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Secretary for Railways on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract, by giving a notice in writing, of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

13. In the event of any alteration in the Tariff affecting any of the items included in this Contract, the Government, or the Contractor, as may be the case, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from, or increase of, the price of the item so affected.

14. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Inspector of Stores, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering. The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately. Tenders will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw; but if all be included in one tender, it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable.

Tenders must express the prices in words as well as in figures, and without alterations or erasures.

As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be ordered at a time for the convenience of contractors.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel of 40 lbs. for oats and 20 lbs for bran (net weight), including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved securities are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

CONDITIONS.

- The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.
- The supplies are for police and telegraph horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximative, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed in any of the districts tendered for, the supplies required may be drawn from the contractor. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.
- The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
- Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
- Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
- In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
- If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.
- When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.
- A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.
- Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
- It will be competent for the Inspector of Stores on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1863; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

ALL persons entitled to the use of this Common to be allowed to depasture cattle thereon in number according to the net annual value of their assessment: that is, one head for every One pound (£1). One horse to be treated as equivalent to two head of cattle.

2. Any person depasturing more than (30) head of cattle or more than the number to which each person is entitled, to pay double fees upon all cattle in excess of such number.

3. The charges for depasturing to be as follows, viz. —

For every head of neat cattle 3s. per annum.

For every horse 6s. per annum.

For every sheep or goat 2s. per annum.

4. Every person holding a miner's right and residing within four (4) miles of Eltham to be entitled to depasture two (2) head of cattle.

5. Persons applying for depasturing licenses to produce proof, if demanded, of the amount of their assessment.

6. That the assessment be paid in advance for the half-year ending 30th June and 31st December respectively; any person failing to pay such assessment within one week after it becomes due shall be liable to have his cattle impounded, or, at the option of the managers, to the payment of a double fee.
