FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called the Parliament of Victoria, now stand prorogued until Tuesday, the seventeenth of November instant, and it is expedient further to prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria, from Tuesday, the seventeenth day of November instant until Tuesday, the twenty-second day of the month of December next ensuing.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this ninth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and in the thirty-second year of Her Majesty's reign.

WASTE OF YAN YEAN WATER.

THE Board of Land and Works begs to direct attention to the urgent necessity that exists for checking Waste of Yan Yeau Water.

The loss of pressure occasioned by this waste during the summer months is greater than the main pipe is able to afford, and unless stringent means are used to restrict it, citizens generally will suffer serious inconvenience from the great reduction in

the supply, while those residing in the higher parts of the city and suburbs will be entirely deprived of water, as the constant discharge by unnecessary waste renders supply at high levels practically impossible.

Under these circumstances the Board has no alternative but strictly to enforce the operation of the 11th bye-law, which provides a penalty of Five pounds in cases where water is allowed to run to waste.

The provisions of the Public Works Statute will also be rigidly carried out, every person using the water for irrigation without permission, and without affixing a meter, will be prosecuted.

The service-pipe will likewise be cut off, without notice, in all instances where water is wasted, misused, or unduly consumed.

The Board earnestly trusts that the public generally will assist the police and the officers of the department in abating an evil which causes such serious inconvenience to so large a number of citizens.

6. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in condition 6.

8. A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE.

BYE-LAW No. 1.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, 27 Vic. No. 176, intituled, *An Act to establish Road Districts and Shires and generally to provide for the administration of local affairs without the limits of Boroughs*, power is given to the council of every shire, from time to time, to make such bye-laws as they may think fit for the purpose of providing for the due management of the affairs of the council and regulating the conduct of their officers and servants: Be it therefore ordered by the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale as follows, viz:—

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, if applicable.

2. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held at least monthly (on the first Friday of every month), at the shire office, at Ten o'clock in the forenoon.

3. At every ordinary meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation of the minutes of preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. The order of business at meetings shall be as follows, or as nearly thereto as practicable, but for the convenience of the council such order may be temporarily varied, viz:—

1. Reading copies of letters sent.
2. Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
4. Presentation of reports.
5. Reception of accounts.
6. Orders of the day.
7. Opening of tenders.
8. Motions of which previous notice has been given.
9. Reading notices of motion for consideration at future meetings.

5. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received and taken into consideration.

6. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration.

7. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every such motion shall be considered in the order in which notice of it has been given.

8. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall for the occasion be a member of such committee.

9. Every councillor shall stand up while addressing the president.

10. The president, when called upon to decide upon points of order or practice, shall, if requested, state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

11. Every motion or amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the names of the movers and seconders, and on a division the votes shall be recorded, if so required, by any councillor.

12. One amendment only shall be received at one time, but if that is lost another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried one other amendment thereon may be moved.

13. No discussion shall be allowed upon any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any further motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

14. The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair; but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

15. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order, or who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, and who, if required by the president, shall refuse to withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds sterling.

16. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until at least seven clear days' notice shall have been given in some newspaper usually circulating in the shire inviting applications for the same.

17. All contracts shall be let by tender, unless the council should otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the president, and be opened only at the time of their consideration; the respective amounts of tender, together with the names of tenderers, shall be entered in every case on the minutes of the council. No tenders for works exceeding Fifty pounds shall be received unless accompanied by a deposit of Ten pounds per centum on the amount of tender.

When any tender has been accepted by the council, the deposit shall be held by the treasurer of the council, and shall be returned to the contractor when he obtains from the surveyor a final certificate that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

18. The shire office shall be open on Fridays and Saturdays in each week, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., during which time the secretary shall be in attendance for the purpose

of transacting the ordinary business of the council. The surveyor shall be in attendance during the hours of business at every ordinary meeting of the council.

19. The valuers appointed by the council shall visit and examine every rateable property within the shire, and shall, after having valued each such property, thereupon deliver or cause to be delivered to the owner or occupier thereof, a notice setting forth the amount at which such property is valued, and every such notice shall be signed by the valuers.

20. All officers of the council shall deliver or cause to be delivered to the council official reports at every ordinary meeting, or at such other times as the council may require.

21. The common seal of the council shall be kept in a box having two locks, of one of which locks the president shall keep the key, and of the other of which the key shall be kept by the secretary, and the seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the president, or, in his absence, two councillors be present.

22. On the appointment of any committee a time shall be named for bringing up report.

23. The president shall by virtue of his office be a member of all committees, and when present shall preside thereat, unless disabled by law.

24. In all cases where security is required from officers for the faithful discharge of their duties, such security shall be obtained from an approved guarantee society, and the expense thereof shall be borne by the officer.

25. Any bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* for a special purpose with the consent of a majority of the councillors present.

The above bye-law was passed and confirmed on the twenty-fourth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, by special order of the council of the Shire of Balmorine; and the corporate seal of the said shire council was affixed hereto this second day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight.
