### 31 VICT. NO. 306, SEC. 8.

"If any package entered for duty is found to contain goods not mentioned in the entry or invoice, or if any goods are found which do not correspond with the description thereof in the invoice, and such omission or non-correspondence shall appear to the Commissioner to have been made for the purpose of avoiding the payment of the duty or any part of the duty on such goods, or if it shall appear to the Commissioner that in any invoice or entry any goods entered for *ad valorem* duty have been undervalued with such intent as aforesaid, or if the oath or declaration made with regard to any such invoice or entry is wilfully false in any particular, then in any of the cases aforesaid all the packages and goods included or pretended to be included or which ought to have been included in such invoice or entry shall be forfeited."

### CAUTION AGAINST KEEPING LUNATICS IN UNLICENSED HOUSES.

THERE being reason to suspect that certain persons are infringing the provisions of the 34th section of the Lunacy Statute, and that they are not aware that by so doing they incur the penalties of a misdemeanor, a copy of that section is published below for general information, viz.:-

### 32 VICT. NO. 309.

"34. It shall not be lawful for any person to receive two or more lunatics into any house, unless such house shall be an asylum or a hospital or a house for the time being duly licensed under this Act; and any person who shall receive two or more lunatics into any house other than a house for the time being duly licensed as aforesaid, or an asylum or a hospital under this Act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."

REGISTRAR-GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, AND FOR THE QUARTER ENDING 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1868.

**A**CTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keilor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade at the Melbourne Observatory, calculated upon a reduced mean corresponding with that of twenty-four hourly observations taken on each day during the month of September, 1868:—

The deaths and mean temperature in September were both slightly above the average. The mortality of this month has been very uniform during the last nine years.

Deaths of males contributed 61 per cent. and those of females 39 per cent. to the whole mortality. Deaths of children under 5 contributed 37 per cent. to that mortality, against 40 per cent. in September, 1867; 41 per cent. in September, 1866; 51 per cent. in September, 1865; 38 per cent. in September, 1864; 33 per cent. in September, 1863; 43 per cent. in September, 1862; 40 per cent. in September, 1861; and 53 per cent. in September, 1860.

Eighteen deaths were recorded on the 18th. This was the day of highest mortality. That of the lowest was the following day, the 10th, on which no more than 3 deaths were recorded.

Five persons died during the month at more advanced ages than 75 years, viz.:—A male aged 76 of paralysis, a female aged 76 of bronchitis, a male aged 79 of softening of the brain, a male aged 81 of old age, and a female aged 90 of old age.

Fifteen deaths resulted from violence during the month, viz.:—The death of a horsebreaker aged 27, who died from tetanus, proceeding from an injury to the skull; that of a seaman aged 34, who died of a fractured spine; of a laborer aged 46, who was killed by being struck by the buffer of a railway-truck; of a male child aged 3, who died of a scald; of a female aged 55, who died of burns; of a male child aged 2, who died of the effects of swallowing kerosene; of a seaman aged 25, who was accidentally drowned whilst drunk; of a seaman aged 30, who was accidentally drowned; of a male aged from 35 to 40, who was found drowned; of a new-born infant, who died of asphyxia; of an infant aged 1 month, who was suffocated in bed; of a female aged 48, who died of suffocation, combined with a fall from her bed whilst drunk; of a female aged 58, who was accidentally suffocated whilst drunk; of a ginger-beer maker aged 30, who committed suicide by hanging; and of a draper aged 42, who committed suicide whilst in a state of delirium tremens.

The deaths in public institution numbered 46, or nearly 19 per cent. of the whole mortality, viz., 36 in the Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in-Hospital, 1 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 1 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, 2 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital is in Melbourne Proper, the Benevolent Asylum in North Melbourne and Carlton, the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum in Jika-jika parish (remainder of), and the Industrial Schools in South Yarra and Prahran.

\* This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 170,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.43 deaths to every 1,000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 91, of which 48, or nearly 53 per cent., were of males, and 43, or about 47 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 63 were under one year of age, 15 were between one and two years, 6 were between two and three, 3 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 152, of which 100, or nearly 66 per cent., were males, and 52, or about 34 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 4 were between ten and fifteen, 5 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 22 were between thirty-five and forty, 11 were between forty and forty-five, 12 were between forty-five and fifty, 10 were between fifty and fifty-five, 7 were between fifty-five and sixty, 8 were between sixty and sixty-five, 3 were between sixty-five and seventy, 3 were between seventy and seventy-five, 3 were between seventy-five and eighty, 2 were eighty and upwards, and 3 were of ages unspecified.

Zymotic diseases caused 58 deaths in the month under review, against 70 in August and 75 in July. Deaths from scarlatina, which numbered 21 in each of the months named, fell to 9 in the month under review; and deaths from diphtheria, which amounted to 14 in August and 9 in July, fell to 8. Phthisis caused 34 deaths in September, against 37 in August and 33 in July.

The number of deaths which occurred throughout the district of Melbourne and suburbs during the quarter terminating on the 30th September, 1868, was 819. This number gives a proportion of 5.85 to every thousand of its inhabitants, according to the last census, or of 4.82 to every thousand, if 170,000 be accepted as an estimate for its present population.

The deaths which took place in the various sub-districts were in the following proportions to their census populations:—Melbourne Proper, 295 deaths, or 8.03 in a thousand; East Melbourne, 9 deaths, or 4.45 in a thousand; North Melbourne and Carlton, 146 deaths, or 8.69 in a thousand; Fitz Roy Municipality, 55 deaths, or 4.66 in a thousand; East Collingwood, 54 deaths, or 4.27 in a thousand; Richmond, 59 deaths, or 5.20 in a thousand; Jika-jika parish (remainder of), 36 deaths, or 4.38 in a thousand; South Yarra and Prahran, 75 deaths, or 5.81 in a thousand; Emerald Hill and Sandridge, 81 deaths, or 6.54 in a thousand; St. Kilda and Brighton, 33 deaths, or 2.94 in a thousand; Doutta Galla and Keilor, 10 deaths, or 3.24 in a thousand; Borondara and Heidelberg, 17 deaths, or 2.97 in a thousand; Cut-paw-paw parish, 27 deaths, or 4.33 in a thousand; shipping in Hobson's Bay, 12 deaths, or 6.95 in a thousand.

##### BYE-LAW OF THE MINING BOARD OF THE MINING DISTRICT OF BALLARAT.

No. 6.

AT a Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, begun and holden at Ballarat in the said district on the seventh day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, it is ordained by the said Board as follows (that is to say):—

1. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the bye-law of this Board, published in the *Government Gazette* on the seventeenth day of August, 1866, and numbered III., the provisions hereafter contained shall be deemed and taken as forming part of the bye-law aforesaid, and shall be read and construed therewith.

2. *Repealing clause.*—The clause numbered fourteen of the bye-law hereinbefore mentioned, numbered III., shall be and the same is hereby repealed, always saving and excepting the rights of persons thereunder existing prior to and at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

3. *The mode of taking possession of claims.*—Possession may, by the holder or holders of sufficient miners' rights, be taken of one or more single claims, by fixing in the ground firmly at

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to twenty per cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Acting Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government.
