AMENDED RULES OF THE BRIGHTON ARTILLERY CORPS.

1. All members changing their permanent address must, within seven (7) days, give notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding, under a penalty of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.)
2. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing; and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.
3. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform shall attend parade or drill not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty or in any way unserviceable from neglect, or any member who shall be guilty of inattention, talking, or other unsteadiness at any parade or drill, may be fined by the officer commanding in a sum not exceeding one shilling (1s.) for each offence.
4. Any member intending to be absent from his usual address

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for a period of more than thirty (30) days must give notice of such intention, in writing, to the commanding officer, and deposit his arms, accoutrements, and clothing in the orderly room, under a penalty of ten shillings (10s.)

5. An account of all fines as incurred and received shall be kept in a book, which shall be open for inspection in the orderly room.

6. A list of all fines imposed in any month shall be signed by the officer commanding, and be posted in the orderly room or other place appointed on the first of the following month.

7. All fines must be paid to the sergeants of detachments within the month on the first of which they are posted.

8. An annual meeting of the corps shall be held in the month of January in each year, of which one (1) week's notice shall be given by circular.

9. At every annual meeting four (4) persons shall be chosen, who, with the officer commanding and four (4) senior officers and non-commissioned officers of the corps, shall form a committee (of whom three (3), including a commissioned officer, shall be a quorum) to audit and settle the accounts, and generally to take into consideration any matters connected with the corps that may be referred to them by the officer commanding.

10. The officer commanding may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve (12) members. No such special meeting shall be duly convened unless notice of it shall be given at a parade of the corps, and it shall have been called by a circular issued to every member four (4) days previous to the day of meeting.

11. At any meeting of the corps, the senior officer present shall take the chair.

12. An account shall be kept by the officer commanding between the corps and each of its members, wherein the member shall be debited with all liabilities incurred by the corps on his behalf, and credited with all sums earned by him as an effective.

13. If on the 1st January in any year a member's debit exceed his credit, he shall be fined the amount of the difference; but the officer commanding may, at his discretion, remit the whole or any part of such fine. The amount paid under this rule shall be placed in the book to the credit of the member paying it.

14. Any member permitted to resign under the provisions of the Act, within twelve (12) months of the date of his enrolment or receipt of new uniform, must pay the full cost of his uniform; if after the first twelve (12) months, one-half the full cost.

15. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding any of the foregoing rules, or of adding any new rule, must give fourteen (14) days' notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescission, or addition, to be posted in the orderly room.

PRINCE OF WALES LIGHT HORSE—METROPOLITAN TROOP.

THE following additions to the Rules of the above Troop have been approved by the Governor in Council:—

Addition to Rule 9.

"And any member of the troop intending to be absent from his present abode for a period of more than thirty days must give notice in writing of such intention to the commanding officer, and deposit his arms, accoutrements, uniform, and all other property in his possession belonging to the troop, in a place appointed by the officer commanding, under a penalty of One pound."

Addition to Rule 14.

"Members of the troop residing seven miles and upwards from Melbourne shall be exempt from the payment of any annual subscription."

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOWMAN'S FOREST FARMERS' COMMON.

THE basis of the right to depasture stock on the said common shall be the purchased acreage.

2. All owners or tenants of land, and residing upon it, or else cultivating one-third of the same, shall be entitled to depasture cattle or horses in the proportion of one head of cattle for every two and a half acres, or one horse for every five acres.

3. Any party may let his right to depasture stock on the said common to one, only however, who is previously entitled to commonage, and the party so renting such right shall be held liable for all fees and for all the conditions of these regulations.

4. A fee, at the rate of three shillings for cattle, and seven shillings for horses, per head per annum, shall be paid half-yearly, in advance, such payments to be made on the first day of April and the first day of October in each year, and if not paid within fourteen days of these dates, such defaulters shall be proceeded against for illegally depasturing. Stock put upon the common between the first day of January and the first day of April, and between the first day of July and the first day of October, shall be charged one quarter only till the commencement of the regular half-year.

5. No party shall put stock upon the common until the fees are paid and the cattle branded by the herdsman, who shall, on notice being given, attend at the stock-yards and brand such cattle.

6. No stock supposed to be suffering under any supposed infectious or contagious disease shall be allowed upon the common; and when notice is given by the managers that there is such, the owner shall remove them within twelve hours, or he shall be proceeded against.

7. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's salary and other expenses connected with the management of the common, an additional charge will be made upon each commoner in proportion to the number of stock depastured by him, and will be under the condition that he can be sued for the same.

8. No entire horse, and no bull, shall be allowed upon the common.

9. No party to be allowed to depasture more than sixty head of cattle or horses in proportion either on account of land occupied by himself or by rights of others transferred to him, except on payment of an additional fee of twenty-five per cent., when he may depasture up to eighty head.

10. The managers shall appoint one of their number to act as treasurer, who shall receive all moneys and pay the same into the bank, to the credit of the managers, within fourteen days of having received such moneys; all accounts shall be paid by cheque signed by at least two of the managers, and the residue, if any, to the order of the Beechworth Shire Council, at the close of each year.

11. The duties of the herdsman shall be to take charge of the stock paid for on the common; to brand the same, and keep the common clear of all unlicensed stock by impounding the same;

and further, that he shall collect the fees for stock upon the common, the receipt for such fees to be signed by one of the managers, and all such fees to be paid to the treasurer within two days. If guilty of neglect of duty or improper conduct, to be liable to be dismissed at one week's notice; but if proved to have knowingly allowed any unlicensed stock to depasture, he shall further forfeit one month's wages.

12. The managers shall cause the accounts to be audited by two auditors, and laid before the Beechworth Shire Council at the ordinary monthly meeting of the Council in October in each year.

The foregoing Rules and Regulations were adopted by the Beechworth Shire Council, on Friday, the sixth day of December, A.D. 1867.
