REGISTRAR-GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1868.

A CTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keilor, Borcondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade at the Melbourne Observatory, calculated upon a reduced mean corresponding with that of twenty-four hourly observations taken on each day during the month of Ootober, 1868:—

The mortality in October was above an average extending over nine years, but not excessively so if the increase of population during the period be taken into account. The mean temperature was higher by half a degree then the average.

Fifty-seven per cent. of those who died were males and 43 per cent. were females. Forty-five per cent. had not attained their fifth year against 40 per cent. in October, 1867; 51 per cent. in October, 1866; 52 per cent. in October, 1865; 41 per cent. in October, 1864; 37 per cent. in October, 1863; 40 per cent. in October, 1862; 51 per cent. in October, 1861; and 63 per cent. in October, 1860.

Eighteen deaths took place on the 28th, and 16 on the 7th. These were the days of highest mortality. Only 4 deaths occurred on the 6th, 10th, 11th, and 17th, which were the days of the lowest.

A male, said to have reached the advanced age of 92 years, died of bronchitis. This is the only person over 75 years of age whose death was reported during the month.

Thirteen violent deaths took place in the month, of which 8 were referred to accident, 2 to murder or manslaughter, and 3 suicide. The following are the particulars:—A carter aged 22 died from being passed over by a cart wheel, a male aged 68 died from injuries caused by a horse running away, a boy aged 10 was accidentally drowned in the Yarra, a seaman aged 22 was drowned in the Yarra whilst drunk, a clerk aged 24 was drowned in the Yarra by the drunk; a clerk aged 24 was drowned in the Yarra by the form aged 38 was found drowned in the Yarra, a gardener aged 65 was drowned at St. Kilda, a new-born infant was wilfully sufficiented, a schoolboy aged 10 died from the effects of a blow, a tinsmith aged 45 died from the effects of a self-inflicted wound in the abdomen, a plumber aged 40 drowned himself in the Yarra whilst laboring under insanity, an actress aged 20 poisoned herself with laudanum.

Forty-seven deaths or nearly 18 per cent. of the whole occurred in charitable institutions, viz.: 31 in Melbourne Hospital, 2 in the Lying-in Hospital, 4 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Immigrants' Home, 1 in the Industrial Schools, 1 in the Carlton Lunatic Asylum, and 4 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages according to the last census, the number of deaths of persons under and over five years of age, the total at all ages, and the number of deaths to every 1,000 of the population, during the month of October, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

• This calculation is made upon the population at the last census, instead of the present population, as there are no means of estimating the changes which have taken place in the different sub-districts since the census was taken. It is believed that the present population of the whole district of Melbourne and suburbs amounts to 170,000. If this be correct, the mortality of the month under review would indicate a proportion of 1.55 deaths to every 1,000 persons living.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 120, of which 68, or nearly 57 per cent., were of males, and 52, or about 43 per cent., were of females. Of those dying, 67 were under one year of age, 16 were between one and two years, 18 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 144, of which 83, or nearly 58 per cent., were males, and 61, or about 42 per cent., were females; 12 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 10 were between twenty and twenty-five, 12 were between twenty-five and thirty, 15 were between thirty and thirty-five, 15 were between thirty-five and fifty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty 9 were between fifty and fifty-five, 8 were between fifty and fifty-five, 18 were between fifty and fifty-five, 18 were between sixty and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy, 4 were between seventy and seventy.

Zymotic diseases caused 58 deaths in September, and 69 in t'Ae month under review. This increase is easily accounted for by the fact that scarlatina and diphtheria resulted fatally in 17 instances in the former month, and in no less than 33 instances in the latter. Phthisis caused only 25 deaths in October, which is, the smallest number recorded for any month since last April in respect to that disease.
