"If any package entered for duty is found to contain goods not mentioned in the entry or invoice, or if any goods are found which do not correspond with the description thereof in the invoice, and such omission or non-correspondence shall appear to the Commissioner to have been made for the purpose of avoiding the payment of the duty or any part of the duty on such goods, or if it shall appear to the Commissioner that in any invoice or entry any goods entered for *ad valorem* duty have been under valued with such intent as aforesaid, or if the oath or declaration made with regard to any such invoice or entry is wilfully false in any particular, then in any of the cases aforesaid all the packages and goods included or pretended to be included or which ought to have been included in such invoice or entry shall be forfeited."
