DRAINAGE BYE-LAW.

A T a Meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Maryborough, begun and holden at Maryborough, in the said district, on the twelfth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, it is ordained by the said Board as follows, that is to say:—

Repealing clause—The bye-law of the Maryborough Mining District of the seventeenth of September, One thousand eight bundred and sixty-six, for regulating the drainage of quartz reefs, shall be and the same is breeby repealed and rescinded, and the following enacted in lieu theref:—

- and the following enacted in lieu therei:

 1. Interpretation clause.—For the purposes of this bye-law the word "claim" shall apply to and include any ground held under miners' rights, or under any gold mining or mineral lease. The words "owner" or "owners" of any draining machinery, shall include the mortgagee in possession, and the person or persons to whom any claim or any draining machinery erected thereon shall have been let on tribute or otherwise. The words "draining machinery" shall apply only to any appliances used, or that may be used, for the purposes of raising or lifting water from any claim or claims by horse or steam power. The words "datum water-level" shall mean the approximate depth from the surface at which the water was first struck, or met with, on the line of reef. "Efficient drainage" shall mean such drainage as enables the owner or owners of any claim within a drainage area to carry on operations for all practicable working purposes in such claim or claims below the datum water-level.

 2. Application for a grant of a drainage area, how to be
- carry on operations for all practicable working purposes in such claim or claims below the datum water-level.

 2. Application for a grant of a drainage area, how to be made.—The owner or owners of any draining machinery, erected or about to be erected on any reef or on the line of any reef, or where two or more drainage plants are erected on any reef or on the line of any reef, then the owners of such drainage plants in conjunction, and which is or are employed in drawing or lifting water from any claim or claims thereon, and who are desirous of obtaining a grant of a drainage area, shall evidence the boundaries of the area for which they intend to make application for a grant fourteen (14) clear days at least before making such application hereoting at each angle of the proposed drainage area a post at least three (3) inches square or three (3) inches in diameter, and shall keep such posts standing until their application is granted or refused; and shall make application to the mining board (or a grant of such area in the manner hereimafter following:—They shall lodge with the clerk of the mining board, at least ten (10) days previous to any meeting of the board at which such application shall be considered, an application containing the matter and in the form of the schedule hereunto annexed marked A; and shall also at the same time deposit with the clerk of the mining board, a plan upon such a scale as may from time to time be prescribed by the Governor in Council for the survey of mining tenements, showing the exact position of all shafts then being used for mining operations upon such claims within the area applied for; and also showing the exact position of the draining machinery belonging to the application shall be considered, a duplicate copy of their application, and also a notice in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed (marked B), provided that were the owner or owners of such claim or claims as aforesaid cannot be found, it shall be considered (marked B), provided that were the owner or owners

Objections to the issuing of a grant for a drainage area, how to be made.—The owner or owners of any claim, or the manager of any registered company holding or owning a claim or claims, within any area for which application for a grant is made, who may be desirous of objecting to the issuing of such grant, or to the sum at which his or their claim or claims are proposed to be assessed, shall do so in the manner hereinafter following:—They shall four (4) clear days at least before the sitting of the mining board at which such application as aforesaid shall be considered, lodge with the clerk of the mining board, and also with the applicants, a notice of their objection to such grant, specifying particularly the grounds or grounds of their objection and no other ground or grounds of objection to the granting of the area applied for shall be allowed on the consideration of the application by the mining board other than those specified in such notice. such notice.

 4. Mining board to deal with applications and objections.—The mining board at the time appointed shall proceed to consider upon any application for a grant of a drainage area, and any objections thereto as aforesaid, and may hear and take any evidence with respect to such application or objections as may be tendered by any person being the owner or owners of the draining machinery or of any claim or claims within the proposed area, who shall have duly complied with the foregoing conditions, or by any person duly authorized on that behalf; and shall then grant, refuse, or adjourn the consideration of such application, and may, if such application be granted, make such variation in the boundaries of the area applied for, by excising any claim or claims included therein, or in the amount of assessment upon any claim or claims included therein, as it may in its discretion think fit; or may where objection is taken by the owner or owners of any claim within such area to the amount of assessment upon their claim, with the consent of both the applicant or applicants, and object or objectors, if it think fit, refer the matter of assessment to arbitration in accordance with the section of the bye-laws of this district relating to arbitration in general; and shall in that case adjourn the further consideration of such application and objections to its next sitting, provided that the neglect of the applicant to appoint an arbitrator within seven (7) days after notice has been given him so to do by the clerk of the board; or the neglect of the objector or objectors to appoint an arbitrator within seven (7) days after notice has been given him so to do by the clerk of the board; or the neglect on the part of the objector or objectors, then the mining board may deal with such application as it may in its discretion think fit; and upon the granting of a drainage area, a certificate of such grant, in the form in the schedule hereunto appended (marked D

 5. Grants for drainage areas to be registered.—Upon the receipt of any such certificate as aforesaid, the owner or owners thereof shall, within ten (10) days at most after the date of such certificate, register the same with the mining registers for the division in which the drainage area for which such certificate of a grant is issued, is situated, and such mining registrar shall, on being requested, and on being shown such certificate of a grant as aforesaid, and on a copy of the same being lodged with him, register the same on payment of five shillings, and shall thereon give to the owner or owners thereof a certificate of such registration in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed (marked E), and such certificate of registration shall be taken as prima facie evidence, in any court of competent jurisdiction, that all the conditions precedent to such registration have been fully complied with, provided that any person or persons to whom a certificate of a grant of a drainage area shall have been issued, failing to register such certificate as aforesaid, shall be deemed to have forfeited all right and title thereto.

 6. Owners of any claim in a drainage area, who erect draining

 6. Owners of any claim in a drainage area, who erect draining machinery on their claim, may apply for cancellation of originat grant, and issuing of fresh one in duplicate, apportioning the drainage rates.—The owner or owners of any claim or claims within the boundaries of any drainage area for which a grant shall have been issued and duly registered as aforesaid, and which grant has not afterwards been relinquished, who shall at any time erect draining machinery upon their claim or claims, and commence to draw or lift water therefrom, may make application to the mining board that such grant may be cancelled and a fresh grant issued, apportioning to themselves and to the original holder of such grant such equitable proportion of the draimage rate upon the claims included within such drainage area as the mining board may in its discretion think fit, provided that seven (7) days at least before the sitting of the mining board at which such application shall be considered, a notice, duly signed by the applicants, stating their intention to make such application, shall be left with the owner or owners of such original grant; provided further that every such application for the cancellation of a grant and apportionment of the assessment as aforesaid shall be made in the form in the schedule hereunto annexed (marked P); and the mining board may, if it think fit, on the consideration of such application, dismiss or accede to such application, but if such application be acceded to, may apportion such drainage rate as it may in tig discretion think equitable and just, and in such case a fresh certificate of a grant shall be issued in duplicate in the form prescribed in the schedule appended hereto (marked D), which

certificate of grant, and which duplicate of such certificate, shall be held by the parties respectively to whom such grant is issued; and such certificate and such duplicate shall be registered as prescribed in section 5 of this bye-law, and such certificate of registration shall be taken as primd facie evidence in any court of competent jurisdiction that all the conditions precedent thereto have been fully complied with; and either of such parties failing such registration as prescribed in section 5 of this bye-law shall be deemed to have forfeited all right and title to their portion of such grant; but the neglect of one party to whom such grant in duplicate is issued to register his certificate shall not invalidate the right or title of the other party thereto. party thereto.

Transfer of grant of a drainage area.—The holder or holders of a grant for a drainage area, who shall dispose of his or their interest in the draining machinery erected upon such area may transfer such grant to the person or persons to whom such draining machinery has been disposed of, by each party giving notice, in writing, of their intention to dispose of and to accept of such transfer respectively, to the mining registrar for the division in which such area is situate, in the form in the schedule hereunto appended (marked G); and such mining registrar shall register such transfer and give to the transfere, on payment of five shillings, a certificate of such transfer in the form in the schedule appended hereto (marked H), and no transfer shall be valid unless it can be shown that these conditions have been fully complied with, and upon such transfer being effected the original holder of the grant shall endorse and give such grant to the transferee, who shall then be deemed to be the holder of such grant and entitled to the drainage rates fixed by such grant, as if he were the original holder thereof, provided also that the transferee of such grant shall within seven (7) clear days at most after the transfer of such grant, notify the same to the clerk of the mining board.

Relinquishment of a grant for a drainage area.—The holder or holders of a grant for a drainage area, who may be desirous of relinquishing the same, may do so at any, time on getting the permission in writing of the shareholders, or a majority of the shareholders, in each claim included within the area, or by giving notice in writing to the owners of all claims within the area of his or their intention to relinquish such grant, and to cease draining operations at least two (2) months before such draining operations are eased; failing either of these conditions the holder or holders of such grant shall be held liable for any damage that may accrue to any claim within the area by reason of any stoppage, provided that the holder or holders of such grant shall not be held liable for any damage caused to any claim through the sudden stoppage of his or their machinery requiring repairs, or cleaning, if it can be shown that such stoppage was the result of accident, not caused by culpable negligence or carelessness, or through his or their machinery requiring repairs, or cleaning, if it can be shown that all repairs or cleaning have been made and performed, and drainage resumed with the utmost despatch.

 9. Transferee or mortgagee in possession of a claim in a drain-

Transferee or mortgagee in possession of a claim in a drainage area liable for same amount of rates as transferror or mortgageor.—The transferee or transferees, or the mortgagee or mortgagees, in possession of any claim, or of any share in any claim within the boundaries of any drainage area, granted by the mining board, shall be liable for the same amount of drainage rates as the transferror or transferrors or the mortgagor or mortgagors of such claim or share in such claim were liable for, provided that they shall not be held liable for any amount due at the time of the transfer, or mortgage of such claim or share.
- 10. Drainage rates, when to be paid, and in default, how recoverable.—The amount of drainage rates upon each claim,
 within a drainage area fixed by the mining board, and stated in
 the certificate of grant of such area, shall be the sum which the
 owner or owners of each claim are liable to pay, and shall be paid
 by such owner or owners to the clerk of the mining board, at
 the Mining Board Office, Maryborough, on the first Monday in
 every month; and in default of payment may be recovered in a
 summary manner, as prescribed by The Mining Statute 1865.
- 11. Decision of arbitrators to be given in writing.—In any case where the matter of assessment is referred by the mining board to arbitrators, the decision of the arbitrators shall be given in writing and signed by such arbitrators, and shall be lodged with the clerk of the mining, board, before the next sitting of the mining board after such arbitration.
- 12. Owners of amalgamated claims liable for same amount as they were liable for previous to amalgamation.—Whenever the owners of two or more claims within a drainage area shall amalgamate their respective claims, then the owners of such amalgamate claim shall collectively be liable for the same amount of drainage rates as the owner or owners of such claims so amalgamated were previously liable for respectively.

 13. Efficient drainage.—The holder or holders of a grant of a drainage area shall efficiently drain the claims on the reef or on the line of reef within such area, and shall for that purpose always keep his or their pumping shaft deeper sunk from the datum water-level than the working shaft or shafts of any claim or claims from the owners of which they receive drainage rates, and the owner or owners of any claim or claims within a drainage area whose working shaft is sunk deeper from the datum water-level than that of the holder or holders of the grant for such area, and who in consequence thereof are unable to proceed with their working operations, shall be exempted from the payment of drainage rates until the pumping shaft of the holder or holders of such grant is sunk to a greater depth from said datum water-level than his or their shaft or shafts, when he or they shall be again liable for and pay such drainage rates, provided that such owner or owners of claims as aforesaid shall not be exempted from payment of drainage rates as aforesaid, unless he or they shall have at least fourteen (14) clear days previous to ceasing payment of such drainage rates notified the owner or owners of such grant, in writing, of their intention at the expiration of

such fourteen (14) days to cease payment of drainage rates until the pumping shaft of the owner or owners of such grant is sunk deeper from said datum water-level than his or their shaft or shafts.

- 14. Measurements.—In all measurements of the depth of any shaft or shafts under this bye-law the datum water-level shall be the level from which such measurements shall be estimated.
- 15. Expiration of grant for a drainage area.—No grant for a drainage area shall be in force for a longer period than two (2) years from the date thereof, but the owner or owners of a grant may make application for a fresh grant two (2) months at most before the expiration of the term of his or their grant, in the form prescribed in section two (2) of this bye-law, and in case such fresh grant is issued to him or them it shall come into force and have effect immediately on the expiration of the former
- 16. Rates how to be disbursed -- All sums of money received 16. Rates how to be disbursed.—All sums of money received by the clerk of the mining board on account of drainage rates shall be paid by him into the account of the mining board, at such bank as shall from time to time be fixed by the mining board as the bank at which its account shall be kept, and shall be disbursed to the parties entitled to receive the same, once in every month, in the manner prescribed in the 76th section of The Mining Statute 1865; provided that there shall be deducted from such disbursements the costs of collecting and disbursing the same.

3. No person shall hereafter be qualified to vote at any meeting of contributors, unless, he shall have been a contributor of at least £1 sterling, to this institution for the space of six months, previous to such meeting; provided always that where a contributor shall have paid his subscription for the year "mediately preceding the year in which any public meeting shall take place, the payment of his subscription for the then current year. They shall have access to the hospital at all times; they shall co-operate with the resident surgeon in the performance of all capital surgical operations—but no such operation shall be performed without previous consultations of the medical staff; and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance, or of protracted continuance in the hospital.

ERSIDENT SUBGEON.

26. The resident surgeon shall be a duly qualified medical practitioner, who shall reside on the premises, and shall not be absent therefrom for any unreasonable period without the permission of the general committee. He shall not engage in private practice, except in cases of consultation at the request of other surgeons, and then only provided such consultations will not interfere with his duties as resident surgeon.

PATIENTS.

27. Accidents, and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the resident surgeon, shall be received at any time; and, in ordinary cases, patients shall be received daily (Sunday excepted), at such hours as may be, from time to time, appointed by the general committee, on the recommendation of a contributor of at least £1, countersigned by a member of the committee, who shall certify that such patient is not capable of providing medical attendance.

28. No female for the purpose of confinement, child under seven years of age, insane person, or one affected with any infectious disease, or any person who, in the opinion of the resident surgeon, is unfit to be an indoor patient, shall be received under any circumstances.

29. The general committee may, if necessary, make provision for the reception and treatment of patients laboring undercontagious, infectious, or other diseases excluded under clause. 28, nn. the hospital ground, but at a suitable and safe distance-from the hospital itself.

30. Ministers of religion shall have access to sick persons of their respective denominations at all reasonable times.
