ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

THE Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 4th day of October, 1867, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the 30th and 31st years of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates of which are hereto subjoined, viz. :-

No. 302.—An Act to legalise and make valid certain Insolvencies and proceedings in Insolvency under *The Insolvency Statute 1865*. [Assented to 12th February, 1867.]

No. 303.—An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Ten thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and Five hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven. [Assented to 12th February, 1867.]

No. 304.—An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Twenty thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, and the sum of Five hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven. [Assented to 2nd May, 1867.]

No. 305.—An Act to enable the Shareholders of a Joint Stock Insurance Company established in the Colony of Victoria under the name or style of "The Australian Alliance Assurance Company" to sue and be sued in the name of the Chairman for the time being of the Directors of the Company, and for other purposes. [Assented to 4th July, 1867.]

RECTIFYING OMISSIONS IN A RATEPAYERS ROLL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fourth day of December, 1867.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened in the preparation or transmission or printing of any general roll or supplementary roll or ordinary electoral roll or roll of rate-paying electors, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission, or may declare any such roll valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Secretary to the Council of the Shire of Avoca did accidentally omit to include in the Lists of Ratepayers transmitted by him, in pursuance of the 63rd section of *The Electoral Act*, to the Electoral Registrar for the Avoca division of the District of Avoca, the names of certain persons duly qualified to be included therein: And whereas the Electoral Registrar of the said division did, also accidentally, omit to include in the Roll of Rate-paying Electors prepared by him in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, the names of certain other persons duly qualified to be included therein: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that, for the purpose of rectifying the omissions aforesaid, the names so omitted be inserted in the Roll of Rate-paying Electors for the Avoca division of the Electoral District of Avoca.

And the Honorable James McCulloch, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE ARARAT UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable SIR JOHN HENRY THOMAS MANNERS SUTTON, Knight, Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold-fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE ARARAT UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD-FIELD COMMON, described in three several Proclamations, bearing date respectively the 22nd day of February, 1864, the 11th day of December, 1865, and the 29th January, 1866, is hereby abolished, and in lieu thereof the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, shall be and constitute the United Borough and Gold-field Common of Ararat, viz.—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 4 of section 16 in the parish of BurrumbEEP; thence by the west boundaries of sections 16, 13, and 10, bearing north 340 chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of the last-named section; thence by a line bearing north-easterly 175 chains, more or less, to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 31, in the parish of Langi-Ghiran; thence by a line (crossing a road) bearing north 3 chains to the south-west angle of allotment 10 of section 25; thence by the west boundaries of sections 25 and 19, bearing north 160 chains, more or less, to the north angle of allotment 5 of section 19; thence by a line (crossing a road) bearing N. 30° 6' W. 1 chain 73 links to the south-east angle of allotment 18 of section 1, in the parish of Ararat; thence by the south boundaries of allotments 18 and 16, bearing west 46 chains 23 links; thence by the south-western boundaries of sections 1, 2, and 3, and by a line bearing N. 30° 6' W. 230 chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing west 334 chains, more or less, to a point on the east boundary of the Armstrong's Gold-field Common, distant ten chains, more or less, from the south-east angle thereof; thence to that angle by the said east boundary; thence by the south boundary of that common, bearing west 120 chains to the south-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing south 420 chains, more or less, to the road from Moyston to Ararat; thence by that road, bearing easterly 40 chains, more or less, to the summit of

a range; thence by that range, bearing southerly 50 chains, more or less, to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 1, in the parish of BurrumbEEP, the said point being the north-west angle of the Cathcart Farmers' Common; thence by the north boundary of that common, and a line bearing east 294 chains, more or less, to the eastern side of the road from Ararat to BurrumbEEP; thence by that road, bearing south-westerly to the road forming the west boundaries of sections 5 and 7, in the parish of BurrumbEEP; thence by that road, bearing south 155 chains, more or less, to the River Hopkins; and thence by a line bearing easterly 157 chains, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(67.O.14,248.)
