### NOTICE TO IMPORTERS AND OTHERS.

EVERAL instances having recently occurred of importations of tobacco in which two or three complete packages have been strapped or fastened together so as to make an aggregate weight of 60 pounds or upwards, importers and others are warned that such a proceeding is a violation of the 3 th section of the Cutoms Act 1857, which absolutely prohibits [inter alia] the importation into Victoria of "snuff or tobacco unless in ships of fifty tons burden at least, and in whole and complete packages, each condaining not less than sixty pounds nett weight, and not containing any other goods."

Any violation of the above provisions readers the goods liable.

Any violation of the above provisions renders the goods liable to forfeiture.

The deaths in December exceeded those in November by 113, but were still considerably below the average of previous years. The mean temperature was a degree lower than the average.

Males contributed 58 per cent, and females 42 per cent, to the total mortality. Deaths of children under five years of age
for the first time since last June exceeded those of persons beyond that age. This proportion to the total mortality was 54 per
cent, against 60 per cent, in December, 1866; 65; per cent, in December, 1865; 63 per cent, in December, 1864; 47 per cent, in
December, 1863; 66 per cent, in December, 1862; 50 per cent, in December, 1861; and 73 per cent, in December, 1860.

Nineteen deaths occurred on the 25th, 18 on the 5th, and the same number on the 17th of the month. These were the days of highest mortality. Those of the lowest were the 7th, 14th, and 18th, for each of which only 6 deaths were reported.

Seven persons of 75 years old and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A male aged 75 of paralysis, a male aged 75 of preumonia, a female aged 77 of dropsy, a male aged 78 of old age, a female aged 80 of dropsy, and a male aged 88 of old age. pleurisy, a male ag aged 88 of old age.

Eighteen deaths from external causes occurred during the month, of which 13 are classed as resulting from accident, 3 from homicide, and 2 from suicide. The chief feature in the disease table for December as compared with that of the previous month is the increase in deaths from zymotic diseases, viz., from 70 or 27 per cent. of the whole mortality to 129 or 35 per cent. Both in November and December, violent deaths were much above the average.

WHEREAS by The Land Act 1862 it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any monicipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any gold-fields common, or a town common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by The Amending Land Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time reproclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the jurposes and subject to the provisions of The Land Act 1802 and the now rectting Act: Now therefore 1, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish and proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—

ELTHAM AND GLENGLOY TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

A LL persons entitled to the use of this Common to be allowed to deposture cattle thereon in number according to the net annual value of their assessment: that is, one head for every One pound (£1). One horse to be treated as equivalent to two head of cattle.

2. Any person deposturing more than (30) head of cattle or more than the number to which each person is entitled, to pay double fees upon all cattle in excess of such number.

3. The charges for depasturing to be as follows, viz.—

For every head of next cattle 3s. per annum.

For every sheep or goat 2s, per annum.

For every sheep or goat 2s, per annum.

4. Every person holding a miner's right and residing within four (4) miles of Eltham to be entitled to depasture two (2) head of cattle.

5. Persons applying for depasturing licenses to produce proof, if demanded, of the amount of their assessment.

6. That the assessment within one week after it becomes due shall be liable to have his cattle impounded, or, at the option of the managers, to the payment of a double fee.

7. Any cattle illegally depasturing upon the common will be dealt with according to law.

8. That a book be kept containing an account of all cattle registered; such cattle to have the private brand of all persons registering, and to be marked also with the common brand.

9. That no entire horses or bulls be allowed on the common over six (6) months old, without the consent in writing of the nampers, and that all foats or calves on arriving at that age, be chargeable with the assessment.

10. The hoense of any person depasturing more cattle than have been registered may be cauceiled, and the managers may, if they think fit, debar such person from the use of the common during the year.

11. That all cuttle suspected to be diseased shall be removed by the owner within twenty-four (21) hours after notice to do so has been served upon them, and in default of compliance with such order the managers shall have power to destroy such cuttle at the cost of the owner or owners thereof.

12. No cattle depasturing on the common, excepting cows in milk, to be disturbed, without giving due notice to the herdsman or managers.

13. The managers shall not be held responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman.
