**BOWMAN'S FOREST PUBLIC CEMETERY.**  
**REGULATIONS MADE BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE PUBLIC**  
**CEMETERY ESTABLISHED AT BOWMAN'S FOREST.**

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees, in Bowman's Forest, between the hours of ten a.m. and five p.m. the previous day.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the time appointed for the funeral.
5. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
6. Application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument to be made to the trustees.
7. Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.
8. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, grave-stones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a copy of every epitaph must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair must be removed by the order of the trustees, without notice to the owner.
13. A plan of the cemetery and register will be kept.
14. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
15. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor; and being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed by 35 section of *The Cemeteries Statute 1864*.
16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery when fenced.
17. The trustees reserve the right to recommend any alteration, from time to time, in these regulations.

**SUPREME COURT—CRIMINAL SESSIONS.**
