NOTICE TO MARINERS.—[No. 87.]

AUSTRALIA, EAST COAST, NEW SOUTH WALES.—TEMPORARY FIXED LIGHTS AT BROKEN BAY.

THE Colonial Government of New South Wales has given notice that, from the 20th day of July, 1868, two temporary lights, called Stewart's lights, would be exhibited on Barrenjuey, the inner South headland of Broken Bay.

The lights are fixed white lights, bearing E.S.E. and W.N.W. from each other, distant 390 yards: the higher one is elevated

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347 feet, and the lower one 315 feet, above high-water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of about 12 miles.

Both lights will be eclipsed from seaward between the bearings North to N.N.W. & W., to prevent them from being seen over the land, which recedes from the outer South head, and also to ensure a vessel passing a safe distance off the South head by keeping the lights in sight when running for Broken Bay.

The lower or outer light will be lost sight of in rounding Barrenjuey, but the upper light will be a good guide for coasters bound to Pitt water, or for large vessels wishing to obtain shelter in Flint and Steel Bay.

SOUTH COAST, VICTORIA.—BUOY ON NICHOLSON'S KNOLL, PORT PHILLIP.

The Colonial Government of Victoria has given notice that, in consequence of the bank, known as Nicholson's Knoll, having extended in a southerly direction, a second buoy, chequered black and white, has been moored to mark its southern extremity.

The distance between the two buoys is about one and a half cables, and there is an average depth of not less than 19 feet between them.

SPENCER'S GULF.—ALTERATION OF LIGHTS OFF TIPARA SHOAL.

The Colonial Government of South Australia has given notice that, on or about the 31st day of January, 1869, the lights at present exhibited from the light vessel off Tipara Shoal, Spencer's Gulf, will be replaced by others.

The lights will be two fixed white lights, elevated 33 and 29 feet above the water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles.

The illuminating apparatus will be catoptric, or by reflectors. Also, that further notice will be given when the precise date of the alteration can be stated.

[All bearings are magnetic. Variation, 10° easterly in 1868.]

THE GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICTS WITHIN VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS
MANNERS SUTTON, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke all previous Proclamations defining or appointing the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden within Victoria; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which such courts shall in future have jurisdiction as hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

ALBERTON GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing on the Buncup river, at a point one mile south of its intersection by the road from Melbourne to Sale; thence by the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington bearing southerly to Bass' Strait; thence by that Strait bearing south-easterly to Wilson's Promontory; thence by the shores of the Southern Ocean and Corner Inlet bearing northerly and north-easterly to the mouth of Merriman's Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-westerly to the south boundary of the town of Giffard; thence by the south and west boundaries of that town bearing respectively west and north to the said creek; thence by that creek bearing north-westerly to the east boundary of the town of Stradbroke; thence by the east, south, and west boundaries of that town bearing respectively south, west, and north to the said creek; thence again by that creek bearing north-westerly to its source; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the south-east angle of the town of Traralgon; thence by a line running parallel with, and one mile southerly from, the aforesaid road from Melbourne to Sale bearing westerly to the point of commencement: Including Snake and Sunday Islands, and the small islands near Corner Inlet and Wilson's Promontory.

ARARAT GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the town of Navarre; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to a point bearing south two miles from the south-east angle of the town of Stawell; thence by a line bearing west to the Glenelg River; thence by that river bearing south-easterly to its source in the Sierra Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to Mount Abrupt; thence by the line forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Villiers bearing east to Back Creek; thence by that creek bearing south-easterly to the Hopkins River; thence by that river bearing north-easterly to the line forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Hampden; thence by that line bearing east to Lake Boloke; thence by the south-eastern shore of that lake bearing north-easterly to the mouth of Fiery Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to the line forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Hampden; thence by that line bearing east to Mount Emu Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to the south boundary of the town of Skipton; thence by the south, west, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively west, north, and east; thence again by the Mount Emu Creek bearing north-easterly to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing westerly to the range dividing the waters of the Avoca and Wimmera Rivers; thence by that range bearing north-westerly to a point bearing east from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing west.

BALLARAT GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of Mount Emu Creek, in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that creek bearing south-westerly to the north boundary of the town of Skipton; thence by the north, west, and south boundaries of that town bearing respectively west, south, and east to the said creek; thence again by that creek bearing south-westerly to the road from the northern boundary of the parish of Borriyalloak; thence by that road and the road from Skipton to Pitfield bearing south-easterly to the road forming part of the boundary between the counties of Hampden and Grenville; thence by that road and the Gnarkeet Creek bearing southerly to the south boundary of the Gnarkeet pre-emptive section; thence by a line bearing easterly to Mount Mercer; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the junction of the east and west branches of the Moorabool River; thence by the said east branch of that river bearing north-easterly to a point bearing west from the south-west angle of the town of Ballan; thence to the said angle of that town by a line bearing east; thence by the south and east boundaries thereof, bearing respectively east and north; thence by the north boundary thereof and a line bearing west to the Werribee River; thence by that river bearing north-westerly to its source in the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-westerly to the Tullaroop Creek; thence by a line bearing west to the road forming the west boundary of the parish of Clunes; thence by that road bearing south to the Great Dividing Range aforesaid; and thence by that range bearing north-westerly to the point of commencement.

BRECHWORTH GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Seven Creeks with the Goulburn River; thence by those creeks bearing south-easterly to the north boundary of the town of Mielpoll; thence by the north, east, and south boundaries of that town bearing respectively east, south, and west to the said creeks; thence again by those creeks bearing southerly to Faithful's Creek; thence by that creek bearing south-easterly to its source; thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Mount Barranhet; thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Mount Selwyn, on the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing north-easterly to Mount Smyth; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the junction of the Inomungee River with the Mitta-mitta River; thence by a line bearing easterly to Forest Hill, on the Great Dividing Range; thence to the source of the Murray River; thence by that river bearing northerly and westerly to a point bearing north from the north-west angle of the town of Shepparton, on the Goulburn River; thence to the said angle of that town by a line bearing south; thence by the north, east, and south boundaries of that town bearing respectively east, south, and west to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river bearing southerly to the point of commencement.

BELFAST GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at Mount Abrupt, on the Sierra Range; thence by the line forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Villiers bearing east to Back Creek; thence by that creek bearing south-easterly to the Hopkins River; thence by that river bearing north-easterly to the line forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Hampden; thence by that line bearing east to Lake Boloke; thence by the south-eastern shore of that lake bearing north-easterly to the mouth of Fiery Creek; thence by that creek north-easterly to the line forming the boundary between the counties of Ripon and Hampden; thence by that line bearing east to the road from Streatham to Warrnambool; thence by that road bearing south-westerly to the east boundary of the town of Hexham; thence by the east and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north and west; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the north-west angle of the town of Woolsthorpe; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the north-east angle of the town of Kirkstall; thence by the east boundary of that town and a line bearing south to the shore of the Southern Ocean; thence by that shore bearing westerly to the western shore of Lake Yambuk; thence by that lake and the Eumeralla River bearing north-westerly and northerly to the west boundary of the town of Macarthur; thence by the west, north, and east boundaries of that town bearing respectively north, east, and south to the Eumeralla River; thence again by that river bearing north-easterly to a point bearing west from the south-west angle of the town of Penshurst; thence by a line and the south boundary of that town bearing east; thence by the east and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north and west to the road from Penshurst to Dunkeld; thence by that road and the road from Dunkeld to Cavendish bearing northerly and north-westerly to the north-western boundary of the county of Villiers; and thence by the said boundary of that county bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement.

BENDIGO GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Bet-bet Creek with the Loddon River; thence by that river bearing northerly to the south boundary of the town of Newbridge; thence by the south, east, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively east, north, and west to the said river; thence again by that river bearing northerly to the south-west angle of allotment 4 of section 3, parish of Kerang; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the south-west angle of the Lalbert pre-emptive section, being a point on the eastern margin of Lalbert Swamp; thence by a line bearing north to the Murray River; thence by that river bearing south-easterly to the Yaluk Creek; thence by that creek and the Nannilla Creek bearing south-westerly to the eastern margin of Kow Swamp; thence by the said margin of that swamp bearing southerly and westerly to Mount Hope Creek; thence by that creek and the Piccaniny Creek bearing southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 56, parish of Minto; thence by the south boundary of the parishes of Minto and Diggora bearing east to the western boundary of the town of Elmore; thence by the western and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north-easterly and east to the south-east angle of allotment 47, parish of Diggora; thence by the road forming the north-western boundary of the Melbourne and Murray River Railway bearing north-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 29; thence by a line crossing that railway and bearing easterly to the north angle of allotment 4; thence by the road forming the north-eastern boundary of that allotment and of the Burnewang pre-emptive section bearing south-easterly to the Campaspe River; thence by that river bearing north-easterly to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of allotment 2, parish of Burnewang; thence to the said angle of that allotment by a line bearing east; thence by the road from Runnymede to Shepparton bearing easterly to the west angle of allotment 3, parish of Mooroopna; thence by the south-western boundary of that allotment bearing south-easterly one chain forty-four links to the Goulburn River; thence, by that river bearing south-westerly to the north-east angle of the Shire of McIvor, being a point bearing due east from Mount Camel; thence by the north boundary of that shire, being a line bearing west to the Campaspe River aforesaid; thence by that river bearing southerly to the Coliban River; thence by that river bearing south-westerly to Myrtle Creek; thence by that creek bearing westerly and south-westerly to its source in the Mount Alexander Range; thence by that range bearing northerly to Mount Prospect; and thence by a line bearing westerly to the point of commencement.

BET-BET GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Bet-bet Creek with the Loddon River; thence by that river bearing south-easterly to the Loddon

Creek; thence by that creek and the Middle Creek bearing south-westerly to the road from Newstead to Craigie; thence by that road bearing westerly to the Tullaroop Creek; thence by that creek bearing southerly to the Bullarook Creek; thence by a line bearing west to the road forming the west boundary of the parish of Clunes; thence by that road bearing south to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing north-westerly to the range dividing the waters of the Avoca and Wimmera Rivers; thence by that range bearing north-westerly to a point bearing west from a point situated half-way between Redbank and Moonambel; thence by a line passing through the last-named point bearing east to the Bet-bet Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement.

CASTLEMAINE GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Myrtle Creek with the Coliban River; thence by that creek bearing westerly and south-westerly to its source in the Mount Alexander Range; thence by that range bearing northerly to Mount Prospect; thence by a line bearing westerly to the junction of the Bet-bet Creek with the Loddon River; thence by that river bearing south-easterly to the Loddon Creek; thence by that creek and the Middle Creek bearing south-westerly to the road from Newstead to Craigie; thence by that road bearing easterly to the west boundary of the parish of Strangways; thence by the west and south boundaries of that parish bearing respectively south and east to the west boundary of the parish of Guildford; thence by the west and south boundaries of that parish bearing respectively south and east to the west boundary of the parish of Fryers; thence by the west, south, and east boundaries of that parish bearing respectively south, east, and north to the south-west angle of the parish of Elphinstone; thence by the south boundary of that parish bearing east to the Coliban River aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement.

DAYLESFORD GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing on the Tullaroop Creek, at the point where it is crossed by the road from Newstead to Craigie; thence by that road bearing easterly to the west boundary of the parish of Strangways; thence by the west and south boundaries of that parish bearing respectively south and east to the west boundary of the parish of Guildford; thence by the west and south boundaries of that parish bearing respectively south and east to the west boundary of the parish of Fryers; thence by the west and south boundaries of that parish bearing respectively south and east to the range dividing the waters of the Loddon and Coliban rivers; thence by that range bearing southerly to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to the source of the Bullarook Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-westerly to the Tullaroop Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek bearing northerly to the point of commencement.

EDUCA GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Yalak Creek with the Murray River; thence by that creek and the Nannilla Creek bearing south-westerly to the eastern margin of Kow Swamp; thence by the said margin of that swamp bearing southerly and westerly to Mount Hope Creek; thence by that creek and Piccanniny Creek bearing southerly to the south-west angle of allotment 56, parish of Minto; thence by the road forming the south boundary of the parishes of Minto and Diggorra bearing east to the western boundary of the town of Elmore; thence by the western and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively northerly and east to the south-east angle of allotment 47, parish of Diggorra; thence by the road forming the north-western boundary of the Melbourne and Murray River Railway bearing north-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 29; thence by a line crossing that railway and bearing easterly to the north angle of allotment 4; thence by that allotment and the Burnewang pre-emptive section bearing south-easterly to the Campaspe River; thence by that river bearing north-easterly to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of allotment 2, parish of Burnewang; thence to the said angle of that allotment by a line bearing east; thence by the road from Runnymede to Shepparton bearing easterly to the west angle of allotment 3, parish of Mooropna; thence by the south-west boundary of that allotment bearing south-easterly one chain forty-four links to the Goulburn River; thence by that river bearing north-easterly to the south boundary of the town of Shepparton; thence by the south, east, and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively east, north, and west to the Goulburn River; thence by a line bearing north to the Murray River aforesaid; and thence by that river bearing westerly to the point of commencement.

GEELONG GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing on the shore of the Southern Ocean at the mouth of the Gellibrand River; thence by that river bearing north-easterly to its source; thence by a range to the source of the Pirron Yalak Creek; thence by that creek bearing north-westerly and north-easterly to Lake Corangamite (the river, range, and creek aforesaid being the boundary between the counties of Heytesbury and Polwarth); thence by the western shore of the said lake bearing northerly to the west boundary of the town of Roxhove; thence by the west and north boundaries of that town bearing respectively north and east to the Gnarket Creek; thence by that creek bearing northerly to the Gnarket pre-emptive section; thence by a line bearing easterly to Mount Mercer; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the junction of the eastern and western branches of the Moorabool River; thence by the said eastern branch of that river bearing north-easterly to a point bearing west from the south-west angle of the town of Ballan; thence to the said angle of that town by a line bearing east; thence by the south and east boundaries thereof bearing respectively east and north to the Werribee River; thence by that river bearing south-easterly to the north boundary of the town of Wyndham; thence by the north, west, and south boundaries of that town bearing respectively west, south, and

east to the Werribee River; thence again by that river bearing south-easterly to Port Phillip Bay; and thence by the shores of Port Phillip, Geelong, Corio, and Swan Bays bearing south-westerly, easterly, and southerly to Point Lonsdale; and thence by the aforesaid shore of the Southern Ocean bearing south-westerly and north-westerly to the point of commencement.

HAMILTON GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing on the south-eastern shore of Lake Hindmarsh, at the mouth of the Wimmera River; thence by that river bearing southerly to Norton's Creek; thence by that creek bearing southerly to its source; thence by a line bearing south-easterly to the Glenelg River; thence by that river bearing south-easterly to its source in the Sierra Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly to Mount Sturgeon; thence by the north-west boundary of the county of Villiers bearing south-westerly to the road from Caveendish to Dunkeld; thence by that road and the road from Dunkeld to Penshurst bearing southerly to the north boundary of the town of Penshurst; thence by the north, east, and south boundaries of that town bearing respectively east, south, and west to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing west to the Eumeralla River; thence by a line bearing westerly to the south-east angle of the town of Branholme; thence by the south boundary of that town bearing west; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the south-east angle of the town of Digby; thence by the south boundary of that town bearing west; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the north-east angle of the Runnymede pre-emptive section, being a point on the Glenelg River; thence by that river bearing northerly to the south boundary of the town of Casterton; thence by the south and west boundaries of that town bearing respectively west and north to the Glenelg River; thence again by that river bearing north-westerly to Power's Creek; thence by that creek bearing northerly to the north boundary of the county of Follett; thence by the said boundary of that county bearing westerly to the boundary line between the colonies of Victoria and South Australia; thence by that boundary line bearing north to a point bearing west from a point on the southernmost extremity of Lake Hindmarsh aforesaid; thence to that point by a line bearing east; and thence by the south-eastern shore of that lake bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement.

JAMISON GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of Gaffney's Creek with the Goulburn River; thence by that creek bearing south-westerly to Moonlight Creek; thence by that creek bearing south-westerly to its source in the range dividing the waters of the Goulburn and Big Rivers; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to a point on the Big River one mile below Enoch's Point; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to Mount Arnold; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the Survey Peak; thence by a line bearing northerly to Mount Paradox on the Puzzle Range; thence by that range bearing north-westerly to the Strathbogie Range; thence by that range bearing north-easterly to Mount Barranhet; thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Mount Selwyn on the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range bearing south-westerly and south-easterly to a point bearing east from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing west.

KILMORE GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Seven Creeks with the Goulburn River; thence by those creeks bearing south-easterly to the north boundary of the town of Miepoll; thence by the north, east, and south boundaries of that town bearing respectively east, south, and west to the said creeks; thence again by those creeks bearing southerly to Faithfull's Creek; thence by that creek bearing south-easterly to its source; thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Mount Barranhet; thence by the Strathbogie Range bearing south-westerly to the Puzzle Range; thence by that range bearing south-easterly to Mount Paradox; thence by a line bearing southerly to the Survey Peak; thence by a line bearing south-easterly to Mount Arnold; thence by the Great Dividing Range bearing westerly to Mount Disappointment; thence by a line bearing westerly to Mount Diogenes; thence by the Great Dividing Range bearing north-easterly to a point bearing south from Mount Koala; thence to that point by a line bearing north; thence by a line bearing north-easterly to the junction of Hughes' Creek with the Goulburn River; and thence by that river, bearing north-easterly to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862* it is amongst other things enacted that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold-field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common, respectively, as the case may be: And whereas by *The Amending Land Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common

theretofore or thereafter to be proclaimed or reproclaimed, and may from time to time re proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of *The Land Act 1862* and the now reciting Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Acts, that is to say:—
