WASTE OF YAN YEAN WATER.

WASTE OF YAN YEAN WATER.

THE Board of Land and Works begs to direct attention to the urgent necessity that exists for checking Waste of Yau Yean Water.

The loss of pressure occasioned by this waste during the summer months is greater than the main pipe is able to afford, and unless tringent means are used to restrict it, citizens generally will suffer serious inconvenience from the great reduction in the supply, while those residing in the huber parts of the city and suburbs will be entirely deprived of water, as the constant discharge by unnecessary waste renders supply at high levels practically impossible.

Ender these circumstances the Board has no alternative but strictly to enforce the operation of the 11th bve-law, which provides a penalty of Five pounds in cases where water is allowed to run to waste.

The provisions of the Public Works Statute will also be rigidly carried out; every person using the water for irrigation without permission, and without affixing a meter, will be prosecuted. The service-pipe will likewise be out off, without notice, in all instances where water is wasted, misused, or unduly consumed. The Board earnestly trusts that the public generally will assist the police and the officers of the department in abating an evil which causes such serious inconvenience to so large a number of citizens.

TREATY OF NAVIGATION WITH AUSTRIA.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Despatch, and Copy of a Treaty of Navigation with Austria, to be published for general information. By His Excellency's Command,

SIR.—I have the honor to transmit to you a Copy of a Treaty of Navigation, which was signed at Vienna on the 30th April last, between Her Majesty and the Emperor of Austria, the Ratifications of which were exchanged on the 26th June last.

TREATY OF NAVIGATION BETWEEN HER MAJESTY AND HIS MAJESTY THE EMPEROR OF AUSTRIA.

Signed at Vienna, April 30, 1868.

[Ratifications exchanged at Vienna, June 26, 1868.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, on the one part, and His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty, on the other part, being equally animated by the desire of extending and promoting the facilities of Navigation between their respective States and Dominious, have resolved to conclude a Treaty for that purpose, and have named for their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honorable John Arthur Douglas Baron Bloomfield of Onkhampton and Redwood, a Peer of Ireland, a Member of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council. Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Her Majesty's Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty; and Louis Mallet, Esquire, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Assistant-Secretary to the Committee of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council for Trade and Foreign Plantations;

And His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty, Frederic Ferdinand Baron Beust, His Imperial Majesty's Privy Councillor, Chancellor of the Empire, and Minister of the Imperial House, and of Foreign Affairs, Grand Cross of the Orders of St. Stenhen and Leopold:

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found to be in due and proper form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

ARTICLE I.

British ships and their cargoes in all the dominions of His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty, and ships belonging to the citizens of the Imperial and Royal States and their cargoes in all the dominions of Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, from whatever place arriving and whatever may be their place of destination, and whatever may be their place of origin or destination of their cargoes, shall be treated in every respect as national ships and their cargoes.

Every favor or exemption in these respects, or any other privilege in matters of Navigation, which either of the Contracting Parties shall grant to a third Power, shall be extended immediately and unconditionally to the other Party.

It is, however, agreed that this stipulation shall not be applicable to the national fisheries of either of the two countries.

ARTICLE II.

The stipulations contained in the preceding Article are also to be applied to the Colonies and Foreign Possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, as well as to the ships and cargoes of the same; but, as regards the coasting trade, only in those Colonies and Foreign Possessions the coasting trade of which shall have been, or shall be hereafter, opened to foreign ships in conformity with the Acts of Parliament which govern this matter.

The Foreign Possessions and Colonies of Her Britannic Majesty, the coasting trade of which has been already so opened to foreign ships, and in which therefore ships belonging to the citizens of the Imperial and Royal States are placed on the national footing, are:

British India, Ceylon, Cape of Good Hope, Victoria, St. Lucis.

ARTICLE III.

If any ship of war or merchant-vessel of one of the Contracting Parties should run aground or be wrecked, or meet with any casualty upon the coasts of the other, the same aid and assistance shall be rendered to it, and to the cargo, apparel, and furniture thereof, as to a national vessel, and in such case no other expenses shall be paid by the owners or their agents and representatives for the preservation of the property or of the lives of the persons on board the ship, than would be payable in the like case of a wreck of or causualty to a national vessel.

Jede Begünstigung oder Befreiung in dieser Beziehung, so wie jedes andere die Schifffahrt betreffende Privilegium, welches einer der vertragenden Theilo einer dritten Macht gewähren wirde, soll augenblicklich und bedingungslos auf den andern Theil ausgedehnt werden.

ARTIKEL III.

In case the master of a merchant-vessel should be under the necessity of disposing of a part of his merchandise in order to defray any salvage expenses, no impediment shall be opposed by the authorities, the master being bound, however, to conform to the existing regulations and tariffs.

The goods and merchandise saved from the wreck shall be exempt from all duties of Customs, unless cleared for consumption.

The respective Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and The respective Consuls-General, Consuls, vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents shall, if the owner or master, or other agent of the owner, is not present, or is present and requires it, or is bound by the laws of his country to accept Consular assistance, be authorized to interpose in order to afford the necessary assistance to those concerned.

ARTICLE IV.

The Consuls-General, Consuls, Vice-Consuls, and Consular Agents of each of the Contracting Parties residing in the Dominions and Possessions of the other, shall receive from the local authorities such assistance as can by law be given to them for the recovery of deserters from the vessels of their respective countries.

ARTICLE V.

All vessels which according to British law are to be deemed British vessels, and all vessels which according to the laws prevailing in the States of His Imperial and Royal Anostolic Majesty, are to be deemed vessels belonging to the subjects of His Imperial and Royal Apostolic Majesty, shall, for the purposes of this Treaty, be respectively deemed British vessels, and vessels belonging to the citizens of the Imperial and Royal States.

ARTICLE VI.

The present Treaty shall remain in force from the exchange of the ratifications thereof until the 31st December, 1877; and in case neither of the High Contracting Powers shall have notified to the other, twelve months before the expiration of the said period, the intention to put an end to its operation, the (Treaty shall continue in force for another year, and so on from year to year, and the expiration of a year counting from the day on which one or other of the High Contracting Parties shall have announced its intention to put an end to it.

ARTICLE VII.

The present Treaty shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Vienna, within eight weeks, or sooner if possible.

Committee of Management.

1. The civil affairs of the troop shall be conducted by a committee of six, consisting of the captain, one lieutenant, one serjeant, one corporal, and two privates.

2. The members of committee, under the rank of captain, shall remain in oilice until the 31-t of December in each year (subject to the rules), when a re-election of members shall take place; the former members being eligible for re-election.

3. Any vacancy that may occur during the year amongst the members of committee may be filled up by the election of a member of the same rank at the next ensuing meeting of the committee.

4. The commanding officer of the troop shall have power to dispense with the services of any member of committee who shall fail to attend two consecutive ordinary meetings without

16. Every candidate for admission to the troop shall send to the commanding officer an application in writing, stating his name, age, height, occupation, and address. 17. Every member shall be responsible for the good order of his arms, accourtements, and uniform, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him; the result of accidents only excepted.

19. No new member shall be permitted to wear the uniform of the troop until he has gone through six mounted and six dismounted parades, or has been dismissed from recruit drill.

21. At every such half-yearly meeting, a bahnce-sheets-howing the actual financial position of the troop shall be submitted, and all accounts audited by two members of the troop, who shall be elected at the first general meeting in each year.

22. All fines, penalties, and forfeitures incurred under the provisions of these rules shall be recoverable in a summary manner before any one or more justice or justices of the pence sitting in petty sessions, and shall be appropriated to the general fund of the troop.
