CAUTION AGAINST KEEPING LUNATICS IN UNLICENSED HOUSES.

THERE being reason to suspect that certain persons are infringing the provisions of the 34th section of the Lunacy Statute, and that they are not aware that by so doing they incur the penalties of a misdemeanor, a copy of that section is published below for general information, viz.—

32 VICT. No. 309.

"24. It shall not be lawful for any person to receive two or more lunatics into any house, unless such house shall be an asylum or an hospital or a house for the time being duly licensed under this Act; and any person who shall receive two or more lunatics into any house other than a house for the time being duly licensed as aforesaid, or an asylum or an hospital under this Act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."

In both the subsequent months the arrivals were considerably in excess of the departures.

Several cases of mumps are reported in the Boroondara district, but none as fatal. In Collingwood low fever and a few cases of mild scarlatina exist, but generally the district is alleged to be in a healthy condition. Ten out of the seventeen deaths registered in South Melbourne occurred in the Melbourne Hospital. The mortality in North Melbourne is remarkably low. Occasional cases of scarlatina are reported both at Sandridge and Emerald Hill. On the whole the public health in all the districts is very good.

The orders will express the kind or description of casting according to the schedule distinction;

and the rates there filled in opposite each item will be allowed accordingly.

The Government will supply all patterns, and deliver the same to the Melbourne Station free of cost, from whence the contractor must fetch them when required and when due notice of same has been given in writing, and no cost for carriage from Spencer street Station to the contractor's place of business will be allowed.
