Variation, 5° 30' east. High water, F. and C., 5 hours; rise and fall ordinary springs, (8) eight feet.

Notice is hereby given that the lights now exhibited from the Lightship, at the entrance of the Port Adelaide Creek, will be discontinued on the 1st January, 1869, and that a fixed light will be exhibited on the south side of the Outer Bar of the creek in lieu thereof.

The new light, which is of the fourth order, on the catadioptric principle, will be shown from an iron tower, (50) fifty feet above high-water, and will be visible from all points seaward at a distance of (14) fourteen miles in clear weather, from the deck of an ordinary sized ship.

During the prevalence of warm weather, when much refraction exists, the light will be seen at a greater distance than above stated.

The tower is erected near the end of the South Sand, on the south side of the Outer Bar channel, in seven (7) feet water at low-water spring tides.

The navigable channel for large vessels is seventy (70) yards to the northward of the Lighthouse, in which at the present time there is a depth of thirteen (13) feet at low-water ordinary spring tides, the rise and fall at springs being eight (8) feet.

The following sailing directions are published in lieu of those hitherto observed, in consequence of the removal of the Lightship and the erection of the Lighthouse at the Bar:—

Ships having, in conformity to the general directions, cleared Troubridge Shoals, and being in a fair berth for proceeding up the Gulf, should endeavour to make the Lighthouse on a bearing from N.N.E. to N.E. in a heavy ship, carefully avoiding bringing it to the northward of N. by E. in order to avoid the Wonga Shoal, lying to the southward of the jetty.

The most convenient anchorage will be found with the Lighthouse from N. by E. to N.N.E. and the red light on the jetty from E. by S. to E.S.E. In this position it will be found upwards of five (5) fathoms on a sandy bottom.

The pilots now board ships from the jetty, the cutters formerly used being laid up.

The tidal signals now exhibited from the flagstaff at the Semaphore will be shown from a flagstaff on the Lighthouse platform.

The signals are as follow:—

TIDE SIGNALS.

For the Inner Bar of Port Adelaide, as exhibited from the Port Adelaide Lighthouse.

- 10ft.—A ball on the quarter of the south yard arm.
- 11ft.—A ball on the quarter of the north yard arm.
- 12ft.—A ball at the south yard arm.
- 13ft.—A ball at the north yard arm.
- 14ft.—A ball at the south yard arm, and a ball at the mast head.
- 15ft.—A ball at the north yard arm, and a ball at the mast head.
- 16ft.—Two balls at the south yard arm.
- 17ft.—Two balls at the north yard arm.
- 18ft.—A ball at the quarter, and a ball at the south yard arm.
- 19ft.—A ball at the quarter, and a ball at the north yard arm.
- 20ft.—A ball at each yard arm.
- 21ft.—Two balls on the quarter of the south yard arm.
- 22ft.—Two balls on the quarter of the north yard arm.
- 23ft.—A ball on the quarter of each yard arm.

For additional inches over any of the preceding signals numeral flags in Commercial Code will be hoisted where best seen, every quarter of an hour on the flood. In the event of vessels of heavy draught proceeding down the river, the signals will be made until the vessel anchors or passes the "Inner Bar."

EXAMPLE.

19ft 3in.—A ball at the quarter, and a ball at the north yard arm, with numeral flags V. W. J. at south yard arm.

High-water.—A square red flag under the outer ball, exhibited at either yard arm. When, as in the case of the twenty feet signal, balls are exhibited at both yard arms, the red flag (high-water signal) will be hoisted at the mast head.

Low-water.—A square blue flag, under the outer ball, at either yard arm.

The above signals will be kept flying from the time the tidal wave appears stationary until the signal next after high or low water has been made.

WARDS OF THE BOROUGH OF ST. KILDA.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-third day of November, 1868.

WHEREAS by *The Municipal Corporations Act 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of councillors for any original or proclaimed borough (hereinafter sometimes called in common "single borough") the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in such borough, within three months after the receipt of the same, divide the borough into three separate wards by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of such wards shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made upon or within thirty days before any day appointed for holding any annual election of councillors in or for such borough: And whereas the Governor has received a petition signed by not less than one-fourth of the number of persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the borough of St. Kilda, praying that the said borough may be divided into three wards: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by this present Order divide the said borough of St. Kilda into three separate wards, by the names hereby assigned to the same respectively and with the several boundaries hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

NORTH WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of the centre of the Dandenong road by the centre of the Orrong road; thence by a line passing through the centre of the last-named road, bearing southerly to the centre of Inkerman road; thence by a line passing through the centre of that road, bearing westerly to the centre of Barkly street; thence by a line passing through the centre of that street, bearing northerly to a point bearing west from the centre of Wellington street; thence by a line passing through the centre of that street, bearing easterly to the centre of Chapel street; thence by a line passing through the centre of that street, bearing southerly to the centre of the Dandenong road aforesaid; and thence by a line passing through the centre of that road, bearing easterly to the point of commencement.

SOUTH WARD.—Commencing at the intersection of the centre of Inkerman road by the centre of the Orrong road; thence by a line passing through the centre of the last-named road, bearing southerly to the centre of the Glen Huntly road; thence by a line passing through the centre of that road, bearing westerly to the centre of Barkly street; thence by a line passing through the centre of that street, bearing northerly to a point bearing west from the centre of Inkerman road aforesaid; and thence by a line passing through the centre of that road, bearing easterly to the point of commencement.

WEST WARD.—Commencing at the south angle of the borough of Emerald Hill, being a point on the eastern shore of Port Phillip Bay; thence by a line bearing N. 26° 15' E. sixteen chains ninety links to a marked post; thence by a line bearing N. 57° E. fifty-eight chains to a marked post, on the western side of the road from Melbourne to Brighton; thence by a line crossing that road, and bearing easterly to a point formed by the junction of the centre of High street with the eastern side of the said road; thence by a line passing through the centre of High street, bearing easterly to the centre of the Punt road; thence by a line passing through the centre of that road and the centre of Barkly street, bearing southerly to the aforesaid eastern shore of Port Phillip Bay; and thence by that shore bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PETITION UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863."
GIPPSLAND DISTRICT.

A PETITION has been presented to the Governor, bearing eleven signatures of persons representing themselves to be residents of Rosedale and its vicinity.

The petitioners state that they are desirous of having the area which they describe as follows constituted a Road District, viz:—

Commencing at the junction with the La Trobe River of a creek forming the eastern boundary of Mr. E. Crook's Holy Plain run, by that creek southwardly to Merriman's Creek, by Merriman's Creek westwardly to its source; thence by a line bearing westwardly to the Morewell River, by that river northwardly to its junction with the La Trobe River, by the La Trobe River eastwardly to the junction of the Tyers River; thence by a line bearing about north-east to the north-west corner of allotment (122) one hundred and twenty-two, parish of Poon-gabbie; thence by a line bearing north to the Thomson River, by that river in a south-eastwardly direction to its junction with the La Trobe River, and by the La Trobe River westwardly to the point of commencement.

They further state that the said area contains above forty square miles, and rateable property of not less annual value than five thousand pounds.

Finally, they declare their desire that the said area be proclaimed a Road District under the said Act.

The Governor has been pleased to order that the said Petition be taken into consideration by his Executive Council on Monday, the fifteenth day of January, 1869.

REGULATIONS AFFECTING VINEYARD-STILLS.

THE accompanying Regulations affecting Vineyard-stills, which have been approved by the Governor in Council, are published for general information.

Distillation Act 25 Vic., No. 147.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT 25 VICT. NO. 147, SECT. 165, TO BE OBSERVED BY THE LICENSEES OF STILLS FOR THE MANUFACTURE OF SPIRITS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FORTIFYING COLONIAL WINE.

1. The still for which a license has been granted, together with all the appurtenances thereof, shall be erected, set-up, and kept in a secure room or building, which shall be used solely for the purposes of distillation, and shall be provided with proper locks and fastenings, so that the same, if necessary, may be securely locked to the satisfaction of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, or of an officer acting on his behalf.

2. Every proprietor of vineyard licensed to distil spirits for fortifying his wine shall keep on the premises for which he is so licensed a book or diary, to be specially used for the purpose, in which shall be entered a record of all proceedings connected with such distillation—the dates on which the still may have been in use, the quantity of spirits made on such day and the strength thereof, and the manner in which the spirits so distilled may have been disposed of; and shall, when required by an inspector or other officer of distilleries, produce or deliver such book or diary for his inspection; and shall also, at least three days previous to using the said still, at any time forward by post, or deliver to the inspector or other officer of distilleries stationed nearest to his premises as before mentioned, a notice stating the date on which he intends to commence distillation and the period during which he intends to carry it on.

3. The cellar or store-room required by the 13th and 18th sections of the Act to be provided for the storage of spirits shall be kept for that purpose only, and no other liquid of any kind except spirits made at the licensed still shall be deposited therein. If a portion of the wine cellar is used for the purpose, such portion shall be securely partitioned off, so as to be capable of being securely locked if necessary, and no other liquid than spirits shall be kept therein.

4. All casks containing spirits so distilled shall have the word "spirits," and the quantity contained therein, legibly painted on the head thereof; and shall be so placed that easy access may at any time be obtained thereto by an officer of distilleries.

5. On the last day of each quarter, viz., 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December in each year, a tabulated summary of the spirit made and used shall be entered in the book or diary before mentioned; and such summary shall agree with the return required to be made, and forwarded to the Chief Inspector of Distilleries within ten days after the expiration of each quarter, in accordance with the 10th and 20th sections of the Distillation Act.

6. Any breach of these regulations will render the licensee of a still used for vineyard purposes liable to have his license suspended or annulled, under the provisions of the 23rd section of the Distillation Act.

Sir,—I transmit to you a copy of a Letter from the Board of Trade, enclosing an extract of a Report, 7th August, 1868, from the Commissioner of Customs, relative to the examination of goods on transshipment as a means of more effectually preventing the forgery of Trade Marks, and I have to request that you will issue such instructions as may be necessary on this subject to the customs officers within your Government.

Sir,—I am directed by the Lords of the Committee of Privy Council for Trade to transmit to you, to be laid before the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the enclosed extract of a Report that has been received from the Commissioners of Customs relative to the examination of goods on transshipment as a means of more effectually preventing the forgery of Trade Marks, and to submit, for the Duke of Buckingham's consideration, the advisability of issuing instructions to the customs officers in the British colonies, as suggested by the Commissioners of Customs.

Extract from Report of Commissioners of Customs, dated
28th July, 1868.

"We would, however, submit, for your lordship's consideration, whether the attention of the customs officers in the British colonies might not be called to the provisions of the 161st section of the Customs Consolidation Act 1853, rendering liable to forfeiture any articles of foreign manufacture, and packages of such articles bearing any names, brands, or marks being or purporting to be the names, brands, or marks of manufacturers in the United Kingdom, and to the 10th section of the Act of the last session of Parliament, 30 and 31 Vic. cap. 82, which requires the person entering goods in transit through this country to furnish a duplicate shipping bill containing the particulars of such goods, and, as those duplicate shipping bills are sent with the papers of the ship in which the goods are imported into the British possessions abroad, the revenue officers there are thereby afforded the means of knowing the origin of the goods, and of seizing any foreign goods bearing British marks, which may be imported in the respective colonies: and we would further submit whether your lordships may not think fit to communicate with Her Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, with a view to the necessary instructions being issued accordingly."
